# **Section 1: Getting Started**

This section helps you to quickly start using your device.

# **Understanding This User Manual**

The sections of this manual generally follow the features of your device. A robust index for features begins on page 132.

Also included is important safety information, beginning on page 108, that you should know before using your device.

This manual gives navigation instructions according to the default display settings. If you select other settings, navigation steps may be different.

Unless otherwise specified, all instructions in this manual assume that you are starting from a Home screen. To get to a Home screen, you may need to unlock the device. For more information, refer to "Securing Your Device" on page 8.

Note: Instructions in this manual are based on default settings and may vary from your device depending on the software version on your device and any changes to the device's settings.

Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this user manual start with the device unlocked, at the Home screen.

All screen images in this manual are simulated. Actual displays may vary depending on the software version of your device and any changes to the device's settings.

#### Special Text

In this manual, some text is set apart from the rest. This special text is intended to point out important information, share quick methods for activating features, define terms, and more. The definitions for these methods are as follows:

- Notes: Presents alternative options for the current feature, menu, or sub-menu.
- Tips: Provides guick or innovative methods or useful shortcuts.
- Important: Points out important information about the current feature that could affect performance.
- Warning: Brings important information to your attention that can help to prevent loss of data or functionality or damage to your device.

#### **Text Conventions**

This manual provides condensed information about how to use your device. To make this possible, the following text conventions are used to represent often-used steps:

Arrows are used to represent the sequence of selecting successive options in longer, or repetitive, procedures. For example:

From a Home screen, press the Menu Key 
→ Settings
→ Wireless and network → Wi-Fi settings.

#### **Battery**

Your device is powered by a rechargeable, standard Li-lon battery.

Note: The battery comes partially charged. You must fully charge the battery before using your device for the first time.

After the first charge, you can use the device while charging.

Warning!: Use only approved charging devices. Approved accessories are designed to maximize battery life. Using other accessories may invalidate your warranty and may cause damage.

# **Battery Indicator**

The Battery icon in the Status Bar shows the battery power level. When battery power is 15% or less, your device prompts you to charge the battery. If you continue to operate the device without charging, the device powers off.

## **Charging the Battery**

Use a Samsung-approved Travel Charger to charge your device from any standard AC power outlet.

 Locate the Charger/Accessory Port on the bottom of the device.



Charger/Accessory Port

- Plug the flat end of the Travel Charger into the Charger/ Accessory Interface connector on the device (1) and the other end into a standard AC wall outlet.
- When charging is finished, remove the flat end from the Charger/Accessory Interface connector on the device.

## **Turning Your Device On and Off**

#### **Turning Your Device On**

Press and hold the Power/Lock Key \_\_\_\_\_.



Note: Your device's internal antenna is located along the top back of the device. Do not block the antenna; doing so may affect signal quality and may cause the device to operate at a higher power level than is necessary.

#### **Turning Your Device Off**

- 1. Press and hold the Power/Lock Key ......
- 2. At the prompt, touch Power off.

# **Your Google Account**

Your new device uses your Google account to fully utilize its Android features, including Gmail, Maps, Navigation, Google Talk and the Android Market. When you turn on your device for the first time, set up a connection with your existing Google account or create a new Google account.

To create a Google account or set up your Google account on your device use **Accounts and sync** settings. For more information, refer to "Accounts and Sync" on page 100.

# **Using Google Maps**

In order to use some applications related to Google Maps, you must first connect Wi-Fi. For more information, refer to "Wi-Fi Settings" on page 90.

You must also enable location services to use Google Maps. Some features require Standalone or Google location services. For more information, refer to "Location and Security" on page 96.

#### **Task Manager**

Your device can run applications simultaneously and some applications run in the background.

Use Task Manager to see which applications are running on your device and to end running applications to extend battery life. You can also uninstall applications from your device and see how much memory is used by applications.

Task Manager provides information about applications, including **Active applications**, **Downloaded**, **RAM**, and **Storage**.

To access the Task Manager:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch **Applications**
- Touch the Active applications tab to view applications running on your device. Touch Exit to end an application or Exit all to stop all running applications.
- Touch the Downloaded tab to view applications installed from Android Market. Touch Uninstall to remove an application from your device.
- Touch the RAM tab to display the amount of Random Access Memory (RAM) currently in use. Touch Clear memory to clear inactive and background processes.

Touch the Storage tab to view internal and external storage memory statistics.

Tip: To launch Task Manager from any screen, touch and hold the Home Key , then touch Task Manager.

You can also access Task Manager from the **Program Monitor** widget. For more information, refer to "Widgets" on page 19.

# **Memory Card**

Your device supports removable microSD™ or microSDHC™ memory cards, for storage of music, photos, videos, and other files.

**Note:** You can only store music files that you own (from a CD or purchased with the device) on a memory card.

### **Installing a Memory Card**

- Open the Memory Card Slot cover and turn to expose the slot.
- With the gold contacts facing down, carefully slide the memory card into the slot, pushing gently until it clicks into place.
- 3. Replace the Memory Card Slot cover.



### Removing a Memory Card

**Important!:** To prevent damage to information stored on the memory card, unmount the card before removing it from the device.

- Open the Memory Card Slot cover and turn to expose the slot
- Gently press down on the memory card, so that it pops out from the slot, and carefully pull the card out.

4. Replace the Memory Slot cover.

## **Galaxy Player 5.0 Accessories**

The items supplied with your device may vary depending on the software and accessories available in your region or offered by your service provider.

- You can obtain additional accessories from your local Samsung dealer.
- The supplied accessories perform best for your device.
- Accessories other than the supplied ones may not be compatible with your device.

## **Securing Your Device**

By default, the device locks automatically when the screen times out or you can lock it manually. You can unlock the device using one of the default Unlock screens or, for increased security, use a personal screen unlock pattern.

For more information about creating and enabling a Screen unlock pattern, see "Set Screen Lock" on page 97.

For other settings related to securing your device, see "Location and Security" on page 96.

Note: Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this User Manual start with the device unlocked, at the Home screen.

#### Locking the device manually

### Unlocking the device

1. Press the Power/Lock
Key ...

The locked screen displays **Sweep glass to unlock**. The day, date, and time also display.

Touch and sweep across the screen, either to the left or right, as indicated on the screen.



Note: You can choose the type of Screen Unlock you want to use, either Pattern or Password. For more information, refer to "Location and Security" on page 96.

## **Troubleshooting**

If your device has fatal errors, hangs up, or freezes, you may need to close all programs or reset the device to regain functionality.

- If your device is still responsive, but a program is frozen, close the program using the Task Manager. For more information, refer to "Task Manager" on page 7.
- If your device is frozen and unresponsive, press and hold the Power/Lock Key for 8 to 10 seconds.

#### **Android System Recovery**

Android System Recovery is used for Google updates. The average user should never need to perform a system recovery.

Note: If you entered this menu by mistake, use the Volume Up/Down key to select **reboot system now**, then press the **Home Key**. Your device then continues to boot up.

To enter the Android System Recovery mode, follow these steps:

- With the device turned off, press the Power/Lock Key

   and Volume Up Key
   at the same time until the device switches on.
- 2. Once the SAMSUNG logo appears, release the Power/Lock key while continuing to press the Volume Up key.
- Continue to press the Volume Up key for at least 8 seconds, until Recovery mode is launched and the Android System Recovery screen is displayed.

- Release the Volume Up key.
- **5.** The following options are available:
  - · reboot system now: turns on your device.
  - apply sdcard:update.zip: allows you to apply updates to your device.
  - wipe data/factory reset: deletes all data from the device except captured pictures and videos. For more information, refer to "Factory Data Reset" on page 102.
  - wipe cache partition: allows you to delete all cache data such as log files.
  - format internal sd-card: allows you to reformat the internal microSD card.
- Use the Volume Up/Down key to scroll up or down, then use the Home Key
   to make a selection.

# **Section 2: Understanding Your Device**

This section outlines key features of your device and describes the screen and the icons that appear when the device is in use. It also shows how to navigate through the device.

#### **Features**

Your device is lightweight, easy-to-use, and offers many useful features. The following list outlines a few of the features included in your device.

