

Safety notes



Please follow the safety notes provided in the "Safety/Regulations" manual as well as the safety notes given below.

Please pay special attention to the sections in the manual marked with the symbol on the left.

When connecting and disconnecting cables, observe the relevant notes in this operating manual.

Read the information on the ambient conditions in the ["Technical data", Page 89](#) chapter and the information in the ["First-time setup of your device", Page 16](#) chapter before preparing your Tablet PC for use and switching it on for the first time.

When cleaning the device, please observe the relevant notes in the section ["Cleaning the Tablet PC", Page 15](#).

Pay attention to the additional safety notes for devices with radio components provided in the "Safety/Regulations" manual.

This Tablet PC complies with the relevant safety regulations for data processing equipment. If you have questions as to whether you can set up the Tablet PC in the intended environment, please contact your sales point or our hotline/help desk.

Additional safety notes for devices with radio components

If a radio component (Wireless LAN/ Bluetooth, UMTS/LTE) is integrated in your Tablet PC, you must be sure to observe the following safety precautions when using your Tablet PC:

- Switch off the radio components when you are in an aircraft or driving in a car.
- Switch off the radio components when you are in a hospital, an operating room or near a medical electronics system. The transmitted radio waves can impair the operation of medical devices.
- Switch off the radio components when you let the device get near flammable gases or into hazardous environments (e.g. petrol station, paintshops), as the transmitted radio waves can cause an explosion or a fire.

Protecting the display screen



Do not pour liquids on the device or wash it with a heavily soaked cloth. Do not place items on the top of the screen, or damage may occur.

During normal use of the device, small particles from the environment can become embedded in the pen tip and scratch the screen. The warranty does not cover a scratched screen.

Energy saving

If you will not be using your Tablet PC, switch it off. Switch off any connected external devices when they are not in use. If you use the energy saving functions, the Tablet PC uses less power. You will then be able to work for longer before having to recharge the battery.



Power efficiency is increased and environmental pollution reduced. You save money and help protect the environment.

Energy saving under Windows

Travelling with your Tablet PC

Please observe the points listed below when travelling with your Tablet PC.

Before you travel

- ▶ Back up important data stored on your hard disk.
- ▶ Switch off the radio component for data security reasons. With data traffic via a wireless connection, it is also possible for unauthorised third parties to receive data.



Information on activating data encryption is provided in the documentation for your radio component.

- ▶ If you wish to use your Tablet PC during a flight, check with the airline whether this is allowed.

When travelling in other countries

- ▶ If you are travelling abroad, check that the mains adapter can be operated with the local mains voltage. If this is not the case, obtain the appropriate mains adapter for your Tablet PC. Do not use any other voltage converter!
- ▶ Check whether the local mains voltage and the power cable are compatible. If this is not the case, buy a power cable that matches the local conditions.
- ▶ Enquire with the corresponding government office of the country you will be travelling in as to whether you may operate the radio component integrated in your Tablet PC there (also see ["CE marking", Page 93](#)).

Transporting the Tablet PC



Protect the Tablet PC from severe shocks and extreme temperatures (e.g., direct sunlight in a car).

- ▶ Switch off the Tablet PC.
- ▶ Unplug the mains adapter and all external devices from the power socket.
- ▶ Disconnect the mains adapter cable and the data cables for all external devices.
- ▶ To protect against damaging jolts and bumps, use a Tablet PC carrying case to transport your Tablet PC.

Cleaning the Tablet PC



Do not clean any interior parts yourself; leave this job to a service technician.

Only use cleaning products designed for computers. Normal household cleaners and polishes can damage the markings on the keyboard and the Tablet, the paintwork or the Tablet PC itself.

Please ensure that no liquid enters the Tablet PC.

The touchscreen is very sensitive to scratches! Only clean the display surface with a very soft, slightly damp cloth.

- ▶ Switch the Tablet PC off.
- ▶ To prevent accidental activation of the device, disconnect the power plug of the mains adapter from the socket.
- ↳ The casing surfaces may be cleaned with a dry cloth. If particularly dirty, use a damp cloth that has been dipped in water mixed with mild domestic detergent and then carefully wrung out.

First-time setup of your device



Please read the chapter ["Important notes", Page 12.](#)

If your device is equipped with a Windows operating system, the necessary hardware drivers and supplied software are already pre-installed.

Before you switch on the device for the first time, connect it to the mains voltage using the mains adapter, see ["Mains adapter connecting", Page 17.](#) The mains adapter must be connected during the entire installation process.

A system test is performed when your device is first switched on. Various messages can appear. The display may remain dark for a short time or may flicker.

Please follow the instructions on the screen.

NEVER switch off your device during the first-time setup process.

The battery must be charged if you want to operate your device using the battery.

When used on the move, the built-in battery provides the device with the necessary power. You can increase the operating time by using the available energy-saving functions.

