

- Brackets [] are used to refer to onscreen controls you need to touch (menus, buttons, etc.) and to messages as they are displayed on the screen.
- The photos included in this manual are simulated pictures taken with a still camera. Unless indicated otherwise, illustrations and menu icons refer to the HFR68.
- Illustrations of the camcorder's screen or a computer's screen included in this manual may show only relevant parts of the screen.
- Navigation buttons: The navigation bar at the bottom of the page offers up to four buttons to let you get quickly to the information you want to find.
 - Jump to the general table of contents.
 - Go to a list of select functions grouped by their uses in reallife situations. This alternative index can be very useful for beginners who encounter a particular challenge but are not sure of what function to use.
 - Jump to the alphabetical index.
 - The button with a number in it will take you to the beginning of the current chapter, where you will find an overview of the information and related functions covered in that chapter. Note that the icon itself will change depending on the chapter you are currently reading.





- Observe the following precautions while the camcorder's ACCESS indicator is on or flashing. Failing to do so may result in permanent data loss or damage to the memory.
 - Do not open the memory card slot cover.
 - Do not disconnect the power source or turn off the camcorder.
 - Do not change the camcorder's shooting mode.
 - Do not press the **b** button.
 - When a USB cable is connected to the camcorder, do not disconnect the USB cable.








LCD touch screen

Open the LCD panel 90 degrees. By default, this will turn on the camcorder. The first time you open the LCD panel, the initial setup screens will appear and guide you through the basic settings (\$\subsection\$36).



Adjust the position of the LCD panel according to the recording conditions.

- The screen is produced using extremely high-precision manufacturing techniques, with more than 99.99% of the pixels operating to specification. Less than 0.01% of the pixels may occasionally misfire or appear as black, red, blue or green dots. This has no effect on the recorded image and does not constitute a malfunction.

This section explains the types of memory cards that can be used and how to insert one into the camcorder.

First Time Settings


When you turn on the camcorder for the first time, you will need to complete the basic setup and set the camcorder's language, date and time, movie format (AVCHD or MP4), and recording memory (HFR68/R67/R66) only).

Basic Operation of the Camcorder

In this section you can learn more about basic operations, such as using the touch screen, changing operating modes and using the menus.

Charging the Battery Pack

The camcorder can be powered with a battery pack or directly using the compact power adapter.



- Connect the power cord to the compact power adapter.
- 2 Plug the power cord into a power outlet.
- 3 Connect the compact power adapter to the camcorder's DC IN terminal.









- 4 Attach the battery pack to the camcorder.
 - Press the battery pack softly into the battery attachment unit and slide it up until it clicks in place.
- 5 Charging will start when the camcorder is turned off.
 - If the camcorder was on, the green POWER/CHG indicator will go out when you turn off the camcorder. After a moment, the POWER/CHG indicator will turn on in red (battery pack charging).
 The red POWER/CHG indicator will go out when the battery pack is fully charged.
 - If the indicator flashes, refer to Troubleshooting (246).
 - Fully charging the supplied battery pack will take approximately 5 hours and 35 minutes.

To remove the battery pack


- 1 Slide BATTERY RELEASE in the direction of the arrow and hold it pressed down.
- 2 Slide the battery pack and then pull it out.

















- Turn off the camcorder before connecting or disconnecting the compact power adapter. After turning off the camcorder, important data is updated in the memory. Be sure to wait until the green POWER/CHG indicator goes out.
- Do not connect to the camcorder's DC IN terminal or to the compact power adapter any electrical equipment that is not expressly recommended for use with this camcorder.
- To prevent equipment breakdowns and excessive heating, do not connect the supplied compact power adapter to voltage converters for overseas travels or special power sources such as those on aircraft and ships, DC-AC inverters, etc.



 We recommend charging the battery pack in temperatures between 10 °C and 30 °C. If either the ambient temperature or the battery pack's temperature is outside the range of approx. 0 °C to 40 °C, charging will not start.









Charging the Battery Pack

- If the ambient temperature or the battery pack's temperature is low, charging may take longer than usual.
- The battery pack will be charged only when the camcorder is off.
- If the power supply was disconnected while charging a battery pack, make sure the POWER/CHG indicator has gone out before restoring the power supply.
- If remaining battery time is an issue, you can power the camcorder using the compact power adapter so the battery pack will not be consumed.
- Charged battery packs continue to discharge naturally. Therefore, charge them on the day of use, or the day before, to ensure a full charge.
- Battery packs for this camcorder can display the remaining battery time. The first time you use a battery pack, fully charge it and then use the camcorder until the battery pack is completely exhausted. Doing so will ensure that the remaining recording time will be displayed accurately.
- For details about how to take care of the battery pack, refer to Battery Pack (\$\subseteq\$ 272). For charging times and approximate usage times, refer to the Reference Tables (\$\subseteq\$ 288).
- You can verify the battery charge status of the battery pack with the !! >> [Eattery Info] setting.
- We recommend that you prepare battery packs to last 2 to 3 times longer than you think you might need.









Using a Memory Card

Memory Cards Compatible for Use with the Camcorder

You can use the following types of commercially available SD cards with this camcorder. We recommend using memory cards rated CLASS 4, 6 or 10*.

As of December 2014, the movie recording function has been tested using SD/SDHC/SDXC cards made by Panasonic, Toshiba and SanDisk. For the latest information on memory cards that can be used, visit your local Canon Web site.

* To record movies with a video quality of 50P or 35 Mbps, or to use slow & fast motion recording, we recommend using memory cards rated CLASS 6 or 10.

** When using an SD memory card without a Speed Class rating or one rated CLASS 2, you may not be able to record movies.



 After repeatedly recording and deleting scenes (fragmented memory), it will take longer to write data on the memory card and recording may stop. Back up your recordings and initialize the memory card using the [Complete Initialization] option (\$\sum\$ 40).









Using a Memory Card



About the Speed Class: Speed Class is a standard that indicates the minimum guaranteed data transfer speed of memory cards. When you buy a new memory card, look for the Speed Class logo on the package.

SDXC Cards

You can use SDXC cards with this camcorder. When using SDXC cards with other devices, such as digital recorders, computers and card readers, make sure that the external device is compatible with SDXC cards. For more information on compatibility, contact the computer, operating system or memory card manufacturer.



 If you use an SDXC card with a computer OS that is not SDXC-compatible, you may be prompted to format the memory card. In such case, cancel the operation to prevent data loss.

Inserting and Removing a Memory Card


When you turn on the camcorder for the first time, the first screen of the basic setup will appear. To use a memory card for recording, turn off the camcorder and insert the memory card before performing the basic setup. After completing the basic setup (\square 36), be sure to initialize the memory card with the camcorder before using it for the first time (\square 40).











- Open the LCD panel.
 - The camcorder will turn on automatically. If this is the first time you turn on the camcorder, the language selection screen of the basic setup will appear.
- 2 Press ON/OFF to turn off the camcorder.
 - Make sure the POWER/CHG indicator is off.
- 3 Open the memory card slot cover.
- Insert the memory card at a slight angle, with the label facing toward the lens, all the way into the memory card slot until it clicks.
 - The memory card slot is at a slight angle toward the lens so be careful not to damage the memory card when inserting it.
- 5 Close the memory card slot cover.
 - Do not force the cover closed if the memory card is not correctly inserted.









Using a Memory Card

To remove the memory card

Push the memory card once to release it. When the memory card springs out, pull it all the way out.



• Memory cards have front and back sides that are not interchangeable. Inserting a memory card facing the wrong direction can cause a malfunction of the camcorder. Be sure to insert the memory card as described in step 4.

First Time Settings

Basic Setup

The first time you turn on the camcorder, you will be guided by the camcorder's basic setup screens to select the camcorder's language, set the date and time, and select the movie format (AVCHD or MP4) and recording memory (HFR68/R67/R66 only). For details on how to use the touch screen, refer to Using the Touch Screen (43).

- Open the LCD panel.
 - If this is the first time you turn on the camcorder, the language selection screen will appear.
 - You can also press ON/OFF to turn on the camcorder.
- 2 Touch the language that you want to be used for onscreen displays and then touch [▷].
 - You can select one of 27 languages. You may need to scroll down to find your language.
 - After you select a language, the [Date Format] screen will appear.

3 Touch [Y.M.D], [M.D,Y] or [D.M.Y] to select the date format you prefer and then touch [▷].









- After you select the date format, the [Date/Time] screen will appear with the first field selected.
- 4 Touch a field you want to change (year, month, day, hours or minutes).
- 5 Touch [▲] or [▼] to change the field as necessary.



- 6 Set the correct date and time by changing all the fields in the same way.
 - Touch [24H] to use 24-hour clock or leave it unselected to use 12-hour clock (AM/PM).
- 7 Touch [OK] and then touch [▷].
 - After you set the date and time, the [Movie Format] screen will appear.
- Touch [MMD] or [MPA] to select the movie format and then touch $[\triangleright]$.
 - HFR68/R67/R66 After you select the movie format, the [¹── Rec Media for Movies] screen will appear, where you can select the memory where movies will be recorded.
 - HFR606 Skip to step 11.









- 9 Touch [□] (built-in memory) or [□] (memory card) and then touch [▷].
 - When selecting the memory, you can check the available recording time based on the default video quality setting.
 - After you select the memory to which you want to record movies, the [Rec Media for Photos] screen will appear.
- **10** Touch [□] (built-in memory) or [□] (memory card) and then touch [▷].
 - When selecting the memory, you can check the number of photos that can be recorded, based on a photo size of 1920x1080.
- 11 Touch [OK].
 - The basic setup is complete. The settings you selected will appear briefly and then the camcorder will be ready to record.
 - After completing the basic setup, you can close the LCD panel or press ON/OFF to turn off the camcorder.

- When you do not use the camcorder for about 3 months, the built-in rechargeable lithium battery may discharge completely and the date and time setting may be lost. In such case, recharge the built-in lithium battery (\(\sumathcap{1}\sumathcap{2}\) 274). The next time you turn on the camcorder, you will have to perform the basic setup again.
- You can change the !! >> [Power On Using LCD Panel] setting so that you can turn the camcorder on and off only by pressing ON/OFF).

Changing the Time Zone

Change the time zone to match your location. The default setting is Paris. In addition, the camcorder is able to retain the date and time of another location. This is convenient when you travel so that you can set the camcorder to match the time of your home location or that of your destination.

This section requires using the camcorder's menus. For details about how to use the menus, refer to Using the Menus (\square 44).



1 Open the [Time Zone/DST] screen.











- 2 Touch [♠] to set the home time zone, or [♣] to set the time zone of your destination when you are traveling.
- 3 Touch [▲] or [▼] to set the desired time zone. If necessary, touch [★] to adjust for daylight saving time.

Initializing the Memory

Initialize memory cards when you use them with this camcorder for the first time. You can also initialize a memory card or the built-in memory (HFR68/R67/R66) only) to permanently delete all the recordings it contains. [HFR68/R67/R66] At the time of purchase, the built-in memory comes preinitialized and contains music files for use as background music and image files for use with the image mix function (image mix frames).



- 1 Power the camcorder using the compact power adapter.
 - Do not disconnect the power source or turn off the camcorder until the initialization is completed.







Touch this option if you want to physically erase all the data rather than just clear the file allocation table of the memory.

If you selected the [Complete Initialization] option, you can touch [Cancel] to cancel the initialization while it is in progress. All recordings will be erased and the memory can be used without any problem.



- Initializing a memory will permanently erase all recordings.
 Lost original recordings cannot be recovered. Make sure you save important recordings in advance using an external device (
 149).
- Initializing a memory card will permanently erase any music files and images you may have transferred to the memory card. (HFR68/R67/R66) The music files and image mix frames that come pre-installed in the built-in memory will be restored after it is initialized.)









 HFR606 About FlashAir cards: Initializing a FlashAir card with this camcorder will reset the card's wireless settings (SSID, passwords, etc.) to factory settings. We recommend formatting FlashAir cards on a computer, using the FlashAir configuration tools.











Using the Touch Screen

The buttons and menu items that appear on the touch screen change dynamically depending on the operating mode and the task you are performing. With the intuitive touch screen interface you have all the controls at your fingertips.





1 Touch

Touch on an element displayed on the touch screen.

Used to start playing back a scene in an index screen, to select a setting from the menus, etc.

2 Drag

While touching the screen, swipe your finger up and down or left and right across the screen.

Used to scroll menus, to browse through index screen pages or to adjust slider controls like the volume.











- In the following cases, you may not be able to perform touch operations correctly.
 - Using your fingernails or hard-tipped objects, such as ballpoint pens.
 - Operating the touch screen with wet or gloved hands.
 - Applying excessive force with your finger.

Using the Menus

The (Home) menu is the gateway to most of the camcorder's functions and settings. In recording mode, the (Home) menu offers immediate access to some frequently used functions. In playback mode, it is from the (Home) menu that you will switch between the movies' and photos' index screens. In both modes, from the (Home) menu you can open the [LTOther Settings] menus for more detailed settings, and also access the camcorder's various Wi-Fi functions (HFR68/R67/R65) only).

Using the Menus

Changing the camcorder's various settings using the menus is very easy. You make your selection simply by touching the button of the desired option. When they appear on the screen, you can touch $[\ \ \ \ \]$ to return to the previous screen or $[\ \ \ \ \ \ \]$ to close the menu. In some screens, you will need to scroll to find the desired option.



Some screens provide additional information about the options. In that case, simply drag your finger up and down along the column of icons.

The [Other Settings] Menu

The [11 Other Settings] menus offer many options to control various aspects of the camcorder's operation. For details, refer to the complete list of settings in the appendix [11 Other Settings] Menus (11 210).

In the [IT Other Settings] menus, settings are organized under submenus (tabs). For brevity's sake, these settings are referenced throughout the manual like this: "IT > [Language]". In this example (to change the language), you will need to do the following:

- 1 Touch [♠] to open the ♠ (Home) menu.
- 2 Drag your finger left/right to bring [if Other Settings] to the center. Then, touch the icon to open the [if Other Settings] menus.



Movie Format

Refers to AVCHD or MP4 recordings. While recording, you can change the movie format from the [Recording Setup] menu (226). During playback, use the index screen button (67) to switch between playback of AVCHD scenes and MP4 scenes.

Recording

When you open the LCD panel or press (NOOFF), the camcorder will turn on in recording mode. The shooting mode icons in the operating modes bar are the same icons used in the shooting mode selection screen (MOOFE) 82).









Playback

Press to switch the camcorder between recording mode and playback mode.

In the **Playback** area of the operating modes bar, the PR icon refers to playing back movies (65), whether from the PR index screen (all scenes), the PR index screen (only scenes recorded in (Baby) mode) or the PR index screen (only video snapshot scenes recorded in AVCHD format). The Icon refers to viewing photos from the Icon index screen (71).


Recording Video

You are now ready to record movies.





 Before you begin recording, make a test recording first to check that the camcorder is operating correctly.



- 1 Open the LCD panel to turn on the camcorder.
 - You can also press ON/OFF.
 - IFR63/R67/R66 By default, movies are recorded in the built-in memory. You can select the memory that will be used to record movies (\$\sum\$ 80).









- By default, the camcorder's shooting mode is set to (III)
 (III) 57). You can select a different shooting mode according to the shooting conditions (IIII) 82).
- Slide the lens cover switch down.
- 3 Press START/STOP to begin recording.
 - Press <u>START/STOP</u> again to stop recording. The scene will be recorded to the memory.
 - The ACCESS indicator will flash from time to time while the scene is being recorded.

When you have finished recording

- Make sure that the ACCESS indicator is off.
- 2 Close the LCD panel or press ON/OFF to turn off the camcorder.
- 3 Slide the lens cover switch up.



- To protect the lens, keep the lens cover closed when you are not recording.
- Be sure to save your recordings regularly (
 149), especially after making important recordings. Canon shall not be liable for any loss or corruption of data.











- If II > [Auto Power Off] is set to [ON], the camcorder will shut off automatically to save power when it is powered by a battery pack and is left without any operation for 3 minutes. Should this happen, turn the camcorder back on.
- When recording in bright places, it may be difficult to use the LCD screen. In such cases, you can adjust the LCD backlight with the II → □ → [LCD Backlight] setting or adjust the brightness of the LCD screen with the II → □ → [LCD Brightness] setting.
- If you plan on making a long recording while the camcorder is in a fixed position, such as mounted on a tripod, you can record with the LCD panel closed in order to conserve the battery's power. To use this function, set !! >> >> >> (Power On Using LCD Panel) to [Off].

Taking Photos

You can easily take photos with the camcorder. You can even take photos simultaneously while recording movies.
















- Open the LCD panel to turn on the camcorder.
 - You can also press ON/OFF).
 - HFR68/R67/R66 By default, photos are recorded in the built-in memory. You can select the memory that will be used to record photos (\$\sum\$ 80).
 - By default, the camcorder's shooting mode is set to (III) 57). You can select a different shooting mode according to the shooting conditions (III) 82).
- 2 Slide the lens cover switch down.
- 3 Touch [PHOTO] to take a photo.
 - A green icon (○) and □ ► □ (#FR68/R67/R66 only) or □ ►
 will appear momentarily on the screen and the ACCESS indicator will flash as the photo is recorded. However, if you record a photo while recording a movie, will not appear.