- Touch screen provides quick response to a variety of menus and options including applications and seven home screens
- Android OS, Android Market, plus pre-loaded applications
- Ready access to the Internet
- Built-in Bluetooth<sup>®</sup> 3.0 Wireless technology. For more information, refer to "Bluetooth Settings" on page 92.
- Built-in Wi-Fi technology (802.11 b/g/n)
- 5-inch 800x480 WVGA Super Clear LCD touch screen
- 3.2 Megapixel camera with flash and camcorder

- Messaging Features:
  - Gmail
  - Email (corporate and personal)
- Support for microSD<sup>TM</sup> and microSDHC<sup>TM</sup> Memory Cards, which are used for data storage and access
- Photo Gallery that supports JPEG, PNG, GIF, and BMP formats
- HD Video Player (720p) that supports H.263, H.264, MPEG4, 3GP, WMV (v9), Xvid, and DivX<sup>®</sup> formats
- DivX Certified<sup>®</sup> to play DivX<sup>®</sup> video up to 640x480, including premium content
- Music Player that supports WAV, MP3, AAC, AAC+, eAAC+, WMA (v9), and Ogg formats
- FM Radio that lets you listen to your local FM radio stations
- SoundAlive and stereo speakers

#### Front and Top Views

The following items can be found on the front and top of your device as illustrated.

- Strap Hole: Allows you to attach an optional strap.
- External Speaker: Allows you to hear the caller.
- Memory Card Slot: Open Memory Card Slot cover and turn to expose the slot to install a memory card for storage of files. For more information, refer to "Installing a Memory Card" on page 7.
- 4. Front-facing Camera Lens: Used when taking photos.
- 5. Menu Key: Press to display options for the current screen.
- Home Key: Press to display the Home screen. Press and hold to display recent applications or to launch Task Manager.
- 7. Back Key: Press to return to the previous screen or option.



#### Side View


The following items can be found on the side of your device.

- Power/Lock Key: Press and hold to turn the device on or off. Press to lock the device or to wake the screen for unlocking.
- Volume Key: From a Home screen, press to adjust Master Volume.
   During music playback, press to adjust volume.



The following items can be found on the back and bottom of your device.

 External Speakers: Used for music or video playback, notification tones, and for other sounds.



- Camera Lens: Used to take photos or record videos.
- Camera Flash: Used when taking photos.
- 4. 3.5mm Headset Jack: Plug in for headphones, which also serve as an antenna. For more information, refer to "FM Radio" on page 57.
- Microphone: Allows callers to hear you when you are speaking to them. Also used for voice recording.
- 6. Charger/Accessory Port:

Allows you to connect a Travel Charger or other optional accessories such as a USB/data cable to sync music and files.



#### **Home Screen**

The Home screen is the starting point for using your device.

Note: Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this User Manual start with the device unlocked, at the Home screen.

- Status Bar: Presents icons to show notifications, battery power, and connection details. For a list of icons, see "Status Bar" on page 18.
- Widgets: Applications that run on the Home screen. These widgets are found on the Home screen by default. For more information, refer to "Widgets" on page 19.
- Shortcuts: Shortcuts to common applications. These shortcuts are found on the Home screen by default. For more information, refer to "Shortcuts" on page 21.
- 4. Home screen: The starting point for using your device. Place shortcuts, widgets, and other items to customize your device to your needs.
- Primary Shortcuts: Shortcuts to common features. For more information, refer to "Primary Shortcuts" on page 19.



Warning!: If your device has a touch screen display, note that a touch screen responds best to a light touch from the pad of your finger. Using excessive force or a metallic object when pressing on the touch screen may damage the tempered glass surface and void the warranty. For more information, refer to "Warranty Information" on page 123.

#### **Extended Home Screen**

The Home screen consists of the Home panel, plus six panels that extend beyond the display width to provide more space for adding shortcuts, widgets, and folders.

Slide your finger horizontally across the screen to scroll to the left or right side panels. As you scroll, the indicator at the top of the display shows your current position.

## **Customizing the Home Screen**

To customize the Home screen to suit your preferences just navigate to the desired Home screen, then touch and hold on the screen to display the **Add to Home screen** menu. Then touch one of the options:

- Widgets: For more information, refer to "Widgets" on page 19.
- Shortcuts: For more information, refer to "Shortcuts" on page 21.
- Folders: For more information, refer to "Folders" on page 21.
- Wallpapers: For more information, refer to "Wallpapers" on page 22.

## **Display settings**

You can customize display settings to your preferences. For more information, refer to "Display Settings" on page 95.

#### Adding and removing Home screen panels

Your device comes with seven Home screen panels. You can customize the Home screen by removing or adding panels.

Note: The panel in the first position displays when you press the Home Key

- 1. From a Home screen, press the Menu Key 
  → Edit.
- 2. Use these controls to configure panels:



**Remove**: Touch and drag a panel to the Trash Can to remove the panel from the Home screen.



Add: Touch to add a new panel, up to a total of seven. This option is available when less than seven panels have been added.

To rearrange the order of panels, touch and drag a panel to a new location.

Tip: You can also display Edit options by pinching the Home screen.

#### **Navigating Your Device**

Use command keys and the touch screen to navigate.

#### **Command Keys**

#### Menu Key

Press the **Menu Key** to display options for the current screen or feature.

#### **Home Key**

Press the **Home Key t** to display the first Home screen.

Press and hold the **Home Key** to launch a menu of recent applications or to launch Task Manager.



#### **Back Key**

Press the **Back Key** to return to the previous screen, option, or step.

### **Google Search**

Touch the **Google Search** widget to search the web and your device. The Google Search widget is found on the Home panel by default. For more information, refer to "Google Search" on page 53.

#### **Context-sensitive Menus**

Context-sensitive menus offer options for features or screens. To access context-sensitive menus:

- Press the Menu Key 🔳 .
- · Press and hold on an item.

## **Finger Gestures**

#### **Touch**

Touch items to select or launch them. For example:

- . Touch the on-screen keyboard to enter characters or text.
- . Touch a menu item to select it.
- Touch an application's icon to launch the application.

#### **Touch and Hold**

Activate on-screen items. For example:

- Touch and hold a widget on the home screen to move it.
- Touch and hold on a field to display a pop-up menu of options.

#### Swipe, Flick, or Slide

Swipe, flick, or slide your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen. For example:

- · Unlocking the screen
- Scrolling the Home screens or a menu.

#### **Pinch**

Use two fingers, such as your index finger and thumb, to make an inward pinch motion on the screen, as if you are picking something up, or an outward motion by sweeping your fingers out. For example:



- Pinch the Home screen to show customization options.
- Pinch a photo in Gallery to zoom in.

#### **Notification Panel**

The Notification Panel shows information about connections, messages, and other items.

To display the Notification Panel:

Sweep your finger downward from the top of the screen.

From the Notification Panel, the following options are available:

- 1. Touch an icon to activate the feature.
- 2. Tap to clear all notifications.
- Tap a notification to open the application.
- 4. Touch and hold, then slide your finger up to close the Notification Panel or touch the **Back Key**.



#### Icons

Icons at the top of the Notification Panel show status for:

- Wi-Fi: Touch to enable or disable Wi-Fi. For more information, refer to "Wi-Fi" on page 68.
- Bluetooth: Touch to enable or disable Bluetooth. For more information, refer to "Bluetooth" on page 69.
- GPS: Touch to enable Standalone GPS services. For more information, refer to "Use GPS Satellites" on page 97.
- Silent: Touch to toggle Silent mode On or Off.

 Auto rotation: Touch to enable or disable auto rotation. When enabled, the screen orientation changes when you rotate the device. When disabled, the screen locks in the current orientation (horizontal or vertical) and the orientation does not change when you rotate the device.

#### **Clearing Notifications**

- Sweep your finger downward from the top of the screen to display the Notifications Panel.
- 2. Touch a notification to clear it.
  - or -

Touch Clear to clear all notifications.

## **Status Bar**

The Status Bar displays icons to show connection status, battery power, and other details.

**USB Connected**: Device is connected to a computer using a USB cable.

**Download in Progress**: An application is being downloaded to the device.



**Download Successful**: A recent software download was successfully downloaded.



Flight Mode: Indicates that the Flight Mode is active, which allows you to use many of your device's features, but it cannot access online information or applications.



New Email Message: You have new email.



New Gmail Message: You have new Gmail.



Refresh: An account is being refreshed.



**Alarm Set**: An alarm is active. For more information, refer to "Alarm/Clock" on page 74.



**Silent Mode**: All sounds except media and alarms are silenced and vibrate mode is active. See "Silent Mode" on page 94.



Preparing SD Card: A memory card is installed.

- Microsoft Exchange: Add your Exchange account to sync Contacts, Calendar and Email.

- Qik Video: Sign up or log in to your Qik Video account.

#### **Linked Contacts**

Your device can synchronize with multiple accounts, including Google, Corporate Exchange, and other email providers, plus social networking sites like Facebook, Twitter, and MySpace. When you synchronize contacts from these accounts with your device, you may have multiple contacts for one person.