For instructions on how to connect external devices (e.g. mouse, printer) to your Tablet PC, please refer to the operating manual for your device.

Unpacking and checking the device



Should you discover any damage that occurred during transportation, notify your local sales outlet immediately!

- ▶ Unpack all the individual parts.
- ▶ Check your device for any visible damage which may have occurred during transportation.



You may need the packaging in the future, if you need to transport your device.

Selecting a location



Select a suitable location for the device before setting it up. Follow the instructions below when doing so:


- Never place the device or the mains adapter on a heat-sensitive surface. The surface could be damaged as a result.
- Never place the device on a soft surface (e.g. carpeting, upholstered furniture, bed). This can result in damage caused by overheating.
- The underside of the device heats up during normal operation. Prolonged contact with the skin may become unpleasant or even result in burns.
- Place the device on a stable, flat, non-slippery surface. Please note that the rubber feet of the device may mark certain types of delicate surfaces.
- Keep other objects at least 100 mm / 3.97" away from the device and its mains adapter to ensure adequate ventilation.
- Do not expose the device to extreme environmental conditions. Protect the device against dust, moisture and heat.

Mains adapter connecting



Observe the safety notes in the enclosed "Safety/Regulations" manual.

The supplied power cable conforms to the requirements of the country in which you purchased your device. Make sure that the power cable is approved for use in the country in which you intend to use it.



- Connect the power cable (1) to the mains adapter.
- Plug the mains cable (2) into a mains outlet.
- Connect the mains adapter cable (3) to the DC jack (DC IN) of the device.


Switching on the device for the first time



When you switch on the device for the first time, the supplied software is installed and configured. Because this procedure must not be interrupted, you should set aside enough time for it to be fully completed and connect the device to the mains using the mains adapter.

During the installation process, **DO NOT** restart the device unless you are requested to do so!

To make it easier to use your device for the first time, the operating system is pre-installed on the hard disk.



- ▶ Press the ON/OFF switch (1) for about one second to switch the device on.
- ↳ The power-on indicators (2) light up whenever the system is switched on.

- During installation, follow the instructions on screen.




Status indicators

The status indicators (1, 2, 3) provide information about the status of the power supply, the drives and the keyboard functions, etc.



No.	Status displays	Description
1		Power-on indicator <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The indicator lights up white: The tablet PC is switched on. • The indicator flashes: The Tablet PC is in sleep mode (Save-to-RAM). • The indicator is not lit: The Tablet PC is switched off or in Save-to-Disk mode.
2		Battery charging indicator <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The indicator light is orange: The battery is being charged. • The indicator is not illuminated: The battery is not being charged (the battery is already fully charged or the mains adapter is not connected).
3		Radio components indicator <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The indicator lights up white: The radio components are switched on, while the Tablet PC is operating. • The indicator is flashing: The radio components are switched on while the Tablet PC is in sleep mode, Save-to-Disk mode or switched off. • The indicator is not illuminated: The radio components are switched off.

Switching on the Tablet PC



- ▶ Press the ON/OFF switch (1) for about one second to switch the device on.
- ↳ The power-on indicators (2) light up whenever the system is switched on.

Switching the Tablet PC off



Back up your data and close all applications before you switch off your device. Otherwise data might be lost.

- ▶ Shut down the operating system correctly.
- ▶ If the Tablet PC does not switch off automatically, press the ON/OFF button for about five seconds.

Handwriting recognition

For detailed information on handwriting recognition, see the documentation on your operating system.

At present, handwriting recognition under Windows 7 or Windows 8.1 supports the following languages:

English, German, French, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Chinese (traditional and simplified), Dutch, Portuguese, Spanish, Brazilian, Norwegian (Bokmål and Nynorsk), Swedish, Finnish, Danish, Polish, Rumanian, Serbian (Cyrillic and Latin script), Catalan, Russian, Czech and Croatian.

Under Windows 8.1 you can set the required language under *Control Panel – Time, Language and Region – Language*.

Touchscreen

High-quality LCD screens (TFT) are installed in Fujitsu Tablet PCs. For technical reasons, these screens are manufactured for a specific resolution. An optimum and focused image can only be ensured with the resolution intended for the particular screen. A screen resolution which differs from the specification can result in an unfocused image.

The screen resolution of your Tablet PC's touchscreen is optimally set at the factory.

Current production technology cannot guarantee an absolutely fault-free screen display. A few isolated constantly lit or unlit pixels (picture elements) may be present. The maximum permitted number of faulty pixels is stipulated in the international standard ISO 9241-307 (Class 2).

Example:

A screen with a resolution of 1280 x 800 has 1280 x 800 = 1024000 pixels. Each pixel consists of three subpixels (red, green and blue), so there are almost 3 million subpixels in total. According to ISO 9241-307 (class 2), a maximum of 2 light and 2 dark pixels and in addition 5 light or 10 dark subpixels or an equivalent mix (1 light subpixel counts as 2 dark subpixels) are allowed to be defective.

