

### Choosing a location

Put your product on a flat, level, stable surface that is free of vibration and shocks, such as a desk. Put the product near a telephone socket and a standard grounded electrical socket. Choose a location where the temperature remains between 10°C and 32.5°C and the humidity is between 20% to 80% (without condensation).







#### **MARNING**

DO NOT expose the product to direct sunlight, excessive heat, open flames, corrosive gasses, moisture or dust.



### To use the product safely

#### **A WARNING**



There are high voltage electrodes inside the product. Before you clean the inside of the product, make sure you have unplugged the telephone line cord first (MFC only) and then the power cord from the electrical socket. Doing this will prevent an electrical shock.





DO NOT handle the plug with wet hands. Doing this might cause an electrical shock.



Always make sure the plug is fully inserted.



## **Loading paper**

## Loading paper and print media

The machine can feed paper from the standard paper tray or manual feed slot.

When you put paper into the paper tray, note the following:


If your application software supports paper size selection on the print menu, you can select it through the software. If your application software does not support it, you can set the paper size in the printer driver or by using the control panel buttons.

## Loading paper in the standard paper tray

You can load up to 250 sheets. Paper can be loaded up to the maximum paper mark ( $\P \P \P$ ) on the sliding paper width guide. (For recommended paper to use, see *Paper capacity of the paper trays* on page 17.)


## Printing on plain paper, thin paper or recycled paper from the standard paper tray

Pull the paper tray completely out of the machine.




While pressing the green paper-guide release lever (1), slide the paper guides to fit the paper size you are loading in the tray. Make sure that the guides are firmly in the slots.



3 Fan the stack of paper well to avoid paper jams and misfeeds.




- 4 Put paper in the tray and make sure:
  - The paper is below the maximum paper mark (▼ ▼ ▼) (1).
    Overfilling the paper tray will cause paper jams.
  - The side to be printed on must be face down.
  - The paper guides touch the sides of the paper so it will feed correctly.



Dut the paper tray firmly back in the machine. Make sure that it is completely inserted into the machine.

6 Unfold the support flap (1) to prevent paper from sliding off the face-down output tray.



## Loading paper in the manual feed slot


You can load envelopes and special print media one at a time into this slot. Use the manual feed slot to print or copy on labels, envelopes or thicker paper.





## Printing on plain paper or recycled paper from the manual feed slot


1 Unfold the support flap (1) to prevent paper from sliding off the face-down output tray, or remove each page as soon as it comes out of the machine.






## Printing on thick paper, bond paper, labels, and envelopes

When the back output tray is pulled down, the machine has a straight paper path from the manual feed slot through to the back of the machine. Use this paper feed and output method when you want to print on thick paper, labels or envelopes.




Remove each printed sheet or envelope immediately to prevent a paper jam.









- Put the paper into the manual feed slot with the side to be printed face up.
- Make sure that the print media is straight and in the correct position on the manual feed slot. If it is not, the paper may not be fed correctly, resulting in a skewed printout or a paper jam.
- Do not put more than one sheet of paper in the manual feed slot at any one time, as it may cause a jam.

- If you put any print media in the manual feed slot before the machine is in Ready mode, the print media may be ejected without being printed on.
- To easily remove a small printout from the output tray, lift up the scanner cover by using both hands as shown in the illustration.




 You can still use the machine while the scanner cover is up. To close the scanner cover, push it down with both hands.

# Acceptable paper and other print media

Print quality may vary according to the type of paper you are using.

You can use the following types of print media: thin paper, plain paper, thick paper, bond paper, recycled paper, labels or envelopes.

For best results, follow the instructions below:

- DO NOT put different types of paper in the paper tray at the same time because it may cause paper jams or misfeeds.
- For correct printing, you must choose the same paper size from your software application as the paper in the tray.
- Avoid touching the printed surface of the paper immediately after printing.
- Before you buy a lot of paper, test a small quantity to make sure the paper is suitable.

- Use paper made for plain paper copying.
- Use paper that is 75 to 90 g/m<sup>2</sup>.
- Use long grain paper with a neutral Ph value, and a moisture content of approx. 5%.
- This machine can use recycled paper that meets DIN 19309 specifications.

## Handling and using special paper

The machine is designed to work well with most types of xerographic and bond paper. However, some paper variables may have an effect on print quality or handling reliability. Always test samples of paper before purchasing to ensure desirable performance. Store paper in its original packaging and keep it sealed. Keep the paper flat and away from moisture, direct sunlight and heat.