Linking, or joining, imported contact records allows you to see all the contact's numbers and addresses together in one Contact entry. Linking also helps you keep your contacts updated, because any changes that your contacts make to their information in the respective accounts is automatically updated the next time you synchronize with the account.

# **Section 4: Entering Text**

This section describes how to enter words, letters, punctuation and numbers when you need to enter text.

# **Virtual QWERTY Keyboard**

Your device uses a virtual QWERTY keyboard for text entry. Use the keyboard to enter letters, punctuation, numbers, and other characters into text entry fields or applications. Access the keyboard by touching any text entry field.

The virtual QWERTY keyboard displays at the bottom of the screen. By default, when you rotate the device, the screen orientation updates to display the keyboard at the bottom of the screen.

# **Using the Samsung Keypad**

The Samsung Keypad is a custom virtual QWERTY keyboard, featuring predictive text. Input characters by tapping the on-screen keys with your finger or use speech recognition.

As you enter characters, predictive text matches your key touches to common words and displays them. Select a word from the display to insert it into your text.



# **Configuring the Keypad**

To configure the Samsung Keypad to your preferences:

▶ While entering text, touch **Settings** .

The Samsung keypad settings screen is displayed. For more information, refer to "Samsung Keypad" on page 103.

# **Entering Upper and Lower Case Letters**

The default case is lower case (abc). Enter upper and lower case alphabet letters by touching the Shift key to toggle the case, before touching the letter key(s).

- Touch once to switch from abc to Abc mode
- Touch and hold to switch to ABC mode

# **Entering Symbols and Numbers**

To enter a number, touch 2123, then touch the corresponding key.

To enter common symbols, touch rouse to switch to Symbols mode, then touch the corresponding key.

There are three pages of symbols. Touch 1/3 to switch to the next page.

# **Using XT9 Predictive Text**

XT9 is a predictive text system that has next-letter prediction and regional error correction, which compensates for users pressing the wrong keys on QWERTY keyboards.

- Rotate your device counterclockwise to a Landscape orientation.
- Touch Settings at the bottom of the keypad.
   The Samsung keypad settings screen displays.

- Touch the XT9 field so a green checkmark appears next to the field.
- Touch the XT9 advanced settings field to modify XT9 associated settings. For more information, refer to "Samsung Keypad" on page 103.

Note: The XT9 option is available only when Abc mode has been selected.

Begin typing a word. A list of word options displays. Touch
one of the words to replace the word that has already been
typed or touch for more word choices.



Continue typing your message. XT9 mode can also be used in the portrait orientation.

## **Editing Text**

After entering text, touch and hold the text field to display the following options:

- Select all: Select all text in the field.
- Select text / Stop selecting text: Touch and hold a position in the text, then touch Select text. Lightly sweep left or right over the text you want to select. Touch Stop selecting text when you are ready to stop selecting text.
- Cut / Cut all: Copy and remove the selected text.
- Copy / Copy all: Copy the selected text.
- Paste: Touch and hold a position in the text to paste the copied text, then touch Paste.
- Input method: Set the input method to Samsung keypad.

## **Using Speech Recognition**

You can use your voice to enter text using the Voice input feature, which lets you enter text by speaking. Samsung Keypad recognizes your speech and enters text for you.

Note: Enable Voice Input in Samsung keypad settings. For more information, refer to "Samsung Keypad" on page 103.

- **1.** Touch **Speech Recognition** on the Samsung Keypad.
- At the Speak now prompt, speak clearly and distinctly into the microphone.
- Working... is displayed while the software is converting your voice to text.

The text is displayed in the message.

 Touch Speech Recognition again to speak and add more test.

Note: The feature works best when you break your message down into smaller segments.

# **Section 5: Messaging**

This section describes how to send and receive messages and other features associated with messaging.

# **Types of Messages**

Your device supports these types of messages:

- . Gmail: Send and receive Gmail from your Google account.
- Email: Send and receive email from your email accounts, including Corporate Exchange mail.
- Google Talk: Chat with other Google Talk users.

Note: Your Wi-Fi-only device does NOT support voice calling and messaging services. Please disregard any "dial" and "message" related menus because some Gmail options are identically set in all Android devices.

## **Gmail**

Send and receive emails with Gmail, Google's web-based email.

Tip: To set up your Google account on your device, use Accounts and sync settings. For more information, refer to "Accounts and Sync" on page 100.

- From a Home screen, touch **Gmail** 
  - or —

From a Home screen, touch **Applications** 



→ Gmail M.

# **Setting Up Your Gmail Account**

The first time you launch Gmail, your device prompts you to set up your Google account.

Note: You can use more than one Google account on your device. To add another account, use the Menu Kev Accounts option.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch **Gmail**
- At the Adding an Account screen, touch Next to begin, then touch an option:
  - Create: Follow the prompts to create a new account.
  - **Sign in**: Enter your Google Username and Password, then touch Sign In.
- The device communicates with the Google server to set up your account and synchronize your email. When complete. your Gmail appears in the Inbox.

### Refreshing Your Gmail Account

Refresh your account to update your device from the Gmail servers.

- Press the Menu Key → Refresh.

## **Managing Your Gmail Account**

Use menu options to manage your Gmail.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch **Gmail** 🥍 .
- 2. Press the Menu Key for these options:
  - Refresh: Update your device from the Gmail servers.
  - Compose: Create and send new Gmail.
  - Accounts: Choose a Gmail account or add a Google account.
  - Go to labels: View Gmail by label.
  - Search: Enter keywords to search mail.
  - More:
    - Settings: Configure settings, For more information, refer to "Gmail account settings" on page 41.
    - Help: Learn about using Gmail.
    - About: View information about Gmail.

### **Composing and Sending Gmail**

- 1. From a Home screen, touch Gmail
- Press the Menu Key → Compose.
- Touch the To field to enter recipients. As you enter names or email addresses, matching contacts display. Touch a contact to add it to the field.
- 4. Touch the Subject field to enter a subject.
- Touch Compose Mail to enter the text of your email.
- 6. While composing a message, press the Menu Key for these options:
  - Send: Send the message.
  - Save draft: Save the message as a draft for sending later.
  - Add Cc/Bcc: Create Cc (copy) and Bcc (blind copy) fields in the message. After creating the fields, touch to enter recipients.
  - Attach: Launch Gallery to select a photo to add to the message.
  - Discard: Close the message without saving.
  - Help: Learn about using Gmail.
- 7. Touch to send the message or to save the message as a draft.

## **Gmail account settings**

- I. From a Home screen, touch **Gmail** 📉
- Press the Menu Key → More → Settings for settings:
  - General settings:
    - Signature: Create a text signature to add to outgoing messages.
    - Confirm actions: Have your device prompt you to confirm Archive, Delete, and Send actions.

    - Auto-advance: Choose a screen to show after you delete or archive a conversation.
    - Message text size: Set the size of text in message displays.
    - Batch operations: Allow changes to labels on more than one conversation.
    - Clear search history: Remove previous searches you performed.
    - Labels: Choose which labels are synchronized.
  - Notification settings:
    - Email notifications: When enabled, notifications for new email appear in the Status Bar.
    - **Select ringtone**: Choose a ringtone for new email notifications.
    - Vibrate: Choose vibration settings for email notifications.
    - Notify once: When enabled, a notification appears in the Status Bar for new email, not for every new message.

#### **Email**

Use Email to view and manage all your email accounts in one application.

## **Setting Up Email Accounts**

- 1. From a Home screen, touch **Applications** 
  - → Email
- At the Set up email screen, enter an Email address and Password and touch Next.
- Enter an account name for the email account just added, which is displayed on the inbox for the email account.
- Enter your name, which is displayed on outgoing messages.
- 5. Touch Done.
  - The device communicates with the appropriate server to set up your account and synchronize your email. When complete, your email appears in the Inbox for the account.
- Enter account credentials, then complete set-up by following the prompts to configure account options.
   Available options vary, depending on the provider.

If the account includes synchronization of contacts and calendars, you can choose whether to synchronize these features with your device.

# **Adding Additional Email Accounts**

To add additional email accounts:

- Press the Menu Key 
  → Accounts.

  The list of accounts displays.
- 2. Touch the Menu Key 

  → Add account.
- 3. Enter the Email address, Password, and so on.

## **Configuring Email Account Settings**

To configure email account settings at any time:

   For more information, refer to "Account Settings" on page 43.

### **Composing and Sending Email**

- Touch an account, if you have more than one account set up.
- Press the Menu Key 
  → Compose.
- Touch the To field to enter recipients. As you enter names or email addresses, matching contacts display. Touch a contact to add it to the field.
  - or –

Touch **Recent**, **Contacts**, or **Group** and select contacts. Touch **Done** when all contacts have been selected.