Pixel	A pixel consists of 3 subpixels, normally red, green and blue. A pixel is the smallest element that can be generated by complete functionality of the display.
Subpixel	A subpixel is a separately addressable internal structure within a pixel that enhances the pixel function.
Cluster	A cluster contains two or more defective pixels or subpixels in a 5 x 5 pixel block.

Background lighting

LCD screens are operated with background lighting. The luminosity of the background lighting can decrease over the period of use of the Tablet PC. However, you can set the brightness of your screen individually.

Ambient light sensor

If your notebook was shipped with the *Windows* operating system, the screen brightness is regulated by means of the ambient light sensor and depending on the respective light conditions. This results in optimum readability and longer battery life at the same time.

If your device was shipped with Windows 8.1, the adaptive brightness setting is disabled. To change the ambient light sensor settings, select *Control Panel - System and Security - Power Options - Change plan settings - Change advanced power options - Display - Enable adaptive brightness setting.*

Select *On* to activate the adaptive brightness setting with the help of the ambient light sensor.

Synchronising the display on the touchscreen and an external monitor

In Windows 7, you can switch between touchscreen and external monitor, if you open *Control Panel - Windows Mobility Center*, section *External Display*.

In Windows 8.1 wipe your finger over the screen from the right-hand edge. The setting *Charms - Devices - Second screen* opens. Select the desired output type.

You can also use the *Fujitsu Display Manager* in the *Windows Mobility Center* to set the output type.

Select display orientation (portrait or landscape orientation)

You can choose to use either portrait or landscape orientation for the display.



Windows 7

You can change these settings in the Fujitsu menu or under *Start - (Settings -) Control Panel - Hardware and Sound - Display - Settings*.



Windows 8.1

You can change these settings under *Windows 8.1 Desktop - Control Panel - Hardware and Sound - Windows Mobility Center / Rotate screen*.



In the *Fujitsu Tablet Controls* settings, profiles are saved for operation with different screen orientations. These profiles have preset standard configurations that can be modified as desired.

These settings do not just affect the screen settings on the Tablet PC, but also those on externally connected monitors.

Using fingers

You can execute certain commands by using your finger tip on the touchscreen of your device.



Everything which you can select or activate using your finger tip can also be selected or activated using the pen.

Calibrate the Dual Digitizer for finger-based operation of the device.






Via the operating system, you must calibrate your tablet PC before first use with your fingers, so that it detects your finger tips as accurately as possible.




As soon as you ascertain that the accuracy is deteriorating, you must recalibrate the device.

Please note: There are separate calibration programs available for calibrating the pen and for calibrating finger-based operation. Do not use the calibration tool for the pen to calibrate finger-based operation.



Using the pen



- 1 = pen tip
- 2 = pen button (= right mouse button)
- 3 = eyelet for optional pen tether

You can use the pen on your Tablet PC as an electronic writing implement to select items, and to navigate through programs on it. Programs that support handwriting recognition also allow you to write characters directly on the screen with the pen. You can also use the pen as a drawing tool.

A pen tether is available as an optional extra, which you can tie to the eyelet on the pen and to the eyelet on the tablet PC.



Use only the pen provided with your Tablet PC. Do not use substitutes that were not designed for your Tablet PC. Replace the pen tip if it is worn. The warranty does not cover a scratched screen.

While writing, you should take care not to scratch the surface of the display (e.g. with a wristwatch or bracelet).



The Tablet PC's pen is an electronic instrument that can be damaged if used improperly. Handle the pen with care.

The following list contains guidelines for proper pen handling:

- Do not gesture with the pen.
- Do not use the pen as a pointer.
- Do not use the pen on surfaces other than the screen of the Tablet PC.
- Do not try to twist the thumb grip on the pen. The grip is used to place the pen in its slot or to remove it from its slot.
- Never store the pen with the tip bearing the weight of the pen (e.g. with the tip down in a pen holder). If the pen is stored with the tip pointing down, this may have an adverse effect on the pen mechanism (particularly under high temperatures). In this case the pen tip may react as though it is constantly being pressed down. To avoid damage, the pen should be stored in the pen slot when not in use.

The pen can be influenced by electromagnetic fields (cursor quivers or jumps). There may be a few areas on the screen where the cursor quivers slightly in spite of pressing the pen down firmly.

The screen responds to entries made with the tip of the finger or the pen when the tip of the finger or the pen is in direct contact with the screen.

You can use the pen to run all functions for which you would otherwise use a mouse.

The pen does not support erasing functions.