When you have finished taking photos

Turn off the camcorder and close the lens cover (\square 54).



The information in the \P (important precautions) and \P (additional notes) sections in the previous pages (\square 54 - 55) apply also to photo shooting.



- For details about the approximate number of photos that can be recorded on a memory card, refer to Reference Tables (\$\sum_{289}\$).
- Photos cannot be recorded while fading in or fading out a scene.

AUTO Mode

When the shooting mode is set to (AUTO), the following automatic functions will be activated so you can enjoy shooting video and photos letting the camcorder take care of choosing the optimal settings.

- Smart AUTO (\$\sum 58\$): The camcorder will automatically detect the scene and subject and apply the most appropriate settings.
- Intelligent IS (\(\superscript{\subscript{\sinctript{\subscript{\sinte\sinttint{\sinttinit{\sintinity}\sintinity}\sintinity}\sinti
- Face detection (
 102): The camcorder will keep the subject in focus and correctly exposed and track it as it moves.
- Automatic tele macro (114): Just bring the camcorder close to a small subject at full telephoto and you will be able to focus a subject as close as 50 cm.











Smart AUTO

In AUTO mode, the camcorder will automatically detect certain characteristics of the subject, background, lighting conditions, etc. It will then adjust various settings (focus, exposure, color, image stabilization, image quality, among others), selecting the best settings for the scene you want to shoot. The icon in the shooting mode button will automatically change to one of the following Smart AUTO icons.



- There are times when the Smart AUTO function cannot detect the scene, for example when you touch a subject on the screen (tracking). In such case, (AUTO) will be displayed as the Smart AUTO icon.

Intelligent IS

Intelligent IS allows the camcorder to select the best image stabilization option based on your shooting method. When the shooting mode is set to (1) or (2), the Intelligent IS icon will change to one of the following icons. In other shooting modes, you can set the image stabilization manually (1) 214).










Zooming



Move the zoom lever toward ${\bf W}$ (wide angle) to zoom out. Move it toward ${\bf T}$ (telephoto) to zoom in.



 Keep at least 1 m away from the subject. At full wide angle, you can focus on a subject as close as 1 cm. Using tele macro (114), you can focus on a subject as close as 50 cm at full telephoto.









- When IT > [Zoom Speed] is set to [WAR Variable], the zoom speed will be faster in recording standby mode than when actually recording, except when pre-recording (229) is activated.
- With the !! > [Zoom Position at Startup] setting, you can tell the camcorder to memorize the zoom position when you turn it off, so the zoom position will be the same the next time you turn on the camcorder.
- The optional WD-H43 Wide-converter and FS-43U II Filter Set cannot be attached to this camcorder.

Framing Assistance

Sometimes, while zooming in on a very far subject (large zoom ratio), you might momentarily "lose" the subject as it moves out of the frame. In this case, you can use the framing assistance function to temporarily zoom out a little and make it easier to find the subject.

- 1 Press and hold [⋈] to zoom out momentarily.
 - The original zoom position is indicated by a white frame.
- 2 Reframe the shot so the desired subject is within the white frame.
 - You can use the zoom lever to change the size of the frame.
- 3 When the desired subject is correctly framed, release [⋈].
 - The camcorder will zoom in on the area indicated by the white frame.











You can attach the supplied WA-H43 Wide Attachment to the camcorder to reduce the focal length and achieve a wider angle of view. When using the wide attachment, perform the following procedure to optimize the camcorder's settings.



- Place the wide attachment on the lens making sure the alignment index is facing up.
- While lightly pressing on the wide attachment, turn it clockwise.







Locking files

The [Edit] button will change to [♠] and will be grayed out.











- You can use the IT >> Image: Display Date/Time] setting to choose whether to display the recording date (MP4 scenes) or date and time (AVCHD scenes) when you play back scenes.
- In the index screen for MP4 scenes you can touch [i] and then touch a scene to display details about the scene, such as the scene's video quality, length and recording date and time. Touch [★] twice to return to the index screen.
- Video snapshot scenes recorded in MP4 format can be played back only from the [] index screen.
- Depending on the recording conditions, you may notice brief stops in video or sound playback between scenes.
- Sound will not be output from the built-in speaker while headphones or the supplied High Speed HDMI cable is connected to the camcorder.
- You may not be able to play back with this camcorder movies recorded on or copied onto a memory card using another device.
- About fast/slow playback:
 - You may notice some anomalies (blocky video artifacts, banding, etc.) in the playback picture. Also, sound will not be output.
 - The speed indicated on the screen is approximate.
 - Slow reverse playback will look the same as continuous frame reverse.














- To delete all recordings and make all recordable space available again you may prefer to initialize the memory (40).











Advanced Recording Functions

Recording Settings and Shooting Modes

This section explains how to change the camcorder's recording settings (movie format, video quality, etc.) and how to use the various shooting modes to obtain great looking recordings.

Convenient Functions

This section introduces some of the camcorder's functions that you may find convenient in special situations. For example, slow & fast motion recording to create unique time-lapse scenes, fun decorations and faders for your scenes, and more.

When You Want More Control

This section explains functions you can use when you want more control over how your recordings look. It is more oriented for advanced users and covers functions such as white balance, exposure compensation and frame rate.

Recording Audio
This section explains various functions related to recording audio, such as audio scene selection, and using headphones.

Selecting the Movie Recording Format (AVCHD/MP4)

You can choose to record movies in AVCHD or MP4 format. AVCHD movies offer fantastic picture quality during playback. They can also be easily copied to external devices, such as a Blu-Ray Disc recorder. MP4 movies are versatile and can be easily played back on smartphones or uploaded to the Web.



Selecting the Video Quality

The camcorder offers several video quality options (bit rates) for recording movies. For AVCHD movies, select 50P or MXP for higher quality or LP for longer recording times. Similarly, for MP4 movies, select 35 Mbps or 24 Mbps for higher quality or 4 Mbps for longer recording times.

To view information on the video quality

- 1 Touch [i].
 - A screen with the resolution, bit rate and frame rate will appear.
- 2 Touch [♠].



- For details on approximate recording times, refer to the Reference Tables (288).
- If you select 50P or 35 Mbps, movies will be recorded at 50 frames per second, progressive.
- Bit rate (measured in Mbps) indicates how much video data is recorded in 1 second.
- Depending on the device used, you may not be able to play back your recordings on other devices.
- Movies recorded in 50P or MXP mode cannot be saved on AVCHD discs. You can copy such movies from the memory card onto Blu-ray discs using a Blu-ray Disc recorder that has an SD card slot and is compatible with AVCHD ver. 2.0.
- The camcorder uses a variable bit rate (VBR) to encode video so the actual recording times will vary depending on the content of the scenes.









- The following types of MP4 scenes will be recognized as multiple files on other devices.
 - Scenes exceeding 4 GB.
 - Scenes recorded at 35 Mbps exceeding 30 minutes.
 - Scenes recorded at a video quality other than 35 Mbps exceeding 1 hour.
- Depending on the TV, you may not be able to play back movies recorded in 50P or at 35 Mbps.
- When the shooting mode is set to , recording in 50P or 35 Mbps is not available. When the shooting mode is set to , recording in 50P is not available.

(HFR68/R67/R66) Selecting the Memory (Built-in Memory/Memory Card) for Recordings

You can select to record your movies and photos in the built-in memory or on a memory card. The default memory for recording both is the built-in memory.











(HFR68/R67/R66) Dual Recording and Relay Recording

When you record movies, you can use dual recording to simultaneously record one more scene (in MP4 format, at 4 Mbps video quality) in addition to the main scene being recorded. This additional MP4 scene is saved on the memory not currently selected for recording. Because the resulting scene is in MP4 format, it is ideal for transferring to another device or uploading to the Web.

Alternatively, you can activate relay recording so if the assigned memory becomes full while recording movies, recording will continue automatically on the other memory.



Only relay recording.

Activate the desired function





- Dual recording is not available in the following cases.
- When the video quality is set to 50P or 35 Mbps.
- During slow & fast motion recording.









Selecting the Shooting Mode

In addition to **AUTO** mode, the camcorder features a number of shooting modes that offer the most appropriate settings for a variety of special scenes. You can also use the **P** shooting mode when you want the camcorder to set the exposure automatically but control manually some advanced settings.





- 1 Touch the shooting mode button on the top left corner of the screen.
 - The button will show the icon of the shooting mode currently selected. If the camcorder is set to (MID) mode, the button will show one of the Smart AUTO icons (MID) 59).
 - Alternatively, you can open the shooting mode selection screen from the (Home) menu: (Shooting Mode).









- 2 Drag your finger up/down to bring the desired shooting mode to the center and then touch [OK].
 - If you selected [☐] Cinema] or [SCN Scene], continue the procedure to select the cinema-look filter (☐ 85) or Special Scene mode (☐ 86).

Options (Default value)

[Baby]

[AUTO Auto]

Let the camcorder take care of most of the settings while you concentrate on recording. Great for beginners or if you just prefer not to bother with detailed camcorder settings.

[Cinema]

Give your recordings a cinematic look and use cinema-look filters to create unique movies (\bigcirc 85).

[SCN Scene]

From nightscapes to beaches, have the camcorder select the best settings that match the situation you are in $(\square 86)$.

[**P** Programmed AE]

Enjoy full access to menus, settings and advanced functions (\$\subseteq\$ 89).









Baby Mode

With the optimized settings in a mode, baby's skin will appear with vibrant clarity. In addition, you can add a stamp to the video to show how much time has passed since baby was born.



 Even if the video format was set to MP4, when you change the shooting mode to ②, the video format is automatically set to AVCHD.

Touch the shooting mode button (◯ 82) (◯ Baby) (◯ [OK]



- When the shooting mode is set to ③, pre-recording (□ 229) will be activated and cannot be turned off. That way, you will not miss memorable moments.
- You can play back recordings made in ⊕ mode from the [⊕] or [♣] index screen. The Baby album ([⊕] index screen) is particularly convenient because it contains, in chronological order, only the scenes recorded in ⊕ mode.
- When the shooting mode is set to ②, dual recording and recording in 50P are not available.
- When the shooting mode is set to ⊕, most advanced settings will not be available but you can use the decoration function (☐ 93).









Cinema Mode and Cinema-Look Filters

In Implication mode, the camcorder will adjust the frame rate and several other picture-related settings to give your recordings a cinematic look. In this mode you can also use a variety of professional cinema-look filters to create unique movies with a distinctive appearance.

HFR68/R67/R66 You can also add cinema-look filters when you convert movies to MP4 (\square 136).



 The selected cinema-look filter will be applied and its number will appear on the control button.

To change the cinema-look filter

- 1 Touch the [FILTER] button (showing the currently selected cinema-look filter).
- Select the desired cinema-look filter and then touch [OK].









Options (Default value)

The camcorder offers 7 cinema-look filters. Select the desired filter while previewing the effect on the screen.



- [Portrait]/[Sports]/[Snow]/[Beach]: The picture may not appear smooth during playback.
- [Portrait]: The blur effect of the background increases the more you zoom in (T).
- [* Snow]/[* Beach]: The subject may become overexposed on cloudy days or in shaded places. Check the image on the screen.









- [Low Light]:
 - Moving subjects may leave a trailing afterimage.
 - Picture quality may not be as good as in other modes.
 - White points may appear on the screen.
 - Autofocus may not work as well as in other modes. In such case, adjust the focus manually.
- [* Fireworks]: To avoid camcorder blur (blur due to the camcorder moving) we recommend using a tripod.

Programmed AE Mode: Adjusting Settings to Match Your Needs

Give yourself the most control while shooting by using Programmed AE (AE: auto exposure) shooting mode. As with other shooting modes, the camcorder automatically adjusts the shutter speed and aperture. However, this mode offers you the most versatility by allowing you to adjust other settings to achieve the results you are looking for.



Touch the shooting mode button (☐ 82) **>** [**P** Programmed AE] **>** [OK]









Slow & Fast Motion Recording

When the movie format is set to MP4, you can use slow motion to capture scenes with lots of movement at half the normal speed, or fast motion to compress the passage of time into unique time-lapse scenes. With slow & fast motion recording, you can choose one of 8 speed options between 1/2x and 1200x the normal speed to record movies with a unique look. Additionally, for some fast motion settings you can choose to record a single frame or a short bit of video (about 0.5 seconds) at every interval.

Sound is not recorded during slow & fast motion recording.



- 1 Make sure the camcorder has sufficient power to complete the operation.
 - Insert a fully charged battery pack or use the supplied compact power adapter.
- 2 Select the recording speed.



* When you select a speed between [x10] and [x1200], you can select the desired recording time with the following procedure before touching [X].









- 🖶 and the selected recording speed will appear on the screen.
- To turn off the slow & fast motion recording mode, repeat the procedure selecting [Off] instead.
- **3** Press START/STOP to start recording.
 - While recording, a scene counter will appear and its dividers (:) will flash. Note that the higher the recording speed used, the more slowly the scene counter will advance.
- Press START/STOP again to stop recording the time-lapse or slow motion scene.

To set the recording time

Recording one frame at each interval results in a smoother time-lapse video. Recording about 0.5 seconds of video at each interval may be better for recording fast-moving subjects.

Decoration: Adding a Personal Touch

Add a new level of enjoyment to your scenes by decorating them. You can add animated graphics, stamps and even your own freehand drawings easily just by simply using your fingertip.




(HFR68/R67/R66) You can also add decorations when you convert movies to MP4 (11) 136).

Decorating Scenes while Recording



- 1 Touch [𝒜►] on the bottom right corner of the screen to open the decoration screen.
- 2 Use a tool from the toolbar as explained in the following procedures.
- **3** Press START/STOP to record movies with your decorations.
 - You can add decorations even while recording a scene.
- **4** Touch [★] to exit the decoration screen.












 Decoration is not available when dual recording is activated (HFR68/R67/R66) only) or the video quality is set to 50P or 35 Mbps.



- 1 Canvas The area where you will draw and see your decorations in action.
- 2 Toolbar.
- 3 [♠ Pens and Stamps] Select the type of pen or stamp and its color.
- 4 [Animated Stamps] Select animated stamps to add to your decoration.
- 5 [② Date/Time] or [③] (in ⑤ mode) Add the date and/or time as a caption that will be included in the recording. In ⑤ mode, add stamps to track baby's age, height and weight.
- 6 [[(Image Mix) Choose one of 26 different frames to add onto the canvas.









- 7 [II] In recording mode: Pause the live video. Touch [►II◄] again to restore the live video. You can add decorations to the frozen image and even record it.
 - In playback mode: Pause the playback. Touch $[\blacktriangleright]$ to resume playing back the scene.
- 8 [] Minimize the toolbar to the top of the screen to view almost all of the canvas. Touch [1] to restore the toolbar.

To Use [Pens and Stamps]

- **1** Touch [♠].
 - The [Pens and Stamps] screen will appear.
- 2 Touch the desired pen or stamp from the 6 icons on the left and then touch [OK].
 - The main decoration screen will appear again.
- 3 Draw freely on the canvas with your fingertip.
 - To select a different pen or stamp: Repeat steps 1 and 2.
 - To change color: Touch [♠] Ŋ [ፆ] Ŋ select a color from the color palette Ŋ [OK].
 - To clear your freehand drawings and stamps: Touch [♠] Ŋ
 [Clear] Ŋ [Yes] Ŋ [OK].
 - To save your freehand drawings and stamps on the memory:
 Touch [♠] Ŋ [♠] Save]* or [໑ Save]* Ŋ [Yes] Ŋ [OK].
 - To load a previously saved canvas (freehand drawings and stamps only) from the memory: Touch [♠] ♠ [♠] Load]** or [⑤ Load]** ♠ [Yes] ♠ [OK].









- A canvas can only be saved or loaded in recording standby mode or during playback pause.
- * HFR68/R67/R66 The canvas file will be saved in the built-in memory. HFR606 The canvas file will be saved on the memory card.
- ** The camcorder will apply the freehand drawings and stamps that were most recently saved in the built-in memory (HFR68/R67/R66 only) or on the memory card (HFR606 only).



 Initializing a memory will erase any [Pens and Stamps] canvas files and image files you may have saved. (HFR68/R67/R66 The image mix frames that come pre-installed in the built-in memory will be restored after it is initialized.)

To Use [Animated Stamps]

- 1 Touch [★...].
 - The [Animated Stamps] screen will appear.
- 2 Touch one of the buttons and then touch [OK].
- 3 Touch anywhere on the canvas to place the selected animated stamp.
 - You can also drag some animated stamps to a different location.









■ To use [Date/Time]



- * Except when playing back from the [\bigcirc] index screen (Baby album).
- 1 Touch [**⊘**].
 - The [Date/Time] screen will appear.
- 2 Touch [Date] or [Time].
 - To remove a selected stamp, touch it again.
- 3 Touch [OK].
 - The selected stamp(s) will appear.
- 4 You can touch any stamp and drag it to the desired location.