- 5. Touch Cc/Bcc to enter recipients in the Cc or Bcc fields.
- Touch the Subject field to enter a subject.
- 7. Touch the text field to enter the email text.

- Touch Attach to add an attachment. Choices are:
  - File: Select a file from My files.
  - Pictures: Select a picture from Gallery.
  - Videos: Select a video from Gallery.
  - Audio: Select an audio file from Mv files.
  - Capture picture: Open the camera and take a picture.
  - Capture video: Open the video recorder and shoot a video.
  - Record audio: Open the voice recorder and make a recording. The selected or created file is attached. Touch 

    to remove the attachment.
- While composing a message, press the Menu Kev is for these options:
  - . Save as draft: Save the message in Drafts.
  - Add text: Lets you add text to your email from:
    - Contacts: Touch contact information to select it, then touch Submit.
  - Calendar: Touch one or more calendar events, then touch Add
  - Memo: Touch one or more memos, then touch Attach.
- 10. Touch Send to send the message or Discard to cancel the email.

## **Managing Emails**

You can view emails you receive for all accounts in the Combined inbox screen or you can view email accounts individually.

## **Account Settings**

Account Settings lets you use settings to configure handling of email on your device.

Note: Available settings may depend on the email account and include setting how much email to synchronize, creating signatures for emails you send, and other handling options.

- Choose an email account and press the Menu Kev 

  → More → Account settings. The following options display:
  - · General settings:
    - Account name: Enter a name to identify this account.
    - Your name: Enter your name, to appear on emails from this account.

- Amount to synchronise: Choose how much email you want to see on your device. Options are: 1 day, 3 days, 1 week, 2 weeks, or 1 month
- Email check frequency: Lets you configure how often the device queries the remote server for new email changes. Options are: Automatic (Push), Never, Every 5 minutes, Every 10 minutes, Every 15 minutes, Every 30 minutes, or Every hour.
- **Default account**: When enabled, email from your device is automatically sent from this account.

#### Notification settings:

- **Email notifications**: When enabled, the New Email icon appears in the Status Bar when a new email arrives.
- **Select ringtone**: Choose a ringtone for email notifications for this account
- Vibrate: When enabled, email notifications for this accounts are accompanied by vibration.

## · Server settings:

- Incoming settings: Configure server settings.
- Sync contacts: When enabled, contacts from your account are synchronized with your device's Contacts.
- Sync calendar: When enabled, events from your account are synchronized with your device's Calendar.

#### Common Settings:

- **Recent messages**: Set the number of recent messages. Options are: 25. 50. 75. 100. 200. or Total.
- Forward with files: Enable or disable forwarding of file attachments.

- Add signature: Enable or disable adding a signature.
- Signature: Enter a signature to add to emails from this account.

# Google Talk

Google Talk is a free Windows and web-based application for instant messaging offered by Google. Conversation logs are automatically saved to a Chats area in your Gmail account. This allows you to search a chat log and store them in your Gmail accounts.

Tip: Talk requires that you have a Google account. To set up your Google account on your device use Accounts and sync settings. For more information, refer to "Accounts and Sync" on page 100.

1. From a Home screen, touch Talk (talk).



- or -

From a Home screen, touch **Applications**  $\longrightarrow$  **Talk**  $\stackrel{\text{talk}}{\longrightarrow}$ .





- Press **Next** to set up a Google account or to Sign in.
- Tap Create to create a new Google account.
  - or —

Tap **Sign in**, if you have an existing Google account.

Note: If you have already set up your Google account, you are automatically loaged in.

- 5. Touch Sign in.

Once sign in is complete, the Talk screen displays.

  - All friends / Most popular: List all friends or the most popular friends.
  - Add friend: Use the keypad to enter an invitation to a friend, then touch Send invitation.
  - Search: Enter a search term and search Google Talk.
  - **Sign out**: Close Google Talk and display the Home screen.
  - **Settings**: Offers various settings for Google talk.
  - More: Displays the following options:
    - Close all chats: Terminates any chats that you have open.
    - Invites: Lists any pending invitations that you have sent.
    - Blocked: Lists any friends that you have blocked.

 Touch and hold a Friend entry to display the following options: Start chat, Friend info, Block friend, Remove friend, View contact, Auto show friend / Always show friend, and Hide friend.

Note: If you touch the Hide friend option, press Menu Key 
→ Send invitation to make the Friend visible again.

Touch a Friend's entry to display the Chat entries for that Friend.

# **Section 6: Web and Social Networking**

#### Internet

Your device is equipped with a full HTML Browser that allows you to access the internet.

From a Home screen, touch Internet



Tip: Internet appears by default as a Primary shortcut on the Home screen.

# **Navigating the Web**

#### **Command Keys**

- Press the Back Key to return to the previous page.
- Touch to display Bookmarks, Most visited, and History.

### **Touching and dragging**

 Touch and drag your finger on the screen to navigate pages and to reposition pages within the screen.



#### **Entering text in a field**

 While browsing, touch a text field to display the virtual QWERTY keyboard to enter text.

#### Zoom

- . Tap the screen twice to zoom in or out.
- Use two fingers, such as your index finger and thumb, to zoom out by making an inward pinch motion on the screen. To zoom in, make an outward motion by sweeping your fingers out...



Tip: For convenient browsing, you can rotate the device to landscape mode.

## Selecting items on a page

While browsing, use gestures and menus to navigate:

- . Touch an item to select it.
- Touch a hyperlink to follow the link.
- Touch and hold on a hyperlink for these options:

Access a web site quickly by entering the URL.

The text is highlighted.

- Share page: Use Bluetooth, Email, or Gmail to send the page's URL.
- **Downloads**: View and manage recent downloads.
- Settings: Customize the Internet settings (see "Internet Settings" on page 50).

    - Open in background: When enabled, new windows open behind the current window

- **Set home page**: View and set the default first page that displays when you launch the Browser.
- Default storage: The default location for downloads.
- Privacy settings
  - Clear cache: Delete content and databases stored on the device.
  - Clear history: Delete the list of previously-visited pages.
  - Accept cookies: When enabled, allows Browser to save and read cookie information used by web pages.
  - Clear all cookie data: Delete cookie information saved to the device.
- Remember form data: When enabled, stores information you enter into forms to make future forms easier.
- Clear form data: Deletes saved form information.
- **Enable location**: When enabled, sites you visit can request access to vour location.
- Clear location access: Clear location access for all web sites.
- Security settings
  - Remember passwords: When enabled, saves usernames and passwords for sites you visit, to make future visits easier.
  - Clear passwords: Clear all saved usernames and passwords.
  - Show security warnings: When enabled, the Browser warns you if there is a problem with a site's security.

- Advanced settings
- Select search engine: Select the search engine you want to use. Choices are: Google, Yahoo!, and Bing.
- Website settings: View and manage settings for individual web sites.
- Reset to default: Clear all browser data and reset all settings to the factory defaults.

# Maps

Use Google Maps to find your current location, get directions, and other location-based information. The Google Maps shortcut appears by default on the Main Home screen by default.

Note: You must enable location services to use Maps. Some features require Standalone or Google location services. For more information, refer to "Location and Security" on page 96.

## **Music Player**

The Music Player plays songs from an installed memory card.

- Music Player scans your memory card and displays songs on the All. Playlists. Albums. or Artists tabs.
- Touch a song or playlist to begin playback.



- During playback, use the sound and playlist controls:
  - **SoundAlive**: Touch to set SoundAlive options. For more information, refer to "Music Player Settings" on page 57.
  - **Volume**: Touch to activate on-screen volume control, then touch and drag on the scale to set volume. You can also press the Volume Key on the side of the device to adjust playback volume.

Note: Tap the screen to display the Shuffle, Repeat Section, and Repeat icons, the Progress Bar, and time indicators.

- Shuffle: When enabled, songs play in random order. When disabled, songs play in the order they appear in List view.
- Repeat Section: Touch to select a section you want to repeat. Touch once to set the start of the section (A). Touch again to set the end of the section (B) and start the repeating section. Touch Clear A-B to clear and stop the repeating section.
- Repeat: Touch to repeat the current song, repeat all songs, or disable repeat mode.
- **Progress Bar**: Touch and drag the end of the progress bar to scan forward or backward through the current song.
- Time indicators: The time indicators show, in minutes and seconds, how much of the song has played (left) and the length of the song (right).

#### Playback controls:

- Touch to advance to the next song. Touch and hold to scan forward through the current song.
- Touch to go back to the previous song. Touch and hold to scan backward through the current song.
- List mode: Touch to switch to the All tab, which lists all songs.