Some important guidelines when selecting paper are:

- DO NOT use inkjet paper because it may cause a paper jam or damage your machine.
- Preprinted paper must use ink that can withstand the temperature of the machine's fusing process 392 degrees Fahrenheit (200 degrees centigrade).

If you use bond paper, paper that has a rough surface or paper that is wrinkled or creased, the paper may exhibit degraded performance.

#### Types of paper to avoid


## IMPORTANT

Some types of paper may not perform well or may cause damage to your machine.

DO NOT use paper:

- that is highly textured
- that is extremely smooth or shiny

that is curled or warped



- 1 A curl of 2 mm or greater may cause jams to occur.
- · that is coated or has a chemical finish
- · that is damaged, creased or folded
- that exceeds the recommended weight specification in this guide
- · with tabs and staples
- with letterheads using low temperature dyes or thermography
- · that is multipart or carbonless
- that is designed for inkjet printing

If you use any of the types of paper listed, they may damage your machine. This damage is not covered under any Brother warranty or service agreement.

#### **Envelopes**

Most envelopes designed for laser printers will be suitable for your machine. However, some envelopes may have feed and print-quality problems because of the way they have been made. A suitable envelope should have edges with straight, well-creased folds and the leading edge should not be thicker than two sheets of paper. The envelope should lie flat and not be of baggy or flimsy construction. You should buy quality envelopes from a supplier who understands that you will be using the envelopes in a laser machine.


Envelopes can be fed from manual feed slot one at a time. We recommend that you print a test envelope to make sure the print results are what you want before you print or purchase a large quantity of envelopes.

#### Types of envelopes to avoid



DO NOT use envelopes:


- that are damaged, curled, wrinkled or an unusual shape
- · that are extremely shiny or textured
- with clasps, staples, snaps or tie strings
- · with self-adhesive closures
- · that are of a baggy construction
- · that are not sharply creased
- that are embossed (have raised writing on them)
- that were previously printed by a laser machine
- · that are pre-printed on the inside
- that cannot be arranged neatly when stacked
- that are made of paper that weighs more than the paper weight specifications for the machine
- with edges that are not straight or consistently square
- with windows, holes, cut-outs or perforations
- with glue on surface as shown in figure below





- with sealing flaps that are not folded down when purchased
- with sealing flaps as shown in figure below

If you use any of the types of envelopes listed above, they may damage your machine. This damage may not be covered under any Brother warranty or service agreement.

#### Labels

The machine will print on most types of labels designed for use with a laser machine. Labels should have an adhesive that is acrylic-based since this material is more stable at the high temperatures in the fuser unit. Adhesives should not come in contact with any part of the machine, because the label stock may stick to the drum unit or rollers and cause jams and print quality problems. No adhesive should be exposed between the labels. Labels should be arranged so that they cover the entire length and width of the sheet. Using labels with spaces may result in labels peeling off and causing serious jams or print problems.

All labels used in this machine must be able to withstand a temperature of 392 degrees Fahrenheit (200 degrees centigrade) for a period of 0.1 seconds.

Do not feed a label sheet through the machine more than one time.

#### Types of labels to avoid

Do not use labels that are damaged, curled, wrinkled or an unusual shape.









## IMPORTANT

- DO NOT feed part used label sheets. The exposed carrier sheet will damage your machine.
- Label sheets should not exceed the paper weight specifications described in this User's Guide. Labels exceeding this specification may not feed or print correctly and may cause damage to your machine.
- DO NOT insert labels that have previously been used, or have any labels missing from the sheet.

# How to load documents



- DO NOT use paper that is curled, wrinkled, folded, ripped, stapled, paperclipped, pasted or taped.
- DO NOT use cardboard, newspaper or fabric.
- To avoid damaging your machine while using the ADF, DO NOT pull on the document while it is feeding.







When a toner cartridge is running low, the LCD shows Toner Low.

(For DCP-7065DN and DCP-7070DW)

The toner cartridge that comes supplied with the machine is a Standard toner cartridge.

(For DCP-7055, DCP-7057 and DCP-7060D)

The toner cartridge that comes supplied with the machine is a Starter toner cartridge that will need to be replaced after approximately 700 pages <sup>1</sup>.

Approx. cartridge yield is declared in accordance with ISO/IEC 19752.

### **Troubleshooting**

#### **Error and maintenance messages**

# **General Setup**

### **Memory Storage**

Your menu settings are stored permanently, and in the event of a power failure will *not* be lost. Temporary settings (for example, Contrast) *will* be lost.