■ To use stamps from the [②] menu

When the shooting mode is set to ③ in recording mode, or during play-back from the Baby album, you can add stamps to the video to track baby's height, weight and age. You can track the information of up to 3 babies.



* Only when playing back from the $[\cite{\odot}]$ index screen (Baby album).









- 1 Touch [♀].
- **2** Touch $[\ \textcircled{9} \ 1]$, $[\ \textcircled{9} \ 2]$ or $[\ \textcircled{9} \ 3]$ to select the desired baby.
 - The design of the stamps is slightly different for each baby.
- 3 Register baby's information as necessary.
 - To register baby's birth date: Touch [►] next to the baby's age button. Touch the year*/month/day, touch [▲]/[▼] to change it, and then touch [OK]. Baby's current age will be calculated and displayed inside the age button.
 - To register baby's height or weight: Touch [♠] next to the button
 of the information you want to change. Touch [♠]/[▼] to set the
 height/weight, and then touch [OK].
 - *The year of birth can only be set to 2013 and later.
- Touch any of the buttons to add the corresponding stamp: [Date] (the current date), [Time] (the current time), baby's age, height or weight.
 - To remove a selected stamp, touch it again.
- 5 Touch [OK].
 - The selected stamp(s) will appear.
- You can touch any stamp and drag it to the desired location.













- For the age stamp, the display will change as follows:
 - Before 1 week: days
 - 1 week less than 1 month old: weeks
 - 1 month less than 1 year old: months
 - 1 year less than 2 years old: years and months
 - 2 years old and older: only years

To use image mix

Image mix frames can be combined with the live video for fun special effects. You can use the image mix function along with additional [Pens and Stamps] or [Animated Stamps] decorations.

The image mix frames are stored in the built-in memory (IFR68/R67/R66 only). To use the image mix function while recording on a memory card, you will need to download the image mix files in advance and use, for example, a card reader to copy them to the memory card (1291).



- **HFR68/R67/R66** Before performing this procedure, make sure that the memory selected for recording (\square 80) or playback (\square 67) contains the image mix frames.
- 1 Touch [22] to open the [Select Image] screen.
- 2 Touch [+] or [-] to select a different image mix frame.









- You can select from 26 image mix frames (or 20 especially designed image mix frames, in @ mode).
- HFR68/R67/R66 Only when recording on or playing back scenes from a memory card: You can also touch [] to read image mix frames saved in the built-in memory.
- 3 Touch [OK] to mix the selected frame with the live video.



 The image mix frame cannot be selected while recording or during playback.

Decorating Scenes during Playback

You can decorate scenes while playing them back. Decorations added during playback are not recorded with the scene. You can also load and apply a canvas with previously saved decorations.



- 1 Play back the scene you want to decorate (65).
- 2 Touch the screen to display the playback controls.
- 3 Touch [𝔻೩] to display the decoration toolbar.
- 4 Decorate the scene using the tools from the toolbar as explained in the previous sections.










5 Touch [X] to exit the decoration screen.

Video Snapshot

You can record a series of short scenes, each a few seconds long. When you play the video snapshot scenes one after the other, this will result in fast-paced, dynamic video. You can even play back the video snapshot scenes set to background music (123).



Activate video snapshot.



- Touch [OFF] instead to deactivate video snapshot.
- A blue border appears on the screen.
- 2 Press (START/STOP).
 - The camcorder records for about 4 seconds (the blue frame serves as a visual progress bar) and then automatically returns to record standby mode.
- You can change the length of the video snapshot scenes recorded with the **IT** (Video Snapshot Length) setting.









- Any of the following actions will deactivate the video snapshot function.
 - Turning off the camcorder, pressing , changing the shooting mode, etc.
 - Changing the movie format (AVCHD/MP4), video quality or frame rate.
 - Activating the slow & fast recording mode.

Face Detection and Tracking

The camcorder automatically detects people's faces and keeps the subject in focus and correctly exposed. To focus on a person other than the one the camcorder selected, touch the desired face on the screen (tracking). You can also use tracking to always keep in focus other moving subjects, such as pets or moving vehicles.



* Face detection is always activated in AUTO and 🔮 mode.

By default, face detection is activated so you can skip step 1 in the following procedure. If the function was turned off, perform the following procedure starting from step 1.

Activate face detection.











- To turn off face detection, repeat the procedure selecting
 [OFF Off] instead.
- Point the camcorder at a person.
 - If there is more than one person in the picture, the camcorder will automatically select one person it determines is the main subject.
 The main subject is indicated by a white frame and the camcorder will optimize the settings for that person. Other faces will have gray frames.



Main subject

- 3 Touch a different face on the touch screen to optimize the exposure for another person.
 - You can also touch other moving subjects, such as a pet.
 - A white double frame will appear around the selected subject and track it as it moves.
 - Touch [FF] to remove the tracking frame.











- The camcorder may mistakenly detect the faces of nonhuman subjects. In such case, turn face detection off.
- When face detection is activated, the slowest shutter speed used by the camcorder is 1/25.
- Touching somewhere with a color or pattern unique to the subject will make it easier to track. However, if there is another subject in the vicinity that shares similar characteristics to the selected subject, the camcorder may start tracking the incorrect subject. Touch the screen again to select the desired subject.
- In certain cases, faces may not be detected correctly. Typical examples include:
 - Faces extremely small, large, dark or bright in relation to the overall picture.
 - Faces turned to the side, at a diagonal, upside-down, or partially hidden.
- Face detection is not available in the following cases.
 - When the shooting mode is set to **SCN** and the Special Scene mode is set to [Night Scene], [Low Light] or [Fireworks].
 - During slow & fast recording mode.
 - When the shutter speed used is slower than 1/25.
 - When the digital zoom is activated and the zoom ratio is larger than 228x.
 - HFR68/R67/R66 While the camcorder is controlled remotely from an iOS/Android device.









- In certain cases, tracking may not be able to track the subject. Typical examples include:
 - Subjects extremely small or large in relation to the overall picture.
 - Subjects too similar to the background.
 - Subjects lacking sufficient contrast.
 - Fast moving subjects.
 - When shooting indoors with insufficient lighting.

Faders

The camcorder offers two professional looking transition effects to fadein or fade-out scenes.



- * You can preview the transition effect on the screen.
- The icon of the selected fader appears.
- To turn off faders, repeat the procedure selecting [OFF Off] instead.
- You can also change the fader settings while recording (for example, to apply only a fade out).









To fade in/out

Press START/STOP in record standby mode to start recording with a fade in. Press START/STOP while recording to fade out and stop recording.



- When you apply a fader, not only the picture but also the sound will fade in or out.
- Faders cannot be used in the following cases:
 - When the shooting mode is set to is and the cinema-look filter is set to [Old Movies].
 - During slow & fast recording mode.
 - When recording scenes with decorations.
 - When recording video snapshot scenes.
 - While pre-recording is activated.
 - When the video quality is set to 50P or 35 Mbps.
- Turning off the camcorder will deactivate the selected fader.









When You Want More Control


Exposure

When you want to record a subject that is much brighter or darker than its surroundings, the automatic exposure obtained by the camcorder may not be best for that specific subject.

To correct this, you can compensate the exposure to make the whole picture brighter or darker, you can use Touch AE to tell the camcorder to optimize the exposure for a selected subject, or you can use a combination of both.



Open the exposure adjustment screen.



Exposure Compensation

- 1 Touch [M].
 - The exposure is locked and the exposure compensation dial appears with the compensation value set at ±0.
 - \bullet Touch $[\boldsymbol{M}]$ again to return the camcorder to automatic exposure.
- 2 Touch [◄] or [►], or drag your finger along the dial to compensate the exposure.









When You Want More Control

- The compensation range may vary depending on the initial brightness of the image, and some values may be grayed out.
- 3 Touch [X] to apply and lock the exposure compensation value.
 - During exposure lock, and the exposure compensation value will appear on the screen.

Touch AE

- 1 Touch a subject that appears inside the **½** frame.
 - The Touch AE mark (★) will flash and the exposure will be optimized automatically for the subject you selected.
 - Touch [M] to return the camcorder to automatic exposure.
- 2 Touch [X] to apply the adjusted exposure.
 - Using Touch AE also locks the exposure (the exposure compensation dial appears with the compensation value set at ±0).
 Before touching [X], you can compensate the exposure further (steps 2 and 3 in the previous procedure).
 - During exposure lock, and the exposure compensation value will appear on the screen.



- If the shooting mode is changed during exposure compensation, the camcorder will return to automatic exposure.
- By default, the camcorder corrects for backlight conditions.
 You can turn off the automatic correction with the IT
 [Auto Backlight Correction] setting.









 Exposure adjustment is not available when the shooting mode is set to SCN and the Special Scene mode is set to [* Fireworks].


Focus

Autofocus may not work well on the following subjects. In such case, focus manually.

- Reflective surfaces
- Subjects with low contrast or without vertical lines
- Fast moving subjects
- Through wet windows
- Night scenes



- 1 Adjust the zoom before adjusting the focus.
- 2 Open the manual focus screen.



- Manual Focus
- 1 Touch [MF].
 - \bullet Touch $[\mbox{\bf MF}]$ again to return the camcorder to autofocus.
- 2 Touch and hold [▲] or [♣] to adjust the focus.










When You Want More Control

- The focusing distance displayed will change as you adjust the focus. The focusing distance will be displayed for about 2 seconds. You can change the units used for the distance display with the T > [Displayed Units] setting.
- When IT >> [Focus Assistance] is set to [ON On], the center of the screen will be magnified to help you focus more easily.
- If you wish to focus on faraway subjects such as mountains or fireworks, touch and hold [▲] until the focusing distance changes to ♥.
- 3 Touch [X] to lock the focus at the selected distance.
 - During manual focus, [MF] will appear on the screen.

Touch AF

- 1 Touch a subject that appears inside the **()** frame.
 - The Touch AF mark () will flash and the camcorder will focus automatically on the subject or spot you touched on the screen.
 - Touch [MF] again to return the camcorder to autofocus.
 - If necessary, you can further adjust the focus manually (step 2 in the previous procedure).
- Touch [X] to lock the focus at the selected distance.
 - During manual focus, [MF] will appear on the screen.











White Balance

The white balance function helps you to accurately reproduce colors under different lighting conditions so that white objects will always look truly white in your recordings.



- * When you select [Custom WB], set the custom white balance with the following procedure before touching [X].
- The icon of the selected white balance setting will appear on the screen.

To set the custom white balance

- Point the camcorder at a white object, so it fills the screen.
- 2 Touch [Set WB].
 - When the adjustment is completed, stops flashing and disappears. The camcorder will retain the custom white balance even if you turn it off.









Options (Default value)

[AWB Automatic]◆

The camcorder automatically sets the white balance for natural looking colors.

To record outdoors.

To record under tungsten and tungsten-type 3-wavelength fluorescent lighting.

[▲ Custom WB]

Use the custom white balance setting to make white subjects appear white under colored lighting.



- When you select the custom white balance:
 - Set 🦃 🔊 [Zoom Type] to [32x Optical].
 - Reset the white balance when you change locations or the lighting or other conditions change.
 - Depending on the light source, ♣ may keep flashing. The result will still be better than with [ANN Automatic].
- Custom white balance may provide better results in the following cases.
 - Changing lighting conditions.
 - Close-ups.
 - Subjects in a single color (sky, sea or forest).
 - Under mercury lamps, certain types of fluorescent lights and LED lights.









Frame Rate

You can change the frame rate (the number of frames recorded per second) of AVCHD movies to change the look of your movies. MP4 movies with a video quality setting of 35 Mbps are recorded at 50P while those with other video quality settings are recorded at 25P and these frame rates cannot be changed.



Options (Default value)

[50i]^{\$}

50 fields per second, interlaced. Standard frame rate of analog PAL TV signals.

PF25

Shooting at 25 frames per second, progressive*. Using this frame rate will give your recordings a cinematic look. Recording in mode will further enhance the effect.

* Recorded as 50i.



 When the video quality is set to [50P Recording] (50P or 35 Mbps), the frame rate is automatically set to 50P and cannot be changed.









Tele Macro

Using tele macro, the camcorder can focus at a shorter distance (up to 50 cm from the subject at full telephoto), allowing you to get closer shots of small subjects like flowers and insects. This function also adds a soft focus to the background, so the subject not only looks larger but it also stands out more.



* When the shooting mode is set to (UTO), tele macro will be activated automatically when you zoom in to full telephoto and bring the camcorder up close to the subject.



- To turn off telemacro, touch [🚮] again.
- The camcorder will automatically adjust the zoom to the telephoto end.



- Any of the following actions will deactivate the tele macro function.
 - Turning off the camcorder.
 - Pressing **•**.
 - Setting the shooting mode to (WTO), (a) or the [** Fireworks] Special Scene mode in SCN mode.
 - Zooming out toward **W** (wide angle).
- Tele macro cannot be turned on/off while recording.









Recording Audio

Audio Scenes

You can have the camcorder optimize the audio settings of the built-in microphone by selecting the audio scene that matches your surroundings. This will greatly enhance the sense of "being there".





Options (Default value)

[IND Standard]

To record most general situations. The camcorder records with standard settings.

[& Music]

To vibrantly record music performances and singing indoors.

[Speech]

Best for recording human voices and dialog.

[See Forest and Birds]

To record birds and scenes in forests. The camcorder clearly captures sound as it spreads.









Recording Audio



To record scenes while reducing noise from wind, passing vehicles and similar ambient sound. Ideal for recording at the beach or in places with a lot of noise.

Using Headphones

Use headphones for playback or to check the audio level while recording. Connect the headphones to the AV OUT/ Ω terminal. This terminal is used for both headphones and analog audio/video output so be sure to change the function of the terminal in advance.



Change the function of the terminal to headphones output.



- 2 Connect the headphones to the AV OUT/ terminal.
- 3 Adjust the volume as necessary.



After changing the function of the AV OUT/ Ω terminal and connecting the headphones, you can adjust the headphone's volume also during playback. While playing back movies, adjust the volume the same way you would adjust the speaker's volume (Ω 68), only using the headphone icons Ω , Ω , Ω) instead.









Recording Audio



- When using headphones, make sure to lower the volume to an appropriate level.



- Use commercially available headphones with a Ø 3.5 mm minijack and a cable no longer than 3 m.
- Even if [AV/Headphones] was set to [Headphones] in a
 playback mode, the function of the AV OUT/ terminal will
 return automatically to AV output when you turn off the camcorder.
- HFR68/R67/R66 Audio will not be output from the ∩ (headphones) terminal while Wi-Fi functions are in use.

This section explains how to trim or divide scenes and how to change the image used as the thumbnail of a scene in the Baby album. [HFR68/R67/R66] only: In this section you will also find the procedure for copying recordings and for converting scenes to MP4 format.

Capturing Video Snapshot Scenes and Photos from a Movie

You can capture video snapshot scenes or photos from a previously recorded scene. For example, you may want to print photos from video recorded at a party or create a small video clip using video snapshot scenes from the highlights of an event.

Capturing a Video Snapshot Scene



- 1 Play back the AVCHD scene from which you want to capture the video snapshot scene (65).
- 2 At the point where you want the video snapshot scene to start, press START/STOP.
 - The camcorder captures the video snapshot scene for about 4 seconds (the blue frame serves as a visual progress bar), and then enters playback pause mode.
 - Alternatively, you can touch the screen and then touch [] to capture the video snapshot scene.
- 3 Touch [■] to stop the playback.
 - The new video snapshot scene will be added at the end of the index screen of the same recording date as the original scene.











- You can change the length of the video snapshot scenes you capture with the !! >> [Video Snapshot Length] setting.
- A video snapshot scene can be captured only during playback; it cannot be captured during playback pause mode.
- Video snapshot scenes cannot be captured from scenes shorter than 1 second.
- When the source scene is itself a video snapshot scene, you
 may not be able to capture a video snapshot scene depending on the length of the source scene and the length currently
 selected for video snapshot scenes.
- When you start capturing a video snapshot scene less than 1 second from the end of the scene, the video snapshot scene will be captured starting from the beginning of the following scene.
- During the playback of video snapshot scenes captured from a previously recorded movie, you may notice some anomalies in the picture/sound at the point where the playback switches to a new scene.









Capturing Photos



- Play back the scene from which you want to capture a photo (☐ 65).
- 2 At the point you want to capture, pause the playback and capture the photo.

Touch the screen to display the playback controls $\$ [II] $\$ [PHOTO]

3 Touch [■] to stop the playback.



- The size of photos captured from a scene is 1920x1080 (1280x720 when capturing a photo from an MP4 scene recorded at 4 Mbps video quality).
- The recording date/time of the photos will reflect the date and time of recording of the original scene.
- Photos captured from a scene with a lot of fast movement may be blurred.
- HFR68/R67/R66 Photos will be recorded on the memory selected for recording photos.











Playback with Background Music

Canon offers for download 3 music tracks that can be used as background music when playing back your movies or a slideshow of your photos. You can also mix the original audio and the background music and adjust the mix balance to your preference.