## **Music Player Options**

To access additional options while playing a song, follow these steps:

- From a Home screen, touch Music , then touch a song or playlist to begin playback.
- 2. Press the Menu Key 🖃 .

The follow options are available:

- Add to quick list / Go to quick list: Adds the current music file to the Quick list or display the Quick list.
- Via Bluetooth: Scan for devices and pair with a Bluetooth headset.
- Share music via: Share your music by using AllShare, Bluetooth, Gmail. or Email.
- Set as alarm tone: Create an alarm that uses the current song as the tone.
- Add to playlist: Add the current music file to a selected playlist.

- More: Access the following additional options:
  - Settings: Change your music player settings. For more information, refer to "Music Player Settings" on page 57.
  - Details: View media information such as artist name, song title, album title, track length, genre, recording date, and so on.

## **Creating a Playlist**

- From a Home screen, touch Music , then touch the Playlists tab.
- 2. Press the Menu Key → Create, then touch the name field to enter a name for the playlist.
- 3. Touch Save to save the new playlist.

# **Adding Songs to Playlists**

- From a Home screen, touch Music , then touch the Playlists tab.
- Touch songs to select them or touch Select all.A checkmark indicates selected songs.
- Touch Add to add the selected songs to the playlist.

### Adding a song to a playlist during playback

1. From a Home screen, touch Music (



- Touch a song to play it.
- Press the Menu Key → Add to playlist.
- Choose one of these options:
  - Touch a playlist to add the selected song to the playlist.
  - Touch Create playlist to create a new playlist for the song.

# **Music Player Settings**

- From a Home screen, touch Music
- Press the **Menu Key → Settings** for these options:
  - SoundAlive: Touch to select a sound effect. Touch User1 or User2 to define your own sound settings.
  - Play speed: Increase or decrease the playback speed of a music
  - Master EQ: Set the master equalizer.
  - . Music menu: Choose the types of menus to display as tabs in Music Player.
  - Music play screen: Select a visualization to be displayed during playback.

#### FM Radio

The built-in FM radio in your device provides free music from your local FM radio stations. You can manually or automatically scan for stations and create a Station List of your favorite stations.

### To use the radio:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch Applications

- → FM radio
- First, set the FM Region. Touch the appropriate region and then touch Yes to start the auto preset.
  - An Earphone not connected message displays, if you have not plugged in your headphones, which serves as an antenna for your FM radio.
  - The FM radio screen displays.
- Turn the Station Dial clockwise or counter-clockwise to find FM stations as indicated by the Current Radio Station indicator at the top of the display.
- Touch one of the Favorites indicators (+) to set the current station as a favorite. The station is also added to the Station List.



Touch the Previous Preset Station button (<) or the Next Preset Station button (>) to step through the stations in the Station List.

Note: If no stations have been preset, these buttons step through each available station.

- Touch the Earphones / Speakers button to toggle between the headset and the device speakers.
- Touch the Mute / Unmute button to turn on or turn off the sound.
- 8. Press the Menu Key 🔳 to display the following options:
  - Scan: Removes the existing Station List, if one exists, scans for FM stations, and adds them to the Station List.
  - Remove: Allows you to delete the Favorites that have been set.
     Touch the delete button associated with each favorite you want to delete. Touch Done when you are finished.
  - **FM Region**: Touch the region that best describes where you are using FM radio.
  - Touch Station list to display the list of preset stations.

    Favorite stations are marked with a star. Press the

    Menu Kev limit to display the following options
    - Remove: Touch Select all or touch individual stations to remove from the Station List. Touch Delete once you have made your selection.
    - Rename: Touch the station you want to rename, enter the new name, and touch Done.

Touch Close to exit the Station list.



Use your device's built-in camera to take photos and record video

From a Home screen, touch **Applications** 



→ Camera ...



Important!: Do not take photos of people without their permission. Do not take photos in places where cameras are not allowed. Do not take photos in places where you may interfere with another person's privacy.

### **Taking Photos**

- 1. From a Home screen, touch Applications

- → Camera
- 2. Using the display as a viewfinder, compose your photo by aiming the lens at the subject. To configure settings, see "Camera Options" on page 60.
- To take the photo, touch the Camera Key.
- 4. After taking a photo, touch Image Viewer to view the photo. While viewing the photo, use these options:
  - Pinch the screen or double-tap on the screen to zoom all the way in or out. For more information, refer to "Pinch" on page 17.
  - Touch the screen to display the following options:
    - Share: Send the photo by using AllShare, Bluetooth, Email, Gmail, or Picasa.
    - Set as: Assign the photo as Contact icon or Wallpaper.
    - Delete: To erase the photo, touch OK.
  - Press the **Back Key** to return to the Camera to take more photos.

Tip: Touch the photo to show or hide Image Viewer options.

#### **Camera Options**

Camera options are represented by icons on the left side of the screen. While in Camera mode, touch the following icons to configure the camera:



Flash: Choose a flash mode from Off, On, or Auto flash.



**Self shot**: Touch to switch to the front-facing camera lens and take a photo of yourself.



**Shooting mode**: Choose an automatic shooting mode, from:

- . Single shot: Take a single photo.
- Smile shot: Touch the Camera button to automatically focus on the subject's face and take the photo.
- Panorama: Touch the Camera button to take a photo, then use the on-screen guideline to move the viewfinder and take the next 7 shots automatically.
- Action shot: detects action and creates a panorama of the moving object.



**Exposure value:** Set the brightness of the photo.



**Settings**: Tap for the following options:

- Outdoor visibility: allows you to take better pictures when outdoors.
- Macro: Set Macro mode to take close-up pictures.
   Face detection causes the camera to automatically recognize if there is a face in the shot. It then optimizes the focus and exposure the face.
- Scene mode: Choose an automatic scene mode from None, Portrait, Landscape, Night, Sports, Party/ Indoor, Beach/Snow, Sunset, Dawn, Fall color, Firework, Text, Candlelight, or Backlight.
- Timer: Set a 2, 5, or 10 second timer.
- Resolution: Set a size for the image. Options are: 3.2M (2048x1536), 2.4M (2048x1232), 2M (1600x1200), 1.5M (1600x960), 0.3M (640x480), or 0.4M (800x480).
- White balance: Set the light source. Options are: Auto, Daylight, Cloudy, Incandescent, or Fluorescent.
- Effects: Apply an effect to photos. Options are: Normal, Negative, Black and white, or Sepia.
- Metering: Set how the camera measures or meters the light source: Centre-weighted, Spot, or Matrix.

- Image quality: Choose a quality setting for photos. Options are: Superfine, Fine, or Normal.
- . Adjust: Used to adjust Contrast, Saturation, and Sharpness.




Settings: Tap for the following options:

- Guidelines: Used to enable or disable the guidelines.
- Review: Activate the instant review feature, which displays images immediately after capture (On or Off, or 2 seconds for Camera mode).
- Shutter sound: Enable or disable one of the camera's three shutter sounds.
- Storage: Set the storage location. Options are: Internal memory or memory card.
- Reset: Set all Camera settings back to the defaults.

### Camcorder

Use your device's built-in Camcorder to record high-definition video in 720p resolution.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch Camera
- Tap the **Mode** icon to switch from the Camera to the Camcorder COO



**Important!:** Do not take videos of people without their permission. Do not take videos in places where cameras are not allowed. Do not take videos in places where you may interfere with another person's privacy.

## Capturing Video

- From a Home screen, touch Camera
- Tap the **Mode** icon to switch from the Camera to the Camcorder COO
- Using the display as a viewfinder, compose your shot by aiming the lens at the subject. To configure settings, see "Camcorder Options" on page 62.

- 4. To start recording, touch **Record**During recording, the button changes to **Pause**Touch **Pause** to temporarily stop recording. To resume recording, touch **Record**again.
- 5. To stop recording, touch the **Stop** button.
- 7. Sweep across the screen to review all videos. While reviewing the videos:
  - . Double-tap on the video to zoom all the way in or out.
  - Touch the screen to display the following options:
    - Share: Send the video by using AllShare, Bluetooth, Email, Gmail, or YouTube.
    - Play: Play video being displayed.
    - **Delete**: Erase the video being displayed.
  - Press the **Back Key** to return to the Camcorder.

Tip: Touch the video to show or hide Image Viewer options.

# **Camcorder Options**

- Effects: Apply an effect to videos. Options are: Normal, Negative, Black and white, or Sepia.

- Video quality: Choose a quality setting for videos.
   Options are: Superfine, Fine, or Normal.
- Adjust: Used to adjust Contrast, Saturation, and Sharpness.