### **Ecology features**

#### **Toner Save**

You can save toner using this feature. When you set Toner Save to On, prints appear lighter. The default setting is Off.

- 1 Press Menu.
- Press A or ▼ to choose 1.General Setup and press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose 2. Ecology and press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose 1. Toner Save and press OK.
- Press A or ▼ to choose on or off and press OK.
- 6 Press Stop/Exit.



We do not recommend Toner Save for printing Photo or Greyscale images.

### Sleep Mode

The Sleep Mode Setting can reduce power consumption. When the machine is in Sleep Mode (Power Save mode) it acts as if it is turned off. Receiving data or starting an operation wakes up the machine from Sleep mode to Ready mode.

You can choose how long the machine must be idle before it goes into sleep mode. When the machine receives computer data or makes a copy, the timer will be reset. The default setting is 3 minutes.

While the machine is in sleep mode the LCD will show Sleep.

- 1 Press Menu.
- Press A or ▼ to choose 1.General Setup and press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose 2. Ecology and press OK.
- Press A or ▼ to choose 2.Sleep Time and press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select the length of time the machine is idle before entering sleep mode.
  Press OK
- 6 Press Stop/Exit.

### **Deep Sleep mode**

If the machine is in Sleep mode and does not receive any jobs for a certain length of time, the machine will automatically enter Deep Sleep mode, and the LCD will show Deep Sleep. Deep Sleep mode uses less power than Sleep mode. The machine will wake up and start warming up when the machine receives computer data or when you press a key on the control panel.

#### (For DCP-7070DW)

If a wireless network is enabled, the machine does not enter Deep Sleep mode. To disable the wireless network, see *Chapter 3* in the *Network User's Guide*.

### **Toner Settings**

### **Toner Setting (Continue Mode)**

## Cleaning the machine

Clean the outside and inside of the machine regularly with a dry, lint-free soft cloth. When you replace the toner cartridge or the drum unit, make sure that you clean the inside of the machine. For details about cleaning the machine, see the *Basic User's Guide*.

### **MARNING**

DO NOT use cleaning materials that contain ammonia, alcohol, any type of spray, or any type of flammable substance to clean the outside or inside of the machine. Doing this may cause a fire or electrical shock.

Be careful not to inhale toner.


The life check will be accurate only if you have reset the part counter when you installed a new part. It will not be accurate if that part's life counter was reset during the life of the used part.

## Packing and shipping the machine




- If for any reason you must ship your machine, carefully repack the machine in the original packaging to avoid any damage during transit. The machine should be adequately insured with the carrier.
- If you are returning your machine to Brother as part of the Exchange Service, pack only the machine. Keep all separate parts, including the drum unit, the toner cartridges, and printed materials to use with your 'replacement' machine.
- 1 Turn off the machine's power switch.
  Disconnect all the cables, and then
  unplug the power cord from the AC
  power outlet. Leave the machine turned
  off for at least 10 minutes to cool down.
- 2 Open the front cover.
- Remove the drum unit and toner cartridge assembly. Leave the toner cartridge installed in the drum unit.

4 Put the protective material (1) in the machine with the "REMOVE" text to the left, as shown in the illustration.




- 5 Put the drum unit and toner cartridge assembly back into the machine.
- 6 Put the elastic band over the handle of the drum unit, as shown in the illustration.



- 7 Close the front cover.
- 8 Put the machine into the bag it originally came in.

9 Pack the AC cord and printed materials in the original carton as shown below:



Olose the carton and tape it shut.

## ADF (automatic document feeder (For DCP-7065DN))

The document can be placed in the ADF and scanned one page at a time automatically.

#### Cancel Job

Cancels a programmed print job and clears the machine's memory.

#### Contrast

Setting to compensate for dark or light documents, by making copies of dark documents lighter and light documents darker.

#### Greyscale

The shades of grey available for copying photographs.

#### LCD (liquid crystal display)

The display screen on the machine that shows interactive messages during On-Screen Programming and shows the date and time when the machine is idle.

#### Menu mode

Programming mode for changing your machine's settings.

#### OCR (optical character recognition)

ScanSoft™ PaperPort™ 12SE with OCR or Presto! PageManager software application converts an image of text to text you can edit.

#### Resolution

The number of vertical and horizontal lines per inch.

#### Scanning

The process of sending an electronic image of a paper document into your computer.

#### **Temporary settings**

You can choose certain options for each copy without changing the default settings.

### **User Settings Report**

A printed report that shows the current settings of the machine.