- Only during the playback of a slideshow of photos. For that procedure refer to Photo Slideshow (
 127).
- 1 Open the desired index screen (\$\subset\$ 65).
- 2 Select the music track.





- 1 Select the desired music track.
- 2 Adjust the background music balance.
- 3 Play back the original sound (no background music).









- 4 Delete the music track selected.
- 5 Listen to the music track selected. Touch again (■) to stop the playback.
- 3 Adjust the mix balance between the original sound and the background music.
 - Touch [¹♠] (more of the original sound) or [ℷ] (more of the background music) or drag your finger along the [Music Balance] bar to adjust the background music balance as desired.
- 4 Touch [X] and then touch a scene to start the playback with the selected background music.

To delete a music track

- After downloading the music files to your computer, use Transfer Utility LE to transfer them to the memory that contains the recordings you want to play back with background music. For details, refer to the 'Transfer Utility LE Software Guide' (PDF file).
- Initializing a memory card will permanently erase any music files you may have transferred to the memory card.
 (HFR63/R67/R66) The music files that come pre-installed in the built-in memory will be restored after it is initialized.)

Selecting the Playback Starting Point

If you have a very long scene, you may want to start playing back the scene from a certain point. You can use the movie timeline (AVCHD scenes only) to break the scene to segments at fixed time intervals ranging from 6 seconds to 6 minutes.













- 1 Open the desired index screen for AVCHD movies (\square 65).
- 2 Open the scene's [Timeline] screen.



- The [Timeline] screen appears. The large thumbnail will show the first frame of the scene. Below it, the timeline ruler shows frames taken from the scene at fixed intervals.
- To return to the index screen, touch [♠] twice.
- 3 Touch the desired frame in the timeline ruler to start playing back the scene from that point.



- 1 Touch twice to return to the index screen.
- 2 Previous/next scene.
- 3 Drag your finger left along the ruler to display the next 5 frames.









- 4 Scene's video quality and length.
- 5 Recording date and time.
- 6 Drag your finger right along the ruler to display the previous 5 frames.
- 7 Current scene / Total number of scenes.
- 8 Currently selected interval between frames.

To change the interval between frames

Photo Slideshow

You can play a slideshow of all the photos and even set it to music.



- 1 Open the [♠] index screen (◯ 71).
- 2 Select the music track.











- 3 Touch the photo that will open the slideshow to display it in single photo view.
- 4 Touch the screen to display the playback controls, then touch [▶] to play back the slideshow set to the selected music track.

During the photo slideshow

- Touch the screen and touch [■] or [■]) to adjust the volume.
- Touch the screen and touch [11] to stop the slideshow.



- The music files used for background music are stored in the built-in memory (HFR68/R67/R66 only). To play back with background music a slideshow of photos recorded on a memory card, you will need to download the music files in advance (\$\sum_{291}\$).
- After downloading the music files to your computer, use Transfer Utility LE to transfer them to the memory that contains the recordings you want to play back with background music. For details, refer to the 'Transfer Utility LE Software Guide' (PDF file).
- Initializing a memory card will permanently erase any music files you may have transferred to the memory card.
 (#FR68/R67/R66 The music files that come pre-installed in the built-in memory will be restored after it is initialized.)









Dividing Scenes


You can divide AVCHD scenes in order to leave out the best parts and later cut out the rest.



- 1 Play back the desired scene (\$\sum_{\text{\scene}}\$ 65).
- 2 At the point where you want to divide the scene, open the screen for dividing scenes.

Touch the screen to display the playback controls ▶ [II] ▶ [Edit] ▶ [Divide]

- 3 Bring the scene to a precise point, if necessary.
 - Playback controls will appear on the screen (68). Use any special playback modes (fast playback, frame reverse/advance) as necessary to locate the desired point.
- 4 Divide the scene.



 The video from the division point to the end of the scene will appear as a new scene in the index screen.











- When advancing/reversing frames while dividing the scenes, the interval between frames is about 0.5 seconds.
- If the scene cannot be divided at the point where you paused the playback, advance/reverse a frame and then divide the scene.
- During the playback of a scene that was divided, you may notice some anomalies in the picture/sound at the point where the scene was cut.
- Scenes that are too short (less than 3 seconds) cannot be divided.
- Scenes cannot be divided within 1 second from the beginning or the end of the scene.

Trimming Scenes

You can trim MP4 scenes by removing everything up to a certain point or everything after a certain point. By doing so, you leave only memorable moments to keep for posterity.



- 1 Play back the scene you want to trim (\$\square\$ 65).
- 2 At the point where you want to trim the scene, open the scene trimming screen.









Touch the screen to display the playback controls ▶ [II] ▶ [Edit] ▶ [Trim]

- 3 Bring the scene to a precise point, if necessary.
 - The point at which is movie will be trimmed is indicated by the Tmarker.
 - Playback controls will appear on the screen (68). Use any special playback modes (fast playback, frame reverse/advance) as necessary to locate the desired point.
- 4 Trim the scene.

[Trim] > [Trim Before Marker] or [Trim After Marker] > [Save as New] or [Overwrite]

- You can select whether to trim the part before or after the \(\frac{1}{3} \)
 marker and whether to save the remaining part of the video as a
 new scene (keeping the original scene) or to overwrite the original
 scene.
- Touch [Stop] to interrupt the operation while it is in progress.



- You may not be able to correctly trim the following types of MP4 scenes.
 - HFR68/R67/R66 Scenes copied from the built-in memory to an SDXC memory card.
 - Scenes recorded or copied onto a memory card using another device.









 Scenes cannot be trimmed within about 0.5 seconds from the beginning or the end of the scene.

Changing the Thumbnail Image of a Scene

For scenes recorded in 9 mode, you can change the thumbnail image that will appear in the Baby album ([9] index screen).



- 1 Open the [] index screen (65).
- 2 Play back the desired scene.
- When the image you want to use as the thumbnail image of the scene appears, pause the playback and open the [Set Thumbnail] screen.

Touch the screen to display the playback controls ▶ [II] ▶ [Edit] ▶ [Set Thumbnail]

- 4 Bring the scene to a precise point if necessary.









5 Set the displayed frame as the scene's thumbnail image.

[Set] > [Yes]



- Only the thumbnail of the scene displayed in the Baby album ([©] index screen) will change.
- Dividing a scene whose thumbnail image was changed will reset the scene's thumbnail image.

(HFR68/R67/R66) Copying Recordings to a Memory Card

You can copy your recordings from the built-in memory to a memory card.



Insert the memory card to which you want to copy the recordings into the memory card slot and make sure it has sufficient available space.



HFR68/R67/R66 Converting Movies to MP4 Format

You can convert AVCHD scenes or MP4 scenes recorded in the built-in memory into MP4 scenes on the memory card. In addition to changing the movie format to the more widely used MP4 format, and depending on the original scene, you can also select a lower video quality for the converted scenes (down-conversion) to obtain smaller file sizes. This is convenient, for example, when you want to upload videos to the Web, as smaller video files will upload more quickly. Additionally, when you convert a scene, you can apply unique cinema-look filters, background music and decorations to the converted copy.



- Open the desired index screen in the built-in memory (☐ 65).
 - If you want to add background music to the converted scene, select a music track (step 2,) 123).









2 Open the screen for selecting scenes to convert.


Saving and Sharing Your Recordings

This section explains how to save your recordings to various external devices: a computer, video recorders, the optional CS100 Connect Station or an external hard drive without using a computer (IFR63/R67/R66) only).

* (HFR68/R67/R66) Note that this chapter presents only connections to other devices using cables (wired connections). To use the camcorder's convenient wireless connections, refer to Wi-Fi Functions (11) 164).

Terminals on the Camcorder

Open the LCD panel to access the terminals on the camcorder.



- 1 AV OUT/ Terminal
- 2 HDMI OUT Terminal

The HDMI OUT terminal offers a high-quality digital connection that combines audio and video in a single convenient cable. This terminal is an HDMI mini receptacle. When using a commercially available HDMI cable, make sure the HDMI cable is Type A to Type C and is no longer than 3 meters.

3 USB Terminal

This terminal is a mini-AB receptacle. You can use the supplied USB cable to connect to a computer or other digital devices with standard-A receptacles. [HFR68/R67/R66] only: You can also use the optional UA-100 USB Adapter to connect the camcorder to an external hard drive or other storage device with a standard-A cable.










Connection Diagrams

About the HDMI™ connection

The HDMI (High-Definition Multimedia Interface) connection (1) is a convenient all-digital connection using a single cable for both video and audio. When you connect the camcorder to an HDTV equipped with an HDMI terminal, you can enjoy video and audio playback at the highest quality. The camcorder adjusts the output resolution based on the capability of the HDTV.









Terminals on the Camcorder



The HDMI OUT terminal on the camcorder is for output only.
 Do not connect it to an HDMI output terminal on an external device, as this may damage the camcorder.



- While a cable is connected to the HDMI OUT terminal, there will be no video output from the AV OUT/

 ∩ terminal.
- Correct operation cannot be guaranteed when connecting the camcorder to DVI monitors.
- Depending on the HDTV, correct playback of personal video content may not be possible using connection 1. Try using connection 2.















Connect the camcorder to a computer to save your recordings or to the optional CS100 Connect Station to automatically back up your recordings. HFR68/R67/R66 only: You can also connect to an external hard drive to save a perfect copy of an entire memory.











Playback on a TV Screen

Connect the camcorder to a TV to enjoy your recordings with family and friends.



- 1 Turn off the camcorder and the TV.
- 2 Connect the camcorder to the TV.
 - Refer to Connection Diagrams (

 143) and select the most appropriate connection for the TV used.
- 3 Turn on the connected TV.
 - On the TV, select as the video input the same terminal to which you connected the camcorder. Refer to the instruction manual of the connected TV.
- 4 Turn on the camcorder and set it to playback mode.
- 5 Open the desired index screen (\$\sum_65\$, 71).
 - Play back the desired movies or photos.



- If remaining battery time is an issue, you can power the camcorder using the compact power adapter so the battery pack will not be consumed.
- Sound from the built-in speaker will be muted while a cable is connected to the HDMI OUT terminal or AV OUT/\(\hat{\Omega}\) terminal.









Playback on a TV Screen

- HFR68/R67/R66 Audio and video will not be output from the HDMI OUT terminal or AV OUT/
 ∩ terminal while using Wi-Fi functions.
- Connection 2-1) or 2-2: When you play back your 16:9 movies on standard TV sets with a 4:3 aspect ratio, the TV set will switch automatically to widescreen mode if it is compatible with the WSS system. Otherwise, change the aspect ratio of the TV manually.
- AVCHD-compatible HDTVs and digital recorders with a compatible memory card slot can play back AVCHD movies you record with this camcorder directly from the memory card.
 Refer to the instruction manual of the device used. Depending on the device used, correct playback may not be possible even if the device is AVCHD-compatible. In such case, play back the recordings on the memory card using the camcorder.










Save your recordings regularly. You have several options for saving your recordings. As each method offers different advantages, select how you want to save your recordings depending on how you intend to use them.

- HFR63/R67/R66 To save recordings from the built-in memory, copy them to the memory card in advance (133).
- The editing/playback functions that can be used after saving your recordings depend on the specifications of the computer and the software installed.
- The editing/playback functions that can be used depend on the specifications of the recorder used. Also, you may not be able to save MP4 movies.

Saving Recordings on a Computer

This section explains how to save your recordings on a computer using a USB connection. Use the software Transfer Utility LE¹ for AVCHD movies and the software CameraWindow² for MP4 movies and photos.

- Software for AVCHD movies, available as a free download from PIXELA's Web site.
- ² Software for photos and MP4 movies, available as a free download from your local Canon Web site.

Saving AVCHD Movies (Windows/Mac OS)

With the software Transfer Utility LE, you can save to your computer the AVCHD scenes you have recorded. Download the software and install it before you connect the camcorder to the computer for the first time. An Internet connection is required to download the software. Perform the following procedures while referring to the supplied 'Transfer Utility LE Startup Guide'.



 Before installing the software, make sure your computer is connected to the Internet.









Installation

Saving MP4 Movies and Photos (Windows/Mac OS)

With the software CameraWindow you can save MP4 movies and photos to your computer and easily organize them. For the latest information on compatibility and system requirements, please visit your local Canon Web site.

Installation

Install the software before you connect the camcorder to the computer for the first time. Make sure to install the software even if you have a different version of CameraWindow on your computer. The auto-update function of the software may make available to you features optimized for this camcorder.



 Before installing the software, make sure your computer is connected to the Internet.

- When the connection is correctly established, [USB Connection] will appear on the screen.

 - Windows: If the AutoPlay dialog box appears instead, click Downloads Images From Canon Camera to start the CameraWindow program.
 - Mac OS: If a device selection window appears, select your camcorder's model name from the list and click OK.
- 5 Computer: In the CameraWindow's main screen, click Import Images from Camera > Import Untransferred Images.
 - MP4 movies and photos you have not yet transferred to the computer will be saved.
 - Click Cancel to interrupt the transfer while it is in progress.
 - When the transfer is completed, click **OK** and close CameraWindow.



- When the camcorder is connected to a computer:
 - Do not open the memory card slot cover.
 - Do not change or delete any of the camcorder's folders or files directly from the computer as this may result in permanent data loss. When saving recordings on a computer, we recommend using the software described in this section (Transfer Utility LE for AVCHD movies; CameraWindow for MP4 movies and photos).
 - Do not set the computer in Sleep or Hibernate mode (Windows) and do not activate the Sleep function (Mac OS).









 If you wish to use the recordings on your computer, make copies of them first. Use the copied files, retaining the originals.



- To uninstall CameraWindow:
 - Windows: In the Control Panel, open Programs and Features or Add or Remove Programs. Select Canon Utilities CameraWindow DC 8, click Uninstall or Uninstall/ Change and then click OK.
 - Mac OS: Drag and drop the following folder to the **Trash**. /Applications/Canon Utilities/CameraWindow
- The following types of MP4 scenes will be recognized as multiple files on a computer.
 - Scenes exceeding 4 GB.
 - Scenes recorded at 35 Mbps exceeding 30 minutes.
 - Scenes recorded at a video quality other than 35 Mbps exceeding 1 hour.
- Depending on the computer, the software may not work correctly or you may not be able to play back movies.
- When the camcorder is powered only using the battery pack, the battery's charge on the camcorder's details area of the CameraWindow screen (Battery Capacity) will always appear as Full, regardless of the actual remaining battery charge.









Saving Recordings on the Optional CS100 Connect Station (USB)

You can easily save all the movies and photos you recorded onto the optional CS100 Connect Station. You can organize your recordings in albums, play them back on a connected HDTV or share them on the Web. For details, refer to the instruction manual of the CS100.

This section explains how to connect the camcorder to the CS100 using the supplied USB cable. HFR68/R67/R66 only: You can also use the convenient NFC/Wi-Fi connection method (\imp 186).



- Power the camcorder using the compact power adapter.
- 2 Press to set the camcorder to playback mode and open any index screen.
- 3 Select the USB connection type.



- 4 Connect the camcorder to the connect station using the supplied USB cable.
 - Connection 3-1. Refer to Connection Diagrams (1146).
 - If a device selection screen appears, select [Connect Station].









- When the connection is correctly established, the transfer of files will start automatically.
- You can check on the connect station when all the files have been saved. Refer to the instruction manual of the CS100.
- 5 Disconnect the USB cable.
 - The index screen will appear again on the camcorder's screen.

(HFR68/R67/R66) Memory Save: Saving an Entire Memory onto an External Hard Drive

You can easily save all the movies and photos you recorded onto a commercially available external hard drive connected directly to the camcorder. You can also use the camcorder to play back your recordings directly from the hard drive.

Initialize the hard drive (\square 161) when you use it with this camcorder for the first time.



Saving a Memory onto an External Hard Drive

- 1 Power the camcorder using the compact power adapter.
- Press to set the camcorder to playback mode and open any index screen.
- 3 Connect the camcorder to the external hard drive.

- If the USB cable supplied with the external hard drive has a standard-A connector, you will need to use the optional UA-100 USB Adapter.
- Save the entire contents of the desired memory.

[Save to Hard Drive] Desired memory (Yes]* (Section 1) [OK]

- * Touch [Stop] > [Yes] to interrupt the operation while it is in progress.
- After selecting the memory, you can check the name of the folder that will be created on the hard drive. Every memory save operation will create a separate memory save folder with the date (in numerical form) used as the folder name.

Before disconnecting the external hard drive

Before turning off or physically disconnecting the external hard drive, be sure to safely end the connection to the camcorder to avoid damage to your files. From the [External Hard Drive] screen:

[Safely Remove Hard Drive] > [Yes]











 Make sure you power the camcorder with the compact power adapter before you save a memory to the external hard drive.
 If the compact power adapter becomes disconnected, the connection between the camcorder and the hard drive will end, which may lead to the corruption of data in the hard drive.