**Settings**: Tap for the following options:

- Guidelines: Used to enable or disable the guidelines.
- Audio recording: Enable to record sound along with video.
- Review: Enable or disable the instant review feature, which displays videos immediately after capture.
- Storage: Set the storage location. Options are: Internal memory or Memory card.
- Reset: Set all Camcorder settings back to the defaults.

### **Videos**

Your device's 5-inch 800x480 Super Clear LCD touch screen provides playback of videos. Use Videos to view and manage videos stored on an installed memory card.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch Videos 🛂.
- While viewing the Videos list, press the Menu Key for options:
  - Remove from list: Touch videos to select them or touch Select all to remove all videos.
  - List by: Display videos by Size, Name (default), Date, or Type.
- Touch a video to play it. While playing a video, touch the screen to display or hide on-screen playback controls.
- 4. During playback, press the **Menu Key** for options:
  - Share video: Send the video by AllShare, YouTube, Bluetooth, Email, or Gmail.
  - SoundAlive: Choose your audio preference. Options are: Normal, Voice, 5.1 ch, or Theater.
  - Details: Provides details about the photo such as File name, Format, Resolution, File size, Date & Time, and Forwarding.
  - Add bookmark: Add a bookmark to this video.
  - Bookmarks: Display Bookmarks for the video. To delete Bookmarks tap Delete, tap each Bookmark you want to delete, and tap Done.

#### More:

- **Via Bluetooth**: Scans for a Bluetooth device on which to play the video.
- Play speed: Use the slider to adjust the video play speed.
- Settings: Set the video to repeat and set color tone to Normal, Warm, or Cold.

While viewing a video, you can also adjust the screen view. Screen view allows you to select Original Size, Full-Screen, or Full-Screen in Ratio to view your video.

Note: The screen view icons are a three-way toggle. The icon that is displayed, is the mode that appears after the icon is tapped.

- Original Size ( ): Play the video in its original size.
- Full-Screen in Ratio View ( ): Enlarge the video as much as possible without becoming distorted.

- Previous/Next: Tap to jump to the previously played video or tap
   to jump to the next video file in the Videos folder.
- Brightness: Tap to display the brightness slider, then touch and drag the slider to set the brightness of the video.
- Volume: Tap to display the volume slider, then touch and drag the slider to set the volume of the video.

 Exit: To return to the videos list, tap in the top right corner of the screen.

# **Gallery**

Your device's 5-inch 800x480 Super Clear LCD touch screen provides high-resolution display of photos and videos.

Use Gallery to view, capture, and manage photos and videos.

## **Gallery Options**

When you open the Gallery, various photo and video folders are displayed. The folders can be on your device or on your external memory card.

To manage these folders:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch Applications
  - → Gallery 🔯
- 2. Press the Menu Key 🖃 .

Select all and Unselect all appears at the top of the screen. Checkmarks also display on each folder of pictures or videos.

- Touch Select all or touch the folders you want to select (the checkmark turns white when a folder is selected), then touch one of these options:
  - Share: Send each selected folder and its contents by Bluetooth, Picasa (photos), YouTube (videos), Email, or Gmail.
  - Delete: Touch Confirm deletions to delete the selected folders.
  - More:
    - Details: Displays details about the folders selected.
- 4. Touch a folder to display the folder's contents.
- 5. Press the Menu Key 🖃 .

**Select all** and **Unselect all** appears at the top of the screen. Checkmarks also display on each picture or video.

- 6. Select all or touch the pictures or videos you want to select (the checkmark turns white when an item is selected), then touch one of these options:
  - Share: Send each selected item by AllShare, Picasa (photos), YouTube (videos), Bluetooth, Gmail, or Email.
  - Delete: Touch Confirm deletions to delete the selected items.
  - More:
    - **Details**: Displays details about the items selected.

  - → Gallery 🙋 .
- 2. Touch at the top of the screen. For more information, refer to "Camera" on page 59.

Note: Videos are marked with a Play Dutton.

- 3. While viewing a video, press the Menu Key for these options:
  - Share video: Send the video by AllShare, YouTube, Bluetooth, Gmail, or Email.
  - Details: Displays details about the video such as File name, Format, Resolution, File size, Date & Time, and Forwarding.
  - Via Bluetooth: Scans for a Bluetooth device on which to play the video.

#### **Viewing Photos**

- From a Home screen, touch Applications —

- Touch a category, then touch a photo to view it.
- While viewing a photo, touch the screen for these options:
  - Slideshow: Touch to view a slideshow of photos.

    - Delete: Touch Confirm deletions to delete the selected folders.

      - **Details**: Display details about the photo.
      - Show on map: Show on a map where the picture was taken.
      - Set as: Use the picture as Wallpaper or as a Contact icon.
      - Crop: Alllows you to crop the image. Touch and drag the sides of the crop box to create the crop area, then touch Save. Touch **Discard** to stop without cropping the picture.
      - Rotate left: Allows you to rotate the picture counterclockwise 90 degrees.
      - Rotate right: Allows you to rotate the picture clockwise 90 degrees.

### Setting a Photo as a Contact Icon

- Touch a category, then touch a photo to select it.

## **Section 9: Connections**

Your device includes features to connect to the internet and to other devices by using Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, or a USB cable. Your device also supports removable microSD™ or microSDHC™ memory cards for storing music, photos, videos, and files.

## Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi is a wireless networking technology that provides access to local area networks. Use your device's Wi-Fi feature to:

- Access the internet for browsing or to send and receive email.
- Access your corporate network.
- · Use hotspots provided by hotels or airports while traveling.

Wi-Fi communication requires access to an existing Wireless Access Point (WAP). WAPs can be Open (unsecured, as with most hotspots) or Secured (requiring you to provide login credentials). Your device supports the 802.11 b/g/n Wi-Fi protocol.

## **Configuring Wi-Fi Settings**

For more information about configuring your device's Wi-Fi settings, see "Wi-Fi Settings" on page 90.

Finding Wi-Fi Networks

You can have your device automatically notify you of available networks. For more information, refer to "Network Notification" on page 91.

## **Turning Wi-Fi On or Off**

Turn your device's Wi-Fi service on or off. When you turn Wi-Fi service on, your device automatically searches for available, in-range WAPs (Wireless Access Points).

## **Turning Wi-Fi On**

- From any screen, sweep your finger downward from the top to display the Notification Panel.
- Touch Wi-Fi to turn Wi-Fi On.

## **Turning Wi-Fi Off**

- From any screen, sweep your finger downward from the top to display the Notification Panel.
- 2. Touch Wi-Fi to turn Wi-Fi Off.

### Scanning and Connecting to a Wi-Fi Network

When you turn on Wi-Fi, your device searches for available Wi-Fi connections, then displays them on screen.

- From any screen, sweep your finger downward from the top to display the Notification Panel.
- Touch Wi-Fi to turn Wi-Fi On. Your device automatically scans for available Wireless Access Points.
- When the scan is complete, touch a Wi-Fi network to connect. If the Wi-Fi network is open, your device automatically connects. If the Wi-Fi network is secured, enter the password at the prompt to connect.

# Adding a Wi-Fi Network Manually

- 2. Touch Wi-Fi to turn Wi-Fi On.
- Touch Add Wi-Fi network, then enter information about the network:
  - Network SSID: Enter the name of the Wi-Fi Wireless Access Point.
  - Security: Select the type of security used by the WAP.
  - **Password**: If the WAP is secured, enter the password or hex key.

**Note:** Depending on the Security protocol used by the WAP, additional network information may be required.

Touch Save to save the settings.

#### **Bluetooth**

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology for exchanging information over a distance of about 30 feet.

You do not need to line up the devices to send information with Bluetooth. If the devices are in range, you can exchange information between them, even if they are in different rooms.

# **Configuring Bluetooth Settings**

Configure your device's Bluetooth settings. For more information, refer to "Bluetooth Settings" on page 92.

# Turning Bluetooth On or Off

### **Turning Bluetooth On**

- From any screen, sweep your finger downward from the top to display the Notification Panel.
- Touch Bluetooth to turn Bluetooth on.

Note: When Bluetooth is on, the Bluetooth icon 🔀 displays in the Status Bar.

#### **Turning Bluetooth Off**

- From any screen, sweep your finger downward from the top to display the Notification Panel.
- Touch Bluetooth to turn Bluetooth off.

### Pairing with a Bluetooth Device

Search for a Bluetooth device and pair with it, to exchange information between your device and the target device.

Tip: After pairing, your device and the target device recognize each other and exchange information without having to enter a passcode or PIN.