- About memory save folders:
 - If you performed multiple memory save operations on the same day (for example, if you saved the built-in memory and then a memory card), the folder name of memory save folders following the first one will end in a numerical suffix (for example, "-1", "-2").
 - Up to 10 memory save folders can be created for any given date and up to 300 memory save folders can be saved on a single hard drive.
- You cannot use the following types of external hard drives. For the latest information on devices that can be used, please visit your local Canon Web site.
 - USB-powered portable hard drives.
 - Hard drives with a capacity over 2 TB.
 - USB flash drives or media connected to card readers.
- If the external hard drive is partitioned, only the first partition will be recognized.










- Playing Back Previously Saved Recordings from the External Hard Drive
- 1 Connect the external hard drive to the camcorder.
 - Steps 1 to 3 in the previous procedure (\$\sum 157\$).
- 2 Touch [Play Back from Hard Drive] and select the memory save folder you want to play back.
 - The index screen will appear.
- 3 Touch a recording to play it back.
 - To switch to another memory save folder, touch [] and select the memory save folder of the date you want to play back.
- When you have finished playing back, be sure to safely end the connection to the external hard drive before physically disconnecting it.

Be careful when deleting recordings. Once deleted, recordings cannot be recovered.

Initializing the External Hard Drive

- 1 Connect the external hard drive to the camcorder.
 - Steps 1 to 3 in the previous procedure (\$\sum 157\$).
- 2 Initialize the external hard drive.



Touch this option if you want to physically erase all the data rather than just clear the file allocation table of the hard drive. For large-capacity hard drives this operation can take several hours.

- 3 Safely end the connection to the external hard drive before physically disconnecting it.
- Initializing the external hard drive will permanently erase all the data on the hard drive (including your recordings, previous data not saved with the camcorder, and partitioned drives). Make sure to copy in advance important data to a computer or other device.









If you selected the [Complete Initialization] option, you can touch [Cancel]
[OK] to cancel the initialization while it is in progress. All recordings will be erased and the hard drive can be used without any problem.

Copying Recordings to an External Video Recorder

In High Definition

If the external digital video recorder has an SD card slot compatible with the type of memory card used, you can copy your recordings in high definition directly from the memory card. [IFR63/R67/R66] only: To copy the recordings in the built-in memory, copy them to the memory card in advance ([]] 133).

The detailed procedure depends on the device used so be sure to refer to the instruction manual of the digital video recorder.

In Standard Definition

You can copy your movies by connecting the camcorder to a VCR or a digital video recorder with analog audio/video inputs. Video output will be in standard definition, although the original scenes are in high definition.



- Power the camcorder using the compact power adapter.
- 2 Connect the camcorder to the VCR using the optional STV-250N Stereo Video Cable.
 - Connection 2-① or 2-②. Refer to Connection Diagrams (□ 145).









- 3 Open the index screen that contains the scenes you want to copy (\$\sup\$ 65).
 - Verify that \(\bigcap \) \(\bigcap \) [AV/Headphones] is set to [AV AV].
- **4** External recorder: Load a blank cassette or disc and set the recorder to record pause mode.
- 5 Camcorder: Locate the scene you want to copy and pause the playback just before the desired scene.
- 6 Camcorder: Resume playback.
 - By default, the date and time will be embedded in the output video signal. You can change this using the IT >> III >> IIII
 Display Date/Time] setting.
- 7 External recorder: Start recording when the scene you want to copy appears; stop recording when it ends.
- 8 Camcorder: Stop playback.



 Use an external Blu-Ray Disc recorder compliant with AVCHD ver. 2.0 specifications to copy onto Blu-Ray discs movies recorded in 50P or MXP mode.

This section explains how to connect your camcorder to an access point (wireless router) on an existing Wi-Fi network as well as how to check the Wi-Fi settings and, if necessary, change them.

Overview of the Camcorder's Wi-Fi Functions

You can use the camcorder's Wi-Fi functions to connect wirelessly to Wi-Fi enabled devices* like smartphones or tablets and save, play back and upload your recordings. Refer to **Glossary** (207) for a definition of some of the frequently used terms in this text.

* "iOS device" is used in this text to refer to Wi-Fi-enabled iPhones and iPads, while "Android device" refers to Wi-Fi-enabled Android smartphones and tablets.

iOS Devices

- Install the CameraAccess plus app and use your iPhone or iPad as a remote control to record with the camcorder (170). You can even stream video from the camcorder and record it directly on your iOS device.
- Use a Web browser to access the camcorder and play back recordings on your iOS device (
 181).

Android Devices

- Use a Web browser to access the camcorder and play back recordings on your Android device. You can also save a local copy on your Android device (181).

Computers and Other Wi-Fi Devices

- Connect the camcorder to an access point as a media server and play back your recordings on computers and other devices connected to the same home network (
 195).

Overview of the Camcorder's Wi-Fi Functions

Before Using Wi-Fi Functions

Depending on the Wi-Fi function used, the camcorder will connect wire-lessly directly to a Wi-Fi-enabled device, such as a smartphone, or to a Wi-Fi network via an access point (wireless router)*. After selecting the function you want to use, follow the onscreen directions to connect the camcorder.

This camcorder is also compatible with NFC (near field communication) international standards. When using an NFC-compatible Android device**, you can easily pair the camcorder and the device simply by touching the NFC touchpoints on both devices together.

- * Depending on the manufacturer, the access point may be referred to using a different name, such as wireless LAN router or wireless network router.
- ** Only NFC-compatible devices running Android 4.0 to 4.4.










Overview of the Camcorder's Wi-Fi Functions



 Using an unprotected Wi-Fi network can expose your files and data to monitoring by unauthorized third parties. Be aware of the risks involved.



- We recommend inserting a fully charged battery pack or using the supplied compact power adapter when using Wi-Fi functions.
- When using the camcorder's Wi-Fi functions, do not cover the top back area of
 the camcorder with your hand or other
 object. The Wi-Fi antenna is located there
 and covering it may interfere with wireless
 signals.



Wi-Fi antenna

- Do not open the memory card slot cover during the wireless connection.
- While using Wi-Fi functions, the camcorder's automatic power off function will be disabled.









Using an iOS or Android Device as a Remote Control

Using the CameraAccess plus app*, you can view the image streamed from the camcorder on your iOS/Android device even when the camcorder is somewhere else. You can use your iOS/Android device as a remote control to start recording on the camcorder and, while using the Monitor from Home function, you can even record the streamed image locally on your iOS/Android device.

When using an NFC-compatible Android device (\bigcirc 168), you can connect the camcorder and the device with a simple operation.

^{*} The CameraAccess plus app, provided by PIXELA, is available for free from the App Store (iOS devices) and Google Play™ (Android devices).

- Before you perform these procedures for the first time, download and install the latest version of the CameraAccess plus app on your iOS/Android device. The app can be downloaded for free from the following Web sites.

Streaming via Wi-Fi (Monitor from Home)

With this function, you can monitor the image streamed from the camcorder when it is in another location within Wi-Fi connection range, for example, in another room in the house. You can use your iOS/Android device to control the camcorder.

1 Camcorder: Activate the [Monitor from Home] function.

- The camcorder's SSID (network name) and password will appear.
- The camcorder will be ready to connect with the iOS or Android device.









- 2 Android devices compatible with NFC: Connect the camcorder and the device as described in Pairing an NFC-compatible Android device (173).
 - When the Wi-Fi connection is correctly established, [Connected] will appear on the camcorder's screen and the live view image will appear on the CameraAccess plus app's screen on the Android device.
 - Use the app's onscreen controls to operate the camcorder while viewing the live image on the device. The rest of this procedure is not necessary.

iOS/Android devices not compatible with NFC: In the Wi-Fi settings screen, turn on Wi-Fi and select the network name that appears on the camcorder's screen (step 1). If necessary, enter the password that appears on the camcorder's screen.

- The camcorder's network name (SSID) should appear in the list of networks/access points detected by the device.
- As long as you do not reset the camcorder's Wi-Fi password, you only need to enter the password the first time you connect the device.
- When the Wi-Fi connection is correctly established, [Connected] will appear on the camcorder's screen.
- 3 iOS/Android device: Start the CameraAccess plus app.
 - Use the app's onscreen controls to operate the camcorder while viewing the live image on the device.










When you have finished recording

- 1 Camcorder: Touch [End] to end the wireless connection and turn off the camcorder.
- 2 iOS/Android device: Close the CameraAccess plus app.

Pairing an NFC-compatible Android device



- 1 Touch the NFC touchpoint on the Android device to the NFC touchpoint on the camcorder.
 - Align the center of the NFC touchpoints on both devices. If there
 is no reaction, try changing the position of the Android device
 slightly while it is touching the camcorder.
 - When the device is recognized, the Android device will emit a sound** and the CameraAccess plus app will start automatically.
- 2 Android device: Touch OK.









- * For illustration purposes only. For details about the device's NFC function and the location/mark of the NFC touchpoint, refer to the instruction manual of the Andorid device used.
- ** Depending on the settings and specifications of the Android device used, no sound may be emitted.



- When using NFC-compatible devices.
 - When touching an NFC-compatible device to the camcorder, be careful not to forcibly hit the device against the camcorder. Using excessive force may damage the camcorder or NFC-compatible device.
 - If the NFC-compatible device or the camcorder is covered by a protective case, the devices might not be able to connect wirelessly.
 - If the camcorder unintentionally comes into contact with an NFC-compatible device (for example, inside a carrying bag), the camcorder may turn on on its own. You can set !!
 NFC to [OFF Off] to prevent this.

Streaming via Wi-Fi and Internet (Monitor while Out)

With this function, you can leave the camcorder home and monitor the streamed image while you are away. You can even use your iOS/ Android device to start recording on the camcorder.

Using the Remote Monitoring Checker utility (for Windows only), you can check whether your home network's access point and Internet connection meet the requirements for using the Monitor while Out function*. For details about this program and links to the download page, visit PIXELA's Web site.

- * To use the Monitor while Out Function, an access point compatible with UPnP (Universal Plug and Play) and an Internet connection that can acquire global IP addresses are required.
- 1 Activate the [Monitor while Out] function.

- The first time you activate the function, you will need to set a
 password and the port to be used by this function (steps 2 to 4).
 If you have already completed the settings for the Monitor while
 Out function, skip to step 5.
- 2 Touch [OK] to open the settings screen.
- 3 To enter the [Password] field, touch [Not configured]. Enter a unique password for the Monitor while Out function and touch [OK].
 - The password is required for this function and must be between 4 and 8 characters long. We recommend using an 8-character password using a mix of numbers and uppercase/lowercase letters.
 - To enter the password (and the port number in the next step), use the virtual keyboard (\$\sum 179\$).
- 4 To change the port number to be used, touch [80]. Enter a different port number and touch [OK] twice.
 - By default, the port number is set to 80 but you can change it if necessary.









- 5 If necessary, set up a connection to an access point.
 - If you have previously configured and saved only one connection to an access point, the camcorder will automatically connect to that access point. Continue to step 6.
 - If you have saved more than one connection to an access point, touch [OK] to use the access point displayed on the screen, and then continue to step 6. To use a different access point instead, touch [Change Connection Point] desired access point (OK), and then continue to step 6.
 - If no connections to access points have been saved in the camcorder, the message [Save the access point] will appear on the screen. Touch [OK] to configure and save a new access point connection (step 2 in Wi-Fi Connection Using an Access Point (\$\sum_\$ 198)) before continuing with this procedure.
- **6** When the wireless connection is successfully established, the camcorder's ID will be displayed on the screen.
 - The camcorder will be ready to connect with the iOS/Android device.
 - If this is the first time you are using this function or if you reset the camcorder's settings, you need to register the camcorder's ID with the following procedure. Otherwise, continue as described in To use the Monitor while Out function (178).









To register the camcorder's ID in the CameraAccess plus app

- 1 Android devices compatible with NFC: Connect the camcorder and the device.
 - Perform only step 1 in Pairing an NFC-compatible Android device (
 173).
 - Android device: When the camcorder's ID is correctly registered, a message will prompt you to turn off Wi-Fi on the device. Select Turn off Wi-Fi or Do not turn off Wi-Fi (to keep using Wi-Fi on the device) and then touch Set.
 - Camcorder: After the Wi-Fi connection to the Android device is terminated, the camcorder will reconnect automatically to the previously selected access point.
 - The rest of this procedure is not necessary. Continue as described in To use the Monitor while Out function (
 178).

iOS/Android devices not compatible with NFC: On the device, turn on Wi-Fi and select the same access point as that to which the camcorder is connected (step 5 in the previous procedure).

- 2 Start the CameraAccess plus app and touch Setting and then Start.
 - The camcorder's ID is registered and displayed in the CameraAccess plus app.
- 3 Touch Finish and close the CameraAccess plus app.
 - Disconnect the iOS/Android device from the access point.









To use the Monitor while Out function

- While you are out, start the CameraAccess plus app.
- 2 Touch Start under Monitor while Out.
- 3 Enter the password for the Monitor while Out function that you set in the camcorder (step 3, ☐ 175) and then touch Connect.
 - Use the app's onscreen controls to operate the camcorder while viewing the live image on the device.

When you have finished recording

- 1 Camcorder: Touch [End] to end the wireless connection and turn off the camcorder.
- 2 iOS/Android device: Close the CameraAccess plus app.









Using the virtual keyboard

When you need to enter text for various settings, touch the text field and a virtual keyboard will appear on the screen. The illustration below explains the various keys you can use.



- 1 Switch between letters and numbers/special characters.
- 2 Change the position of the cursor.
- 3 Delete the character to the cursor's left (backspace).
- 4 Caps Lock. When the numerical keyboard is displayed, [#%?] switches between set 1 and set 2 of special characters.

- When the camcorder is in Monitor from Home or Monitor while Out mode, the shooting mode will be set automatically to (1)10.
- This function is not available in the following cases.
 - When the video quality is 50P.






 Depending on the connection and the strength of the wireless signal, there may be interruptions in the live video image or the response may be slow.

About the optional CT-V1 Camera Pan Table

- If you mount the camcorder on the optional CT-V1 Camera Pan Table, you can use the CameraAccess plus app on your iOS/Android device as a remote control to move the camcorder sideways (panning) in addition to starting/stopping recording.
- Notice that there are two possible directions for mounting a camcorder on the CT-V1. This camcorder should be mounted so that the lens is aligned with the **B** mark on the underside of the CT-V1's camcorder base plate. For details, refer to the instruction manual of the CT-V1.











Playback via Browser: Viewing Recordings Using a Web Browser on an iOS or Android Device

With the Playback via Browser function, you can use the Web browser on any device equipped with a Wi-Fi receiver (iOS/Android devices, computers, etc.) to access the camcorder. You can then play back your recordings using the Web browser and even save local copies of them on your device*.


When using an NFC-compatible Android device (\bigcirc 168), you can connect the camcorder and the device with a simple operation.

* Depending on the device, OS, browser and video quality, you may not be able to play back or save recordings. For details, visit your local Canon Web site.





- Android devices compatible with NFC: Download and install the CameraAccess plus app in advance (
 171).
- 1 Camcorder: From any movie index screen, activate the Playback via Browser mode.



- The camcorder's SSID (network name) and password will appear.
- The camcorder will be ready to connect with the wireless device.









- 2 Android devices compatible with NFC: Connect the camcorder and the device as described in Pairing an NFC-compatible Android device (173).
 - Android device: When the Wi-Fi connection is correctly established, the default browser app will open and the Playback via Browser screen will be displayed automatically. Skip to step 4.
 - Camcorder: [Connected] will appear on the camcorder's screen.

iOS/Android devices not compatible with NFC: In the Wi-Fi settings screen, turn on Wi-Fi and select the network name that appears on the camcorder's screen (step 1). If necessary, enter the password that appears on the camcorder's screen.

- The camcorder's network name (SSID) should appear in the list of networks/access points detected by the device.
- As long as you do not reset the camcorder's Wi-Fi password, you only need to enter the password the first time you connect the device.
- When the Wi-Fi connection is correctly established, [Connected] will appear on the camcorder's screen.
- 3 iOS/Android device: Start the Web browser and enter the URL that appears on the camcorder's screen into the Web browser's address bar.
 - The Playback via Browser screen will appear.
 - The URL is always the same so you may find it convenient to bookmark the URL.









- 4 iOS/Android device: Touch the desired recording from the list.
 - Touch the button on the top left of the screen to change the index screen displayed. Touch (AVCHD movies), (MP4 movies) or (photos) of the desired memory ((□) built-in memory or (so memory card).
 - Touch a thumbnail to display a photo (or the first frame of a movie).

MP4 movies only: Touch again to play back the movie.

- · AVCHD movies cannot be played back.
- Touch **##** to return to the index screen.
- Devices other than iOS devices: Touch to save a local copy of the movie/photo on the device.

When you have finished

Camcorder: Touch [End] > [OK] to end the wireless connection and turn off the camcorder.



- The following types of MP4 scenes will be recognized as multiple files on other devices.
 - Scenes exceeding 4 GB.
 - Scenes recorded at 35 Mbps exceeding 30 minutes.
 - Scenes recorded at a video quality other than 35 Mbps exceeding 1 hour.
- For details about Wi-Fi connections on computers and other devices, refer to the instruction manual of the OS, computer or device used.