- From a Home screen, press the Menu Key → Settings 
   → Wireless and network → Bluetooth settings.
- Touch Bluetooth to turn on Bluetooth.
- 3. Enable the target device's discoverable or visible mode.
- Touch Scan devices.
- 5. From the list of scanned devices, touch the target device, then follow the prompts to complete the pairing:
  - If the target device requires a PIN, enter a PIN for the target device and touch **0K**. When prompted, enter the PIN on the target device.

 If the device allows automatic or smart pairing, your device attempts to pair with the device automatically. Follow the prompts on your device and the target device to complete the pairing.

### **Samsung Kies**

Samsung Kies is a software that enables you to update your device firmware by connecting to the PC.

### **Connecting With Samsung Kies**

- Install Samsung Kies software on your PC.
- From a Home screen, press the Menu Key → Settings 
   → Applications → Development → USB debugging.

- Using an optional PC data cable, connect the multifunction jack on your device to a PC.
  - Your computer recognizes the connection and displays the USB mass storage screen.
- Touch Connect USB storage.

- Run Samsung Kies and follow the prompts to update your device firmware.

# **Memory Card**

Your device supports removable microSD™ or microSDHC™ memory cards for storing music, photos, videos, and files.

# Installing and Removing a Memory Card

Important!: To prevent damage to information stored on the memory card, always unmount the card before removing it from the device.

# Formatting a Memory Card

Formatting erases all content from the memory card and prepares it for use with your device.

# Formatting a memory card using your device

- From a Home screen, press the Menu Key → Settings 
   → SD card and device storage
- 2. Touch Unmount SD card.
- After unmounting the SD card, touch Format SD card.
- **4.** Follow the prompts to confirm the formatting of the card.

### Formatting a memory card using your computer

Consult your computer and/or memory card reader documentation for information about formatting memory cards.

### Synchronizing with Windows Media Player

Ensure that Windows Media Player is installed on your PC.

- 1. From a Home screen, press the Menu Key  $\implies$  Settings
  - → Applications → Development → USB debugging.

Make sure this setting is *not* checked.

- 2. Attach your device to the computer with the USB cable.
- 3. Open Windows Media Player to synchronize music files.
- Edit or enter your device's name in the pop-up window.
- **5.** Select and drag the music files you want to the sync list and begin synchronizing.

# **Connecting as a Mass Storage Device**

You can connect your device to a PC as a removable disk and access the file directory. If you insert a memory card in the device, you can also access the files directory from the memory card by using the device as a memory card reader.

Note: The file directory of the memory card displays as folder external\_sd, separate from the internal memory.

- Insert a memory card into the device to transfer files from or to the memory card.
- Attach your device to the computer with the USB cable. Your computer recognizes the connection and displays the USB mass storage screen.

### Touch Connect USB storage.

A pop-up window displays on the PC when connected.

- 5. Open the folder to view files.
- 6. Copy files from the PC to the memory card.
- When finished, touch the Turn Off to quit mass storage mode. Disconnect the USB cable.

# **Section 10: Applications and Widgets**

This section contains a description of each application that is available in the Applications Menu, its function, and how to navigate through that particular application. If the application is already described in another section of this user manual, then a cross reference to that particular section is provided. Various widgets are also described.

Tip: To open applications quickly, add the icons of frequently-used applications to one of the Home screens. For details, see "Adding Shortcuts from Applications" on page 21.

# **GPS Applications**

GPS applications allow you to achieve real-time, GPS-enabled, turn-by-turn navigation and to access local searches based on a variety of category parameters.

To receive better GPS signals, avoid using your device in the following conditions:

- inside a building or between buildings
- in a tunnel or underground passage
- in poor weather
- around high-voltage or electromagnetic fields
- . in a vehicle with tinted windows

Global GPS turn-by-turn navigation, mapping, and Point of Interest content is available for three continents, including North America (U.S., Canada, and Mexico), Western Europe, and China, where wireless coverage is available.

Important!: If you touch or cover the internal GPS antenna while using GPS services, it may impede the GPS signal resulting in the GPS services not working in an optimal manner. Refer to the following diagram to locate the approximate location of the internal GPS antenna.



#### Alarm/Clock

Use Alarm/Clock to set an alarm, view the World clock, or access the Stopwatch or Timer.

#### **Alarm**

Set alarms for reminders or for wake-up times.

### **Setting Alarms**

- 1. From a Home screen, touch **Applications** 
  - → Alarm/Clock 💮
- 2. Touch the Alarm tab at the top of the Alarm/Clock screen.
- 3. Touch Create alarm or press the Menu Key  $\implies$  Create.
- 4. Touch fields to configure the alarm:
  - (Time): Set a time for the alarm to sound.

  - Alarm type: Choose an alarm type of Melody, Vibration, or Vibration and melody.

   Use the slider to hear and set the alarm volume.

The following is a list of helpful tips that can help conserve your battery power:

- Reduce your backlight time.

Flight mode allows you to use many of your devices's features. such as Camera, Games, and more, when you are in an airplane or in any other area where accessing data is prohibited.

Important!: When your device is in Flight Mode, it cannot access online information or applications.

security for wireless Wi-Fi phones, routers, access points, computers, adapters, and other electronic devices.

WPS allows you to push buttons instead of entering a network name and wireless security PIN.

- 2. Touch WPS button connection.
- Press the WPS button on your Wi-Fi access point within 2 minutes.

# **Advanced Settings**

Set up and manage wireless access points.

#### Advanced:

- Port: Touch to enter a port number.
- IP Settings: Enter IP settings for configuring a connection to a network using a static IP, including:
  - Use static IP: Touch to turn static IP On or Off.
  - IP address: Enter the IP address.
  - Gateway: Enter the gateway.
- Netmask: Enter the netmask.
- DNS 1: Enter the DNS1.
- DNS 2: Enter the DNS2.

# **Bluetooth Settings**

- Tap DNS search domains, add a name for DNS search using the keypad, then tap OK.
- To establish a L2TP/IPSec PSK (Pre-shared key based L2TP/IPSec):

# **Section 12: Health and Safety Information**

This section outlines the safety precautions associated with using your Galaxy Player. The terms "GALAXY" or "mobile device" are used in this section to refer to your Galaxy Player. **Read this information before using your GALAXY.** 

# **Exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) Signals**

Although GALAXY is not a cell phone, it can operate on the same network as cell phones and can use the same Radio Frequency (RF) signals to communicate with the network as a cell phone. Therefore, although the following information refers specifically to RF exposure from wireless phones, it may apply similarly to GALAXY when it is being used on a cell phone network.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has published information for consumers relating to Radio Frequency (RF) exposure from wireless phones. The FDA publication includes the following information:

#### Do cell phones pose a health hazard?

Many people are concerned that cell phone radiation will cause cancer or other serious health hazards. The weight of scientific evidence has not linked cell phones with any health problems.

Cell phones emit low levels of Radio Frequency (RF) energy. Over the past 15 years, scientists have conducted hundreds of studies looking at the biological effects of the radio frequency energy emitted by cell phones. While some researchers have reported biological changes associated with RF energy, these studies have failed to be replicated. The majority of studies published have failed to show an association between exposure to radio frequency from a cell phone and health problems.

The low levels of RF cell phones emit while in use are in the microwave frequency range. They also emit RF at substantially reduced time intervals when in the stand-by mode. Whereas high levels of RF can produce health effects (by heating tissue), exposure to low level RF that does not produce heating effects causes no known adverse health effects.

The biological effects of radio frequency energy should not be confused with the effects from other types of electromagnetic energy.

Very high levels of electromagnetic energy, such as is found in X-rays and gamma rays, can ionize biological tissues. Ionization is a process where electrons are stripped away from their normal locations in atoms and molecules. It can permanently damage biological tissues including DNA, the genetic material.

The energy levels associated with radio frequency energy, including both radio waves and microwaves, are not great

enough to cause ionization of atoms and molecules. Therefore, RF energy is a type of non-ionizing radiation. Other types of non-ionizing radiation include visible light, infrared radiation (heat), and other forms of electromagnetic radiation with relatively low frequencies.

While RF energy does not ionize particles, large amounts can increase body temperatures and cause tissue damage. Two areas of the body, the eyes and the testes, are particularly vulnerable to RF heating because there is relatively little blood flow in them to carry away excess heat.

# Research Results to Date: Is there a connection between RF and certain health problems?

The results of most studies conducted to date say no. In addition, attempts to replicate and confirm the few studies that have shown a connection have failed.