Saving Recordings and Uploading Movies to the Web Using an iOS Device


Using the Movie Uploader app*, you can play back and save** your movies and photos on an iOS device. You can also upload your movies to YouTube and Facebook even when you are away from your home network.

- * The Movie Uploader app, provided by PIXELA, is available for free from the App Store.
- ** Depending on the iOS version used, this feature is not available for MP4 movies recorded at 35 Mbps.





- Before you perform this procedure for the first time, install the Movie Uploader app on your iOS device. The app can be downloaded for free from the following Web site. http://appstore.com/movieuploader
- 1 Camcorder: From any movie index screen, set the camcorder to connect with the iOS device.



- The camcorder's SSID (network name) and password will appear.
- The camcorder will be ready to connect with the iOS device.









- 2 iOS device: In the Wi-Fi settings screen, turn on Wi-Fi and select the network name that appears on the camcorder's screen (step 1). If necessary, enter the password that appears on the camcorder's screen.
 - The camcorder's network name (SSID) should appear in the list of networks/access points detected by the device.
 - As long as you do not reset the camcorder's Wi-Fi password, you only need to enter the password the first time you connect the device.
 - When the Wi-Fi connection is correctly established, [Connected] will appear on the camcorder's screen.
- 3 iOS device: Start the Movie Uploader app and select your camcorder's model name from the list on the screen.
- 4 iOS device: Use the Movie Uploader app to upload the camcorder's movies and photos.
 - You can also play back or save movies and photos on the iOS device.

When you have finished

Camcorder: Touch [End] > [OK] to end the wireless connection and turn off the camcorder.



- Depending on factors such as the wireless network conditions, it can take some time to upload video files.
- The procedure above may differ depending on the version of iOS you are using.

Saving Recordings on the Optional CS100 Connect Station (NFC+Wi-Fi)

You can easily save all the movies and photos you recorded onto the optional CS100 Connect Station. You can organize your recordings in albums, play them back on a connected HDTV or share them on the Web. For details, refer to the instruction manual of the CS100.

This section explains how to connect the camcorder to the CS100 using NFC (near field communication) and Wi-Fi functions for a simple and effortless operation. You can also connect the camcorder to the connect station using the supplied USB cable (\sum 156).



- Power the camcorder using the compact power adapter.
- With the camcorder turned off or displaying an index screen in playback mode, carefully hold the NFC touchpoint on the camcorder close to the NFC connect point on the connect station.
 - Align the camcorder's N mark with the center of the connect point on the connect station.
 - If there is no reaction, try adjusting slightly the position/angle of the camcorder while carefully holding it close to the connect point on the connect station, or very gently touching the camcorder to the connect station.
 - If the camcorder was turned off, it will turn on in playback mode, even with the LCD panel closed. If necessary, open the LCD panel.
 - The connect station will emit a beep sound. When the Wi-Fi connection is correctly established, the transfer of files will start automatically.









3 Camcorder: When the file transfer is completed, touch [OK].



Saving a scene that is about 4 minutes long will take approximately 5 minutes. When saving a large number of files, the operation may take some time.

Sharing Recordings with CANON iMAGE GATEWAY

After you register for CANON iMAGE GATEWAY*, you will be able to access various Web services**. You will be able to upload movies and photos to online albums, upload movies to Facebook and YouTube, send links to your online albums by e-mail to friends and family, and more! After you complete the free registration online, you can use the Web services, create online photo albums, and more.  - Complete the free registration online for CANON iMAGE GATEWAY.
 - Have ready relevant account settings (user name, password, etc.) for all the services you plan to use (YouTube, Facebook, etc.). Available services may differ by country/region.

■ Setting the Desired Web Services in the Camcorder Log in to CANON iMAGE GATEWAY and set the Web services you want to use.

- If you have saved more than one connection to an access point, touch [OK] to use the access point displayed on the screen, and then continue to step 2. To use a different access point instead, touch [Change Connection Point] desired access point (OK), and then continue to step 2.
- If no connections to access points have been saved in the camcorder, the message [Save the access point] will appear on the screen. Touch [OK] to configure and save a new access point connection (step 2 in Wi-Fi Connection Using an Access Point (\$\sum_\$ 198)) before continuing with this procedure.
- When the wireless connection is successfully established, the [To Web Service] screen will appear on the camcorder's screen.









- 2 Select the desired Web service.
- 3 Select the type of recordings you want to share and the memory to read.
 - The types of recordings that can be uploaded depend on the Web service.
- 4 Touch the scene or photo(s) to upload.
 - When uploading photos, you can touch up to 10 photos to upload at one time.
 - To cancel a selection, touch the selected photo again. To cancel all selections at once, touch [Remove All] > [Yes].
 - When you have finished selecting the desired photos, touch [OK].
 - If you are uploading to YouTube, read the YouTube agreement carefully and touch [I Agree] if you agree.
 - The upload will begin automatically.
 - You can touch [Stop] to cancel the wireless transfer while it is in progress.
- 5 Touch [OK].









Checking your uploads using CANON iMAGE GATEWAY Library

You can use the CANON iMAGE GATEWAY Library or Album screen to see the movies and photos you uploaded. You can also check what files you have sent and the various settings for the Web services. For details on CANON iMAGE GATEWAY, refer to the Help module (in the upper right of the screen).



- For movies, you can upload one at a time; for photos, up to 10 at a time.
- The maximum length and file size for uploading depends on the Web service.
- Depending on the access point's (wireless router's) settings and capabilities, it can take some time to upload files.
- E-mail addresses must consist of single-byte characters. Only e-mail addresses with 16 or fewer characters before the @ mark can be set in the camcorder.










Wireless Playback on a Computer

Using the Media Server function, you can wirelessly view your movies and photos on your computer or similar device. You will need an access point connected to your home network and software installed on your computer that can play back movies and photos from a media server. We recommend that you connect the computer to the access point using a LAN cable. Refer also to the instruction manuals for the computer, software and access point.





1 Camcorder: From any movie index screen, activate the media server function.



 If you have previously configured and saved a connection to an access point, the camcorder will connect automatically to the last access point used.









- If no connections to access points have been saved in the camcorder, the message [Save the access point] will appear on the screen. Touch [OK] to configure and save a new access point connection (step 2 in Wi-Fi Connection Using an Access Point (\$\sum_\$ 198)) before continuing with this procedure.
- Camcorder: When the wireless connection is successfully established, [Connected] will appear on the camcorder's screen.
 - You can touch [View Information] to view the access point's SSID, connection protocol, and the camcorder's IP address and MAC address.
 - After touching [View Information], you can touch [Change Connection Point] to select a different SSID saved in the camcorder in order to change access points.
- 3 Computer: Start your preferred media player software and select your camcorder's model name from the list of media servers.
 - On standalone media players and other devices, connect the device to the home network and select your camcorder's model name from the list of media servers.
- 4 Computer: Select the folder for the camcorder's built-in memory or memory card and play back the movies and photos.
- 5 Camcorder: Touch [End] ▶ [OK] when finished.











 Depending on the access point's (wireless router's) settings and capabilities, playback may take time to start or may not appear smooth. For details, refer to **Troubleshooting** (\$\sum_{249}\$).









Wi-Fi Connection Using an Access Point

The camcorder can connect to a Wi-Fi network using an access point (wireless router) and even remember the settings for 4 access points.

General requirements

 Correctly configured router that complies with the 802.11b/g/n protocol and is Wi-Fi certified (bears the logo shown to the right) and a home network.





- 1 Open the [(1) Network Setup] screen.
- 2 Touch the desired setup method.
 - Depending on the setup method chosen, the procedure will be different. Read the descriptions below and continue with the procedure described in the relevant page.









Options

[WPS: Button]*

Simply press and hold the WPS button on your wireless router and then touch the camcorder's screen. This is the easiest connection method if you are using a WPS-compatible router. Continue the procedure as described in Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS) (200).

[WPS: PIN Code]*

Access the access point's configuration screen using your Web browser. The camcorder will generate a PIN code, which you will enter into the browser. You will need a WPS-compatible router and a computer or other device connected to it. Continue the procedure as described in Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS) (\subseteq 200).

[Search for Access Points]

Following the camcorder's onscreen instructions, you select the desired access point from a list and then enter the password. Continue the procedure as described in **Searching for Access Points** (201)

[Manual Setup]

You manually enter the access point's name, password and other network settings. This method is recommended only for advanced users of Wi-Fi networks. Continue the procedure as described in **Manual Setup** (202).

* WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup) is a standard that makes connecting to an access point easier.









■ Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS)

If your access point is WPS-compatible (bears the logo shown below), connecting the camcorder to it can be very easy. If you cannot successfully connect the camcorder using WPS, try using the [Search for Access Points] method. Refer also to the access point's (wireless router's) instruction manual.



1 [WPS: Button] method

- Press and hold the WPS button on the wireless router.
- Depending on the router, the amount of time required may differ.
- Make sure the router's WPS function is activated.

[WPS: PIN Code] method

- From a computer or similar device connected to the access point, use the Web browser to open the router's WPS settings screen. After the 8-digit PIN code appears on the camcorder's screen, enter it into your router's WPS settings screen.
- 2 Within 2 minutes, touch [OK] on the camcorder's screen.
 - The camcorder will connect to the access point.
 - You can touch [Stop] and then [OK] to interrupt the Wi-Fi Protected Setup while it is in progress.
 - When the Wi-Fi Protected Setup is finished, [Configuration completed] will appear on the screen.









3 Touch [OK] to save the configuration.

 If you were in the process of performing another procedure, the camcorder will automatically connect to the access point. Return to the procedure of the function you were previously using: Step 6 in Streaming via Wi-Fi and Internet (Monitor while Out) (176)

Step 2 in Sharing Your Recordings Using Web Services (193)

Step 2 in Wireless Playback on a Computer (196)

Otherwise, touch [♠] ▶ [★] to close the menu.

Searching for Access Points

After you touch [Search for Access Points], the camcorder will take a few seconds to detect access points available in the vicinity and will display the first one. Make a note in advance of the network name (SSID) and password (encryption key) of the access point you want to use. (This will usually be the wireless router on your home network.)

To enter text for the various settings, use the virtual keyboard (\(\sum 179\)).

Select the desired access point.

- If the desired access point is not displayed, you can touch [▲] or [▼] to go through the list of detected access points. You can also touch [Search Again] to have the camcorder search for access points again.
- When the network name (SSID) of the desired access point appears, touch [OK].









- To enter the [Encryption Key] field, touch [Not configured]. Enter the access point's password (encryption key) and touch [OK].
 - If the access point selected in step 1 did not have a [♠] icon, this step is not necessary.
- 3 Touch [OK] to save the configuration.
 - If you were in the process of performing another procedure, the camcorder will automatically connect to the access point. Return to the procedure of the function you were previously using: Step 6 in Streaming via Wi-Fi and Internet (Monitor while Out) (176)
 - Step 2 in Sharing Your Recordings Using Web Services (193)
 - Step 2 in Wireless Playback on a Computer (196)
 - Otherwise, touch [♠] ▶ [★] to close the menu.

Manual Setup

Perform this procedure to manually configure the wireless connection settings. This may be necessary, for example, if your access point's network name (SSID) cannot be detected due to the stealth function being enabled. Manual setup is for advanced users of Wi-Fi networks. To enter text for the various settings, use the virtual keyboard (\(\sum 179\)).

In the [SSID] field, touch [Not configured] and enter the SSID. Touch [OK] and then touch [Next].









- In the [Authentication/Encryption Method] field, touch [OPEN NONE] and then touch the desired method.
 - If you selected [OPEN WEP], the WEP index is 1.
- In the [Encryption Key] field, enter the encryption key. Touch [OK] and then touch [Next].
 - If you selected [OPEN NONE] in step 2, this step is not necessary.
- 4 Touch [Automatic] or [Manual] to select how to obtain the IP address.
 - If you selected [Automatic], proceed to step 9.
- To enter the [IP Address] field, touch [0.0.0.0]. Touch the first field and touch [▲]/[▼] to change the value. Change the rest of the fields in the same way and touch [OK].
- 6 Enter the [Subnet Mask] field in the same way and touch [Next].
- 7 Enter the [Default Gateway] field in the same way and touch [Next].
- **8** Enter the [Primary DNS Server] and [Secondary DNS Server] fields in the same way and touch [Next].









- 9 Touch [OK] to save the configuration.
 - If you were in the process of performing another procedure, the camcorder will automatically connect to the access point. Return to the procedure of the function you were previously using: Step 6 in Streaming via Wi-Fi and Internet (Monitor while Out) (176)
 - Step 2 in Sharing Your Recordings Using Web Services (

 ☐ 193)
 - Step 2 in Wireless Playback on a Computer (196)
 - Otherwise, touch [♠] Ŋ [★] to close the menu.



 The Wi-Fi functions available and the setup method will vary depending on the specifications and characteristics of the Wi-Fi network you want to use.

1 Open the [(1) Check Current Configuration] screen.









To view the connection settings for iOS/Android devices

- 3 If necessary, change the camcorder's network name (SSID) and password.

- The next time you make a wireless connection, you will need to change the Wi-Fi settings on the iOS/Android device.
- 4 Touch [♠] repeatedly to return to the ♠ (Home) menu, and then touch [★] to close the menu.

To view the access point's connection settings

- 2 Touch [Access Point Connection Settings].
 - The SSID of up to 4 access points saved in the camcorder will appear.
 - If fewer than 4 access point connections have been registered, you can touch [Not configured] to set up a new access point (\$\sum_198\$).
- 3 Touch the SSID of the access point whose settings you want to view.
 - The access point's settings will appear.
 - Touch [▲] and [▼] to view more information.









- To delete the access point connection displayed, touch [Edit] > [Delete] > [Yes].
- To manually change the settings of the access point connection displayed, touch [Edit] ➤ [Manual Setup] and then perform the procedure in Manual Setup (□ 202).
- Touch [♠] to return to the access point selection screen.
- 4 Touch [♠] repeatedly to return to the ♠ (Home) menu, and then touch [★] to close the menu.

To view the settings for the Monitor while Out function (recording mode only)

- 2 Touch [Monitor while Out Settings].
 - The password and port number to be used for the Monitor while Out function will appear.
- 3 If necessary, change the settings.
 - Steps 3 and 4 in Streaming via Wi-Fi and Internet (Monitor while Out) (

 175).
- 4 Touch [♠] repeatedly to return to the ♠ (Home) menu, and then touch [★] to close the menu.









Glossary

This is a glossary of some of the basic terms used frequently in this chapter. The documentation for your access point may also contain a glossary you can refer to.

Access Point

A wireless access point (WAP) is a device that allows wireless devices, like your camcorder, to connect to a wired network (including to the Internet) using the Wi-Fi standard. In most cases, this will be your wireless router.

IP Address

Exclusive number assigned to each device connected to the network.

NFC

Near field communication. Standard for smartphones and other devices that allows a device to establish a communication protocol with another device just by bringing the devices to close proximity (touching them together).

SSID

Service Set Identifier. This is simply the public name of a Wi-Fi network.

WPS

Wi-Fi Protected Setup. Standard for easy and secure setup of Wi-Fi networks created by the Wi-Fi Alliance.

[Self Timer]: You can have the camcorder start recording after a 10-second countdown. After setting [Self Timer] to [ON On O], press START/STOP to start the countdown and record video or touch [PHOTO] to start the countdown and take a photo.

[Available Space in Memory] (recording mode only)/[Used Space in Memory] (playback mode only): Displays a screen where you can verify how much of the memory is currently available for recording or how much of it is in use (indicates photos).

- Estimated figures about available movie recording time and available number of photos are approximate and based on the currently selected video quality and photo size.
- The information screen displays also the Speed Class rating of the memory card.



Memory card operation

Remaining battery charge

- The icon shows a rough estimate of the remaining charge of the battery pack. An estimate of the remaining recording/playback time (in minutes) will be displayed next to the icon.
- When suppears (in red), the battery pack is exhausted. Replace the battery pack with a fully charged one.
- Depending on the condition of the camcorder or battery, the actual battery charge may not match what is displayed on the screen.









Troubleshooting

If you have a problem with your camcorder, refer to this section. Sometimes what you think is a malfunction of the camcorder may have the simplest of solutions - please read the "CHECK THIS FIRST" box before going on to the more detailed problems and solutions. Consult your dealer or a Canon Service Center if the problem persists.

CHECK THIS FIRST

Power supply

 Is the battery charged? Is the compact power adapter correctly connected to the camcorder? (
 28)

Recording

Playback

 Did you turn the camcorder on and correctly set it to playback mode? (65, 71) If you want to play back recordings from a memory card, is a compatible card correctly inserted into the camcorder? (33) Does it contain any recordings?









Power Source

The camcorder will not turn on or it turns off by itself.

- The battery pack is exhausted. Replace or charge the battery pack.
- Remove the battery pack and insert it correctly.

Cannot charge the battery pack.