The scientific community at large therefore believes that the weight of scientific evidence does not show an association between exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) from cell phones and adverse health outcomes. Still the scientific community has supported additional research to address gaps in knowledge. Some of these studies are described below.

# **Interphone Study**

Interphone is a large international study designed to determine whether cell phones increase the risk of head and neck cancer. A report published in the International Journal of Epidemiology (June, 2010) compared cell phone usage for more than 5,000 people with brain tumors (glioma and meningioma) and a similar number of healthy controls.

Results of this study did NOT show that cell phones caused brain cancer. In this study, most people had no increased risk of brain cancer from using cell phones. For people with the heaviest use of cell phones (an average of more than ½ hour per day, every day, for over 10 years) the study suggested a slight increase in brain cancer. However, the authors determined that biases and errors prevented any conclusions being drawn from this data. Interphone is the largest cell phone study to date, but it did not answer all questions about cell phone safety. Additional research is being conducted around the world, and the FDA continues to monitor developments in this field.

#### International Cohort Study on Mobile Phone Users (COSMOS)

The COSMOS study aims to conduct long-term health monitoring of a large group of people to determine if there are any health issues linked to long-term exposure to radio frequency energy from cell phone use. The COSMOS study will follow approximately 300,000 adult cell phone users in Europe for 20 to 30 years. # Risk of Brain Cancer from Exposure to Radio Frequency Fields in Childhood and Adolescence (MOBI-KIDS)

MOBI-KIDS is an international study investigating the relationship between exposure to radio frequency energy from communication technologies including cell phones and brain cancer in young people. This is an international multi-center study involving 14 European and non-European countries.

# Surveillance, Epidemiology, and End Results (SEER) Program of the National Cancer Institute

The National Cancer Institute (NCI) actively follows cancer statistics in the United States to detect any change in rates of new cases for brain cancer. If cell phones play a role in risk for brain cancer, rates should go up, because heavy cell phone use

#### **Cell Phone Industry Actions**

Although the existing scientific data do not justify FDA regulatory actions, the FDA has urged the cell phone industry to take a number of steps, including the following:

- Support-needed research on possible biological effects of RF for the type of signal emitted by cell phones;
- Design cell phones in a way that minimizes any RF exposure to the user; and
- Cooperate in providing users of cell phones with the current information on cell phone use and human health concerns.

# Reducing Exposure: Hands-Free Kits and Other Accessories

# Steps to Reduce Exposure to Radio Frequency Energy

If there is a risk from being exposed to Radio Frequency (RF) energy from cell phones - and at this point we do not know that there is - it is probably very small. But, if you are concerned about avoiding even potential risks, you can take a few simple steps to minimize your RF exposure.

Reduce the amount of time spent using your cell phone;

 Use speaker mode or a headset to place more distance between your head and the cell phone.

#### **Hands-Free Kits**

Hands-free kits may include audio or Bluetooth® headsets and various types of body-worn accessories such as belt-clips and holsters. Combinations of these can be used to reduce RF energy absorption from cell phones.

Headsets can substantially reduce exposure because the phone is held away from the head in the user's hand or in approved body-worn accessories. Cell phones marketed in the U.S. are required to meet RF exposure compliance requirements when used against the head and against the body.

Because there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from cell phones, there is no reason to believe that hands-free kits reduce risks. Hands-free kits can be used for convenience and comfort. They are also required by law in many states if you want to use your phone while driving.

# Cell Phone Accessories that Claim to Shield the Head from RF Radiation

Because there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from cell phones, there is no reason to believe that accessories which claim to shield the head from those emissions reduce risks. Some products that claim to shield the user from RF absorption use special phone cases, while others involve nothing more than a metallic accessory attached to the phone. Studies have shown that these products generally do not work as advertised. Unlike "hands-free" kits, these so-called "shields" may interfere with proper operation of the phone. The phone may be forced to boost its power to compensate, leading to an increase in RF absorption.

#### **Children and Cell Phones**

The scientific evidence does not show a danger to any users of cell phones from RF exposure, including children and teenagers. The steps adults can take to reduce RF exposure apply to children and teenagers as well.

- · Reduce the amount of time spent on the cell phone;
- Use speaker mode or a headset to place more distance between the head and the cell phone.

Some groups sponsored by other national governments have advised that children be discouraged from using cell phones at all. For example, The Stewart Report from the United Kingdom made such a recommendation in December 2000. In this report, a group of independent experts noted that no evidence exists that using a cell phone causes brain tumors or other ill effects. Their recommendation to limit cell phone use by children was strictly precautionary; it was not based on scientific evidence that any health hazard exists.

# Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) Certification Information

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the exposure limits for Radio Frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government.

These FCC exposure limits are derived from the recommendations of two expert organizations: the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurement (NCRP) and the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE).

In both cases, the recommendations were developed by scientific and engineering experts drawn from industry, government, and academia after extensive reviews of the scientific literature related to the biological effects of RF energy.

The exposure limit set by the FCC for wireless mobile devices employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR is a measure of the rate of absorption of RF energy by the human body expressed in units of watts per kilogram (W/kg). The FCC requires wireless devices to comply with a safety limit of 1.6 watts per kilogram (1.6 W/kg).

The FCC exposure limit incorporates a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection to the public and to account for any variations in measurements.

SAR tests are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC with the mobile device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the mobile device while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the mobile device is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output.

Before a new model mobile device is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed the exposure limit established by the FCC. Tests for each model of a device are performed in positions and locations (e.g. near the body) as required by the FCC.

For typical operations, this mobile device has been tested and meets FCC RF exposure guidelines.

Use of other accessories may not ensure compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines.

The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this mobile device with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF exposure guidelines. The maximum SAR values for this model device as reported to the FCC are:

# **Responsible Listening**

Caution!: Avoid potential hearing loss.

Damage to hearing occurs when a person is exposed to loud sounds over time. The risk of hearing loss increases as sound is played louder and for longer durations. Prolonged exposure to loud sounds (including music) is the most common cause of preventable hearing loss. Some scientific research suggests that using portable audio devices, such as portable music players and cell phones, at high volume settings for long durations may lead to permanent noise-induced hearing loss. This includes the use of headphones (including headsets, earbuds, and Bluetooth® or other wireless devices). Exposure to very loud sound has also

been associated in some studies with tinnitus (a ringing in the ear), hypersensitivity to sound, and distorted hearing. Individual susceptibility to noise-induced hearing loss and potential hearing problem varies. Additionally, the amount of sound produced by a portable audio device varies depending on the nature of the sound, the device settings, and the headphones that are used. As a result, there is no single volume setting that is appropriate for everyone or for every combination of sound, settings, and equipment.

You should follow some common sense recommendations when using any portable audio device:

- Always turn the volume down before plugging the earphones into an audio source.
- Set the volume in a quiet environment and select the lowest volume at which you can hear adequately.
- Be aware that you can adapt to higher volume settings over time, not realizing that the higher volume may be harmful to your hearing.
- When using headphones, turn the volume down if you cannot hear the
  people speaking near you or if the person sitting next to you can hear
  what you are listening to.
- Do not turn the volume up to block out noisy surroundings. If you choose to listen to your portable device in a noisy environment, use noise-cancelling headphones to block out background environmental noise. By blocking background environment noise, noise cancelling

headphones should allow you to hear the music at lower volumes than when using earbuds.

- Limit the amount of time you listen. As the volume increases, less time is required before you hearing could be affected.
- Avoid using headphones after exposure to extremely loud noises, such as rock concerts, that might cause temporary hearing loss. Temporary hearing loss might cause unsafe volumes to sound normal.
- Do not listen at any volume that causes you discomfort. If you
  experience ringing in your ears, hear muffled speech, or experience
  any temporary hearing difficulty after listening to your portable audio
  device, discontinue use and consult your doctor.

### **Operating Environment**

Remember to follow any special regulations in force in any area, and always switch your mobile device off whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference or danger. When connecting the mobile device or any accessory to another device, read its user's guide for detailed safety instructions. Do not connect incompatible products.

## **Using Your Mobile Device Near Other Electronic Devices**

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from Radio Frequency (RF) signals. However, certain electronic equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless mobile device. Consult the manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

#### **Implantable Medical Devices**

A minimum separation of six (6) inches should be maintained between a handheld wireless mobile device and an implantable medical device, such as a pacemaker or implantable cardioverter defibrillator, to avoid potential interference with the device.

- Should ALWAYS keep the mobile device more than six (6) inches from their implantable medical device when the mobile device is turned ON:

- Should turn the mobile device OFF immediately if there is any reason to suspect that interference is taking place;

 Should read and follow the directions from the manufacturer of your implantable medical device. #### Other Medical Devices