- Make sure the camcorder is off so charging can start.
- The temperature of the battery pack is outside its operating range (approximately 0 – 40 °C). Remove the battery pack, warm it or let it cool down, as necessary, and try charging it again.
- Charge the battery pack in temperatures between approximately 0 °C and 40 °C.
- The battery pack is faulty. Replace the battery pack.
- The camcorder cannot communicate with the battery pack attached. Battery packs not recommended by Canon for use with this camcorder cannot be charged using this camcorder.
- If you are using a battery pack recommended by Canon for use with this camcorder, there may be a problem with the battery pack.
 Consult a Canon Service Center.

A noise can be heard from the compact power adapter.

- A faint sound can be heard while the compact power adapter is connected to a power outlet. This is not a malfunction.

The battery pack is exhausted extremely quickly even at normal temperatures.

 The battery may have reached the end of its battery life. Buy a new battery pack.









Recording

Pressing START/STOP will not start recording.

- You cannot record while the camcorder is writing previous recordings in the memory (while the ACCESS indicator is on or flashing).
 Wait until the camcorder has finished.
- The memory is full or it already contains the maximum number of AVCHD scenes (3,999 scenes). Delete some recordings (☐ 73) or initialize the memory (☐ 40) to free some space.
- The file numbers for MP4 movies and photos have reached their maximum value. Save your recordings (☐ 149), set ☐ ② [File Numbering] to [Reset] and initialize the memory (☐ 40).

The point where START/STOP was pressed does not match the beginning/end of the recording.

- There is a slight interval between pressing the button and the actual start/end of recording. This is not a malfunction.

The camcorder will not focus.

- Autofocus does not work on the subject. Focus manually (\$\sum\$ 109).
- The lens is dirty. Clean the lens (\$\sum 275\$).

When a subject flits across in front of the lens, the image appears slightly bent.

- This is a phenomenon typical of CMOS image sensors. When a subject crosses very quickly in front of the camcorder, the image may seem slightly warped. This is not a malfunction.









Changing the operating mode between recording (●)/recording standby (■)/playback (▶) takes longer than usual.

- When the memory contains a large number of scenes, some operations may take longer than usual. Save your recordings (☐ 149) and initialize the memory (☐ 40).

Movies or photos cannot be recorded properly.

- This may occur as movies and photos are recorded/deleted over time. Save your recordings (☐ 149) and initialize the memory using the [Complete Initialization] option (☐ 40).

Cannot record a photo while recording movies.

- You cannot take photos when the shooting mode is set to □ or while fading in or fading out a scene (□ 105).

After using the camcorder for a long time, it becomes hot.

 The camcorder may become hot after using it continuously for long periods of time; this is not a malfunction. If the camcorder becomes unusually hot or it becomes hot after using it only for a short while, it may indicate a problem with the camcorder. Consult a Canon Service Center.

Playback

Deleting scenes takes longer than usual.

- When the memory contains a large number of scenes, some operations may take longer than usual. Save your recordings (☐ 149) and initialize the memory (☐ 40).

Cannot capture a video snapshot scene from a movie.

 You cannot capture video snapshot scenes from scenes recorded or edited using another device and then transferred to a memory









- card connected to the computer. Also, you cannot capture video snapshot scenes from MP4 movies.
- The memory is full. Delete some recordings (\$\sum 73\$) to free some space.

When playing back scenes/slideshow with background music, the music track is not played back correctly.

- This can occur when you transfer the music files to a memory after repeatedly recording and deleting scenes (fragmented memory). Recordings in the built-in memory (HFR68/R67/R66 only): Initialize a memory card with the camcorder using the [Complete Initialization] option (☐ 40). Transfer the music files to the memory card (☐ 291) and then copy the recordings you want to play back to the memory card you prepared (☐ 133). Play back the recordings with background music from the memory card. To avoid the same problem, save the recordings in the built-in memory (☐ 149) and initialize it using the [Complete Initialization] option (☐ 40). Recordings on a memory card: Save your recordings on a computer (☐ 150). Initialize the memory card using the [Complete Initialization] option (☐ 40). Transfer the music files to the memory card (☐ 291) and then copy back all your recordings from the computer to the memory card.
- Music tracks will not play back correctly if the connection was interrupted while transferring the music files to a memory card. Delete the music tracks and transfer the music files again.
- The transfer rate of the memory card used is too slow. Use a recommended memory card (\$\subseteq\$ 32).









Cannot divide scenes.

The memory is full. Delete some recordings (
 \sum 73) to free some space.

Cannot mark individual scenes/photos in the index screen with a checkmark \checkmark .

- You cannot select more than 100 scenes/photos individually. Select the [All Scenes] or [All Photos] option instead of [Select].

Indicators and Onscreen Displays

- appears (in red) on the screen.
 - Battery pack is exhausted. Replace the battery pack with a fully charged one.
- appears (in red) on the screen.
 - The camcorder cannot communicate with the battery pack attached so the remaining battery charge cannot be displayed.
- appears (in red) on the screen.
 - A memory card error occurred. Turn off the camcorder. Remove and reinsert the memory card. Initialize the memory card if the display does not change back to normal.
- (in red) and [End] appear on the screen.
 - The memory card is full. Replace the memory card or delete some recordings (☐ 73) to free some space on the memory card.

Even after stopping recording, the ACCESS indicator does not go off.

- The scene is being recorded in the memory. This is not a malfunction.









The red POWER/CHG indicator flashes rapidly (*** ** * one flash at 0.5-second intervals).

- The temperature of the battery pack is outside its operating range (approximately 0 – 40 °C). Remove the battery pack, warm it or let it cool down, as necessary, and try charging it again.
- Charge the battery pack in temperatures between approximately 0 °C and 40 °C.
- The battery pack is damaged. Use a different battery pack.
- Charging has stopped because the compact power adapter or the battery pack is faulty. Consult a Canon Service Center.

Picture and Sound

A rattling can be heard from the camcorder.

 If it cannot be heard while the camcorder is set to recording mode, then the rattling is due to the movement of the internal lens fixture.
 This is not a malfunction.

The screen appears too dark.

- The LCD screen was dimmed. Change the !! >> [LCD Backlight] setting to [Normal] or [Bright].

Screen displays turn on and off repeatedly.

- The battery pack is exhausted. Replace or charge the battery pack.
- Remove the battery pack and attach it correctly.

Abnormal characters appear on the screen and the camcorder does not operate properly.

- Remove the battery pack and attach it after a few moments.

Video noise appears on screen.

- Keep a distance between the camcorder and devices that emit strong electromagnetic fields (plasma TVs, cellular phones, etc.).









Horizontal bands appear on the screen.

- This is a phenomenon typical of CMOS image sensors when recording under some types of fluorescent, mercury or sodium lamps. This is not a malfunction. To reduce the symptoms, change the **IT** \(\rightarrow \) [Flicker Reduction] setting.

Sound is distorted or is recorded at lower levels.

 When recording near loud sounds (such as fireworks, shows or concerts), sound may become distorted or it may not be recorded at the actual levels. This is not a malfunction. Adjust the audio recording level manually (\$\sum\$ 230).

The picture is displayed correctly but there is no sound from the built-in speaker.

- Speaker volume is turned off. Adjust the volume (\$\sum 68\$).
- If the supplied High Speed HDMI cable or optional STV-250N Stereo Video Cable is connected to the camcorder, disconnect it.
- The AV OUT/ ∩ terminal is set to headphone output. Set !! > [AV/Headphones] to [AV].

There is no sound from the AV OUT/ \bigcap (headphones) terminal.

- HFR68/R67/R66 Audio will not be output from the AV OUT/ terminal while Wi-Fi functions are in use.

Memory Card and Accessories

Cannot insert the memory card.

 The memory card was not facing the correct direction. Turn the memory card over and insert it.

Cannot record on the memory card.

 The memory card is full. Delete some recordings (\$\sum_73\$) to free some space or replace the memory card.









- Initialize the memory card using the [Complete Initialization] option (\$\sum 40\$) when you use it with the camcorder for the first time.
- The LOCK switch on the memory card is set to prevent accidental erasure. Change the position of the LOCK switch.
- A compatible memory card must be used to be able to record movies on a memory card (
 32).
- The folder and file numbers for MP4 movies and photos have reached their maximum value. Insert a new memory card and set [File Numbering] to [Reset].

Connections with External Devices

Video noise appears on the TV screen.

 When using the camcorder in a room where a TV is located, keep a distance between the compact power adapter and the power or antenna cables of the TV.

There is no image on the TV screen and there is no sound.

- The video input on the TV is not set to the video terminal to which you connected the camcorder. Select the correct video input.
- Disconnect the supplied High Speed HDMI cable and then restore the connection or turn the camcorder off and then on again.
- Video will not be output from the AV OUT/

 terminal while an
 HDMl cable is connected to the camcorder. Disconnect the supplied High Speed HDMl cable.
- HFR68/R67/R66 Video and audio will not be output from the camcorder while Wi-Fi functions are in use.









The computer does not recognize the camcorder even though the camcorder is connected correctly.

- Disconnect the USB cable and turn off the camcorder. After a short while, turn it on again and restore the connection.
- Connect the camcorder to a different USB port on the computer.

Cannot save recordings on my computer

 When the memory contains too many recordings (Windows – 2,500 or more photos/MP4 movies, Mac OS – 1,000 or more photos/MP4 movies), you may not be able to transfer recordings to a computer. Try using a card reader to transfer recordings from the memory card.

 $\frac{\text{HFR68/R67/R66}}{\text{MFR68/R67/R66}}$ only: To transfer the recordings in the built-in memory, copy them to the memory card in advance (\square 133).

After touching the camcorder's NFC touchpoint to the touchpoint of an NFC-compatible device, the device is not correctly recognized.

- Align the center of the touchpoints on the camcorder and the other device. If there is no reaction, try slightly moving the devices while they are touching.
- The NFC function may be turned off. Set !! >> [NFC] to [ON On].

HFR68/R67/R66 Wi-Fi Functions

Refer also to the instruction manual of the access point and other devices you will use.

Cannot connect with the access point.

- Check that the access point is working correctly.









- The effective communication range between the camcorder and access point may vary depending on the strength of the wireless signal. Try using the camcorder closer to the access point.
- To avoid interference, use the camcorder at some distance from devices that emit electromagnetic waves (cordless phones, microwave ovens, etc.).
- Wi-Fi networks with a stealth function that do not broadcast their network name (SSID) will not be detected by the camcorder during the Wi-Fi network setup. Perform the setup manually (\$\sum_2\$ 202) or turn off the stealth function of the access point.

Wireless playback on a computer or similar device is not smooth.

- Playback may not be smooth depending on the access point's settings and capabilities. Try using the camcorder closer to the access point and remove any obstructing objects or obstacles between them.
- Connect the computer to the access point using a LAN cable.
- Turn off the wireless functions of nearby wireless devices other than the computer or similar device being used for playback.
- Switch the wireless access point to IEEE 802.11n. Refer to its instruction manual for details.
- If these do not solve the issue, the cause may be due the device or conditions unique to the surrounding area. Use the supplied High Speed HDMI cable to connect the camcorder to a TV (☐ 147).

The wireless connection was interrupted while transferring files.

- Incomplete files may remain at the transfer destination. If incomplete files remain at the transfer destination, check the content and make sure they are safe to delete before deleting them.
- Select [New Files] and perform the file transfer again.









Cannot complete a wireless connection to the camcorder.

The Playback via Browser screen does not appear correctly on the Web browser.

- The device, operating system or Web browser used may not be supported. For the latest information about supported systems, visit your local Canon Web site.
- Enable JavaScript and cookies in your Web browser's settings. For details, refer to the help modules or online documentation of the Web browser used.

 The built-in memory could not be read. Contact a Canon Service Center.









HFR68/R67/R66 Built-in memory is full

 The built-in memory is full (End appears on the screen). Delete some recordings (73) to free some space. Alternatively, save your recordings (149) and initialize the built-in memory (40).

Life 165 / Ref /

 This message will appear the next time you turn on the camcorder if power supply was accidentally interrupted while the camcorder was writing to the built-in memory. Select [Yes] to try to recover the recordings.

HFR68/R67/R66 Cannot access the built-in memory

There is a problem with the built-in memory. Contact a Canon Service Center.

Cannot communicate with the battery pack. Continue using this battery pack?

- You attached a battery pack that is not recommended by Canon for use with this camcorder.
- If you are using a battery pack recommended by Canon for use with this camcorder, there may be a problem with the camcorder or battery pack. Consult a Canon Service Center.

HFR68/R67/R66 Cannot convert scenes recorded at 50P

Scenes that were recorded at 50P cannot be converted to MP4 format.









HFR68/R67/R66 Cannot copy

- The total size of the scenes you selected to copy exceeds the available space on the memory card. Delete some recordings on the memory card (T3) or reduce the number of scenes to copy.
- The memory card already contains the maximum number of AVCHD scenes (3,999 scenes). Delete some scenes (\$\sum_73\$) to free some space.

Cannot divide the scene

 The scene could not be divided because the camcorder's internal scene management data log is full. Delete some scenes and photos (\$\subseteq\$ 73) and try dividing the scene again.

Cannot load canvas

- The canvas file that was saved in the memory is corrupted.
- Canvas data cannot be read from canvas files created using other devices and then transferred to a memory card connected to the computer.

Cannot play back

- You may not be able to play back scenes that were recorded with other devices or created or edited on a computer and then transferred to a memory card connected to the computer.
- There is a problem with the memory. If this message appears often without apparent reason, contact a Canon Service Center.

HFR68/R67/R66 Cannot play back Cannot access the built-in memory

- There is a problem with the built-in memory. Initialize the built-in memory using the [Complete Initialization] option (40). If the problem persists, contact a Canon Service Center.









Cannot play back Check the memory card

- There is a problem with the memory card. Initialize the memory card using the [Complete Initialization] option (40). If the problem persists, use a different memory card.

HFR68/R67/R66 Cannot play the movies in the built-in memory Initialize only using the camcorder

- The camcorder's built-in memory cannot be correctly recognized. Initialize the built-in memory with this camcorder (40).

Cannot play the movies on this memory card

- Movies cannot be played back from a 64 MB or smaller memory card. Use a recommended memory card (☐ 32).

Cannot play the movies on this memory card Initialize only using the camcorder

- The memory card in the camcorder was initialized using a computer. Initialize the memory card with this camcorder (\$\sum 40\$).

Cannot record

- You cannot capture video snapshot scenes from scenes recorded or edited using another device and then transferred to a memory card connected to the computer.
- There is a problem with the memory. If this message appears often without apparent reason, contact a Canon Service Center.

HFR68/R67/R66 Cannot record Cannot access the built-in memory

 There is a problem with the built-in memory. Save your recordings (\$\sum 149\$) and initialize the built-in memory using the [Complete Initialization] option (\$\sum 40\$). If the problem persists, contact a Canon Service Center.









Cannot record Check the memory card

There is a problem with the memory card. Save your recordings

 149) and initialize the memory card using the [Complete Initialization] option (
 40). If the problem persists, use a different memory card.

HFR68/R67/R66 Cannot record movies in the built-in memory Initialize only using the camcorder

- The camcorder's built-in memory cannot be correctly recognized. Initialize the built-in memory with this camcorder (☐ 40).

Cannot record movies on this memory card

- Movies cannot be recorded on a 64 MB or smaller memory card. Use a recommended memory card (\$\sum 32\$).

Cannot record movies on this memory card Initialize only using the camcorder

- The memory card in the camcorder was initialized using a computer. Initialize the memory card with this camcorder (\sum 40).

Cannot save the canvas

Cannot save your [Pens and Stamps] drawings in the memory.
 Save your recordings (
 149) and initialize the memory (
 40).

Cannot trim the scene

 Scenes that were copied to an SDXC card (HFR68/R67/R66 only) and scenes that were recorded or edited with other devices and then transferred to a memory card connected to the computer, cannot be trimmed with this camcorder.

Charge the battery pack

- Battery pack is exhausted. Charge the battery pack.









Check the connected device.

Check the memory card

- Cannot access the memory card. Check the memory card and make sure it is inserted correctly.
- A memory card error occurred. The camcorder cannot record or display the image. Try removing and reinserting the memory card, or use a different memory card.

 You may not be able to record movies on a memory card without a CLASS rating or with one rated CLASS 2. Replace the memory card with one rated CLASS 4, 6 or 10.

HFR68/R67/R66 Mem. Card Number of scenes already at maximum

 The memory card already contains the maximum number of AVCHD scenes (3,999 scenes); no further scenes can be copied onto the memory card. Delete some scenes (\$\sum\$ 73) to free some space.

Mem. Card Unable to recognize the data

The memory card contains scenes recorded using a video configuration that is not supported (NTSC). Play back the recordings in the memory card with the device originally used to record them.

Memory card cover is open

- After inserting a memory card, close the memory card slot cover.









Trouble?

Memory card is full

 Delete some recordings (73) to free some space or replace the memory card.

Memory card is write-protected

- The LOCK switch on the memory card is set to prevent accidental erasure. Change the position of the LOCK switch.

Memory card writing error Attempt to recover the data?

This message will appear the next time you turn on the camcorder
if power supply was accidentally interrupted while the camcorder
was writing to the memory card. Select [Yes] to try to recover the
recordings. If you inserted a memory card that contains scenes
recorded using another device, we recommend that you select
[No].

Need to recover files from the memory card. Change the position of the LOCK switch on the memory card.

 This message will appear the next time you turn on the camcorder if power supply was accidentally interrupted while the camcorder was writing on the memory card and later the position of the card's LOCK switch was changed to prevent erasure. Change the position of the LOCK switch.

No memory card

- Insert a compatible memory card into the camcorder (\$\sum 33\$).
- The memory card may not be inserted correctly. Insert the memory card all the way into the memory card slot until it clicks.

HFR68/R67/R66 Not enough available space

- Delete some recordings on the memory card (\$\sup\$73).
- Set the video quality to [Long Play] (LP or 4 Mbps) ($\ \ \square$ 78).









Number of scenes already at maximum

- The maximum number of AVCHD scenes (3,999 scenes) has been reached. Delete some scenes (☐ 73) to free some space.

Recording was stopped due to insufficient write speed of the memory card

- The data transfer rate was too high for the memory card in use and recording was stopped. Replace the memory card with one rated CLASS 4, 6 or 10 (CLASS 6 or 10 when recording movies with a video quality of 50P or 35 Mbps).
- After repeatedly recording and deleting scenes (fragmented memory), it will take longer to write data on the memory card and recording may stop. Save your recordings (149) and initialize the memory card using the [Complete Initialization] option (40).

Scene recorded using another device. Cannot divide the scene.

- Scenes that were not recorded with this camcorder and were then transferred to a memory card connected to the computer, cannot be divided with this camcorder.
- Scenes that were edited using software cannot be divided.

Scene recorded using another device. Cannot play back the scene.

 Scenes that were not recorded with this camcorder and were then transferred to a memory card connected to the computer, cannot be played back with this camcorder.

Select the desired scene number

 A number of scenes have the same recording date but different file control information. This can occur for example when you record movies in the area of the international date line. Select a number to display the corresponding group of scenes.









Some scenes could not be deleted

 Movies that were protected/edited with other devices and then transferred to a memory card connected to the computer, cannot be deleted with this camcorder.

Task in progress. Do not disconnect the power source.

- The camcorder is updating the memory. Wait until the operation ends and do not remove the battery pack.

This photo cannot be displayed

 You may not be able to display photos taken with other devices or image files created or edited on a computer and then transferred to a memory card connected to the computer.

To record video on this memory card, it is recommended to use a video quality setting other than [50P Recording].

- When using a memory card rated CLASS 4, you may not be able to record movies using the 50P or 35 Mbps video quality option.

To record video on this memory card, it is recommended to use [Long Play] video quality.

 When using a memory card rated CLASS 2, you may not be able to record movies using a video quality option other than LP or 4 Mbps.

Too many photos and MP4 movies. Disconnect the USB cable.

- Disconnect the USB cable. Try using a memory card reader or decrease the number of photos and movies on the memory card to fewer than 2,500 (Windows), or 1,000 (Mac OS) and then restore the connection.
- HFR68/R67/R66 Copy the photos and MP4 movies to a memory card and try using a card reader.









Trouble?

If a dialog box appeared on the computer screen, close it. Disconnect the USB cable, and restore the connection after a short while.

Unable to recognize the data

 The camcorder cannot play back scenes recorded using a video configuration that is not supported (NTSC). Play back the recordings with the device originally used to record them.

Unable to recover data

Could not recover a corrupted file. Save your recordings (
 149)
 and initialize the memory (
 40).

HFR68/R67/R66 List of Messages for Connecting to an External Hard Drive

Error writing to external hard drive

 This message will appear the next time you turn on the camcorder if power supply was accidentally interrupted while the camcorder was writing to the external hard drive. Select [Yes] to try to recover the recordings.

Quickly erases all files and deletes partitions from the external hard drive. Initialize?

If you initialize the hard drive, all data it contains will be lost, including any partitioned drives. If necessary, back up data and then initialize the hard drive with the camcorder.

Closing the LCD panel turns off the camcorder. File transfers in progress will be interrupted.

 Keep the camcorder's LCD panel open while a wireless file transfer to the optional CS100 Connect Station is in progress.

Invalid port number. Perform the setting again.

 The port number entered cannot be used. In the settings for the Monitor while Out function (175) change the port number to a port that does not conflict with other devices.

IP address conflict

- Change the IP address of the camcorder or of any conflicting device to avoid the same IP address being assigned to multiple devices on the same network.









Memory card cover is open

 The memory card cover was opened while the memory card was being accessed. Stop the Wi-Fi function in use and end the Wi-Fi connection.

Multiple access points detected. Try the operation again.

 There are multiple access points sending out a WPS signal at the same time. Try the operation again later or perform setup using the [WPS: PIN Code] or [Search for Access Points] option (
198).

No access points found

- The access point set in the camcorder could not be found.
- To avoid interference, use the camcorder at some distance from devices that emit electromagnetic waves (cordless phones, microwave ovens, etc.).
- Make sure that you use the access point's SSID for the camcorder's Wi-Fi settings (
 201).
- If the access point is using MAC address filtering, enter the camcorder's MAC address in the access point's configuration screen.

The access point is not compatible with UPnP

An access point compatible with UPnP (Universal Plug and Play)
was not found in the connected network. You must use an access
point compatible with UPnP. If your access point is compatible,
make sure UPnP is activated.

Unable to access configuration files

- Turn off the camcorder. After a short while, turn it on again. If the problem persists contact a Canon Service Center.









Unable to complete WPS.

 Turn off the camcorder and access point. After a short while, turn them on again and try again. If the problem persists, perform setup using the [Search for Access Points] option (198).

Unable to complete WPS. Try the operation again.

- Some access points require pressing and holding the Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS) button. For details, refer to the instruction manual of your access point.
- Make sure to touch [OK] on the camcorder's screen within 2 minutes of activating the Wi-Fi Protected Setup signal on the access point, whether by pressing the button or by entering the PIN code.

Unable to connect

 To avoid interference, use the camcorder at some distance from devices that emit electromagnetic waves (cordless phones, microwave ovens, etc.).

Unable to connect to the Connect Station.

 An error occurred while trying to pair the camcorder with the CS100 Connect Station. Check that the connect station is ready to establish a connection and carefully hold the camcorder close to the connect point on the connect station again (186).

Unable to connect to the server

- The camcorder could not access the external server used for the Monitor while Out function. Make sure the access point is correctly connected to the Internet.
- Check that !! >> [Date/Time] is set to the correct date and time.









Unable to obtain a global IP address.

- The access point to which the camcorder is connected has not been assigned a global IP address. Check the WAN settings of the broadband router to see if a global IP address has been assigned.
- Several wireless routers are connected to the same home network. Leave only one wireless router to serve as the access point.

Unable to obtain an IP address

- If you are not using a DHCP server, connect using the [Manual Setup] option and enter the IP address using the [Manual] option (\$\sum_2\$ 202).
- Turn on the DHCP server. If it is already on, make sure it is functioning properly.
- Make sure the address range for the DHCP server is sufficient.
- If you are not using a DNS server, set the DNS address to [0.0.0.0].
- Set the DNS server's IP address in the camcorder.
- Turn on the DNS server. If it is already on, make sure it is functioning properly.
- Make sure that the DNS server's IP address and the name for that address are correctly configured.
- If you are using a wireless gateway router, make sure all of the devices in the network, including the camcorder, are configured with the correct gateway address.

Wi-Fi authentication unsuccessful

- Make sure the camcorder and access point are using the same authentication/encryption method and encryption key.
- If the access point is using MAC address filtering, enter the camcorder's MAC address in the access point's configuration screen.









Wi-Fi connection terminated

- To avoid interference, use the camcorder at some distance from devices that emit electromagnetic waves (cordless phones, microwave ovens, etc.).
- The camcorder may not be able to connect to the access point if too many devices are accessing it. After a short while, establish the connection again.

Wi-Fi error. Incorrect authentication method.

- Make sure the camcorder and access point are using the same authentication/encryption method and encryption key.
- If the access point is using MAC address filtering, enter the camcorder's MAC address in the access point's configuration screen.

Wi-Fi error. Incorrect encryption key.

 The encryption key (password) is case sensitive so make sure to enter it correctly.

Wi-Fi error. Incorrect encryption method.

- Make sure the camcorder and access point are using the same authentication/encryption method.
- If the access point is using MAC address filtering, enter the camcorder's MAC address in the access point's configuration screen.

Wireless communication is not working correctly

- To avoid interference, use the camcorder at some distance from devices that emit electromagnetic waves (cordless phones, microwave ovens, etc.).
- Turn off the camcorder and access point. After a short while, turn them on again and perform the Wi-Fi network setup again. If the problem persists contact a Canon Service Center.









HFR68/R67/R66 List of Messages for Web Services

Check network settings

The network settings in the camcorder are not correctly configured. Check the connection point, SSID and other network settings.

Connect to a computer and use the dedicated software to set again

Insufficient space on server

 You have exceeded the amount of data you can save on the CANON iMAGE GATEWAY server. Delete some data to free some space.

Movie must be less than X min.

You attempted to send a movie whose length exceeds the maximum length allowed by the Web service (the maximum length differs according to the Web service). Shorten the movie and try sending it again.









Server busy Try again later

- The CANON iMAGE GATEWAY server is busy due to a high number of users trying to connect to the server. End the Wi-Fi connection and try again later.

This image cannot be sent

 You attempted to send a type of recording or a file with a size that is not supported by the selected Web service. Check the recording before sending.

Try again

 There was a problem in the communication with the CANON iMAGE GATEWAY server or the server is temporarily down. Try connecting the camcorder to the server again. If the same error occurs, wait a while and try again.

Unable to connect to the server

 The camcorder was not able to connect to the CANON iMAGE GATEWAY server. Connect the access point to which the camcorder is connected to the Internet.









Handling Precautions

Camcorder

Be sure to observe the following precautions to ensure maximum performance.

- Save your recordings periodically. Make sure to transfer your recordings to an external device, such as a computer, digital video recorder or the optional CS100 Connect Station (☐ 149), and save them on a regular basis. This will protect your important recordings in case of damage and create more free space on the memory. Canon shall not be liable for any data loss.
- Do not carry the camcorder by the LCD panel. Be careful when closing the LCD panel.
- Handle the touch screen with care. Do not apply excessive force
 and do not use ballpoint pens or other hard-tipped tools to operate
 the touch screen. This may damage the touch screen's surface.
- Do not allow contact with metallic objects. If metallic objects come in contact with the touch screen, this may inadvertently cause incorrect operation of the camcorder.
- Do not hold the camcorder in the same posture for long periods of times as this may cause low-temperature contact burns. Even if the camcorder does not feel too hot, prolonged contact with the same body part may cause skin redness or blistering. The use of a tripod is recommended for people with circulation problems or very sensitive skin, or when using the camcorder in very hot places.
- Do not leave the camcorder in places subject to high temperatures (like the inside of a car parked under direct sunlight), or high humidity.









Do's and Don'ts

- Do not use the camcorder near strong electromagnetic fields such as above TVs or near plasma TVs.
- HFR63/R67/R66 Do not use the camcorder's Wi-Fi functions inside hospitals or medical clinics. In addition, do not use them near medical equipment or sensitive electronic devices as it may affect their performance. In the case of pacemakers, keep the camcorder at least 22 cm away from the device.
 - Regarding the use of Wi-Fi functions aboard aircraft, be sure to follow the instructions of the flight crew/cabin attendants.
- HFR68/R67/R66 The camcorder's Wi-Fi functions may be subject to interference from devices such as cordless phones and microwave ovens. Keeping as much distance as possible from these devices or using the camcorder's Wi-Fi functions at a different time of day may reduce such interference.
- Do not point the camcorder toward an intense light source, such as the sun on a sunny day or an intense artificial light source. Doing so may damage the image sensor or the camcorder's internal components.
- Do not use or store the camcorder in dusty or sandy places. The camcorder is not waterproof – avoid also water, mud or salt. If any of the above should get into the camcorder it may damage the camcorder and/or the lens.
- Be careful of heat generated by lighting equipment.
- Do not disassemble the camcorder. If the camcorder does not function properly, consult qualified service personnel.
- Handle the camcorder with care. Do not subject the camcorder to shocks or vibration as this may cause damage.









Do's and Don'ts

 When mounting the camcorder on a tripod, make sure that the tripod's fastening screw is shorter than 5.5 mm. Using other tripods may damage the camcorder.



When recording movies, try to get a calm, stable picture. Excessive camcorder movement while shooting and extensive use of fast zooms and panning can result in jittery scenes. In extreme cases, the playback of such scenes may result in visually induced motion sickness. If you experience such a reaction, stop the playback immediately and take a rest break as necessary.

Long-Term Storage

If you do not intend to use the camcorder for a long time, store it in a place free of dust, in low humidity, and at temperatures not higher than 30 $^{\circ}$ C.









Battery Pack

DANGER!

Treat the battery pack with care.

- Keep it away from fire (or it might explode).
- Do not expose the battery pack to temperature higher than 60 °C. Do not leave it near a heater or inside a car in hot weather.
- Do not try to disassemble or modify it.
- Do not drop it or subject it to shocks.
- · Do not get it wet.
- Dirty terminals may cause a poor contact between the battery pack and the camcorder or battery charger. Wipe the terminals with a soft cloth.

Long-Term Storage

- Store battery packs in a dry place at temperatures no higher than 30 °C.
- To extend the battery life of the battery pack, discharge it completely before storing it.
- Charge and discharge all your battery packs fully at least once a year.









Remaining battery time

When you are using a battery pack that is compatible with Intelligent System, if the remaining battery time displayed is not correct, charge the battery pack fully. Still, the correct time may not be displayed after a large number of repeated uses, if a fully charged battery pack is left unused, or if a battery pack is used for long periods of time in high temperatures. Use the time shown on the screen as an approximation.

Memory Card

- We recommend backing up the recordings on the memory card onto your computer. Data may be corrupted or lost due to memory card defects or exposure to static electricity. Canon shall not be liable for lost or corrupted data.
- Do not touch or expose the terminals to dust or dirt.
- Do not use memory cards in places subject to strong magnetic fields.
- Do not leave memory cards in places subject to high humidity and high temperature.
- Do not disassemble, bend, drop, or subject memory cards to shocks and do not expose them to water.
- Check the direction before inserting the memory card. Forcing a memory card into the slot if it is not correctly oriented may damage the memory card or the camcorder.
- Do not attach any labels or stickers on the memory card.









Do's and Don'ts

 Secure Digital (SD) memory cards have a physical switch to prevent writing on the card so as to avoid the accidental erasure of the card's content. To writeprotect the memory card set the switch to the LOCK position.



Built-in Rechargeable Lithium Battery

The camcorder has a built-in rechargeable lithium battery to keep the date/time and other settings. The built-in lithium battery is recharged while you use the camcorder; however, it will discharge completely if you do not use the camcorder for about 3 months.

To recharge the built-in lithium battery: Connect the compact power adapter to the camcorder and leave it connected with the camcorder off. The built-in lithium battery will be fully charged after about 24 hours.

Disposal

When you delete movies or initialize the memory, only the file allocation table is altered and stored data is not physically erased. When you dispose of the camcorder or memory card or give either to another person, initialize the camcorder's built-in memory (HFR68/R67/R66 only) or memory card using the [Complete Initialization] option (\bigcirc 40). Fill it up with unimportant recordings, and then initialize it again using the same option. This makes recovering the original recordings very difficult.









Maintenance/Others

Cleaning

Camcorder Body

 Use a soft, dry cloth to clean the camcorder body. Never use chemically treated cloths or volatile solvents such as paint thinner.

Lens

- If the lens surface is dirty, autofocus may not work properly.
- Remove any dust or dirt particles using a non-aerosol type blower brush.
- Use a clean, soft lens-cleaning cloth to gently wipe the lens. Never use tissue paper.

LCD Touch Screen

- Clean the LCD touch screen using a clean, soft lens-cleaning cloth.
- Condensation may form on the surface of the screen when the temperature changes suddenly. Wipe it with a soft dry cloth.

Condensation

Moving the camcorder rapidly between hot and cold temperatures may cause condensation (water droplets) to form on its internal surfaces. Stop using the camcorder if condensation is detected. Continued use may damage the camcorder.

Condensation may form in the following cases:

• When the camcorder is moved quickly from cold to warm places









Maintenance/Others

- · When the camcorder is left in a humid room
- · When a cold room is heated rapidly

To avoid condensation

- Do not expose the camcorder to sudden or extreme changes in temperature.
- Remove the memory card and battery pack. Then, place the camcorder in an airtight plastic bag and let it adjust gradually to temperature changes before removing it from the bag.

When condensation is detected

The precise time required for water droplets to evaporate will vary depending on the location and weather conditions. As a general rule, wait for 2 hours before resuming use of the camcorder.

Using the Camcorder Abroad

Power Sources

You can use the compact power adapter to operate the camcorder and to charge battery packs in any country with power supply between 100 and 240 V AC, 50/60 Hz. Consult a Canon Service Center for information on plug adapters for overseas use.