Handling	Mouse	Pen
Selecting menu items	Click with the left-hand mouse button.	Touch the menu entry with the pen tip.
Starting programs	Double click with the left-hand mouse button.	Briefly touch the program icon twice with the pen tip.
Moving an object/window	Drag with the left-hand mouse button held pressed.	Place the pen tip directly on the object/window. Hold the pen tip pressed against the screen. Move the desired object/window.
Opening a context menu	Click with the right-hand mouse button.	Place the pen directly on the required element and hold the pen pressed against the screen.
Moving the cursor	-	Place the pen tip directly on the screen.

Pen position



To prevent the pen from getting stuck in its slot, always ensure that you insert the pen it its slot the right way round (flat part of the pen points towards the bottom of the tablet PC).

Calibrating the pen


Via the operating system, you must calibrate your tablet PC before first use with the pen, so that it detects the pen as accurately as possible.

You should also always repeat the calibration if the co-ordination between the pen and cursor movement deteriorates.

Windows 7 / Windows 8.1 Desktop	To calibrate, call up the <i>Hardware and Sound / Tablet PC Settings</i> function in the Control Panel. You need to calibrate both portrait and landscape formats.

Securing the pen tether (optional)


You can attach the pen with an optional pen tether to prevent accidentally dropping it or losing it.




- Secure one end of the pen tether to the pen and the other end to the Tablet PC.

Tablet buttons

In addition to the ON/OFF switch (4), your Tablet PC is also equipped with three tablet buttons.




No.	Description	Functions
1	Shortcut button	Start function manager or screen shot function
2	Decrease volume button	Decrease the volume
3	Increase volume button	Increase the volume



If the Windows key of the Tablet PC is pressed in combination with the ON/OFF switch (4), the function corresponds with the key combination Ctrl + Alt + Del on a keyboard.


Webcam



Your device has two WebCams: one on the front side of the device and one on the rear.

The WebCam has its own status indicator. The indicator lights up when the WebCam is switched on. Depending on the software used, you can use your Webcam to take pictures, record video clips or take part in web chats.

- The picture quality depends on the lighting conditions and the software being used.
- You can only operate the webcam with a particular application (e.g. an Internet telephony program or a video conferencing program which supports a webcam).
- When using the webcam the Tablet PC support must not wobble.
- The webcam automatically adjusts itself to the current light level. For this reason the touchscreen may flicker while the light level is adjusted.



Further information on using the webcam and on the additional settings which are possible for your webcam can be found in the help function of the program which uses the webcam.

Rechargeable battery

For mobile use, the built-in battery provides the Tablet PC with the necessary power. You can increase the life of the battery by caring for the battery properly. The average battery life is around 500 charge/discharge cycles.

You can extend the battery life by taking advantage of the available energy saving functions.

Charging and maintaining the battery

The Tablet PC battery can only be charged when the ambient temperature is between 5°C / 41 °F and max. 35°C / 95°F.

You can charge the battery by connecting the Tablet PC to the mains adapter (see "[Mains adapter connecting](#)", [Page 17](#)).


If the battery is running low you will hear a warning alarm. If you do not connect the mains adapter within five minutes of the warning alarm described above, your Tablet PC will switch off automatically.

monitoring the battery charging level

In the system bar / status display there is a battery symbol shown for monitoring the battery capacity. The battery symbol shows you the battery charge.

Using the power-management features

The Tablet PC uses less power when the power management features are enabled. You will then be able to work longer when using the battery before having to recharge it.



Power efficiency is increased and environmental pollution reduced. By choosing the best power options, you can make significant savings and at the same time help protect the environment.


We recommend the following settings:


Function	On external power	On battery power
Turn off monitor	After 10 minutes	After 5 minutes
Turn off hard disk(s)	After 15 minutes	After 10 minutes
Energy saving (S3)	After 20 minutes	After 15 minutes
Hibernate mode (S4)	After 1 hour	After 30 minutes

- ▶ Select the power management functions in your Control Panel.
- ▶ Select the Screen Saver in your Control Panel.


or

- ▶ Keep a finger pressed on the desktop to display the context menu. Configure the screen saver under *Change screen saver*.



If you need further information about an option, you can get help with most settings by pressing the  symbol in the upper right of the screen to open the Microsoft Help.

When the Tablet PC is in power saving mode, you must remember the following:



During power saving mode, open files are held in the main memory or in a swap file on the hard disk.

Never switch off the Tablet PC while it is in a power saving mode. If the built-in battery is nearly flat, close the open files and do not go into power saving mode.

If you do not intend to use your Tablet PC for a long period of time:

- ▶ Exit the power saving mode if necessary via touching the screen or by switching on the Tablet PC.
- ▶ Close all opened programs and completely shut down the Tablet PC.

Memory cards

Your Tablet PC is equipped with an integrated memory card reader. You can use memory cards to increase the storage of your Tablet PC.




Observe the manufacturer's instructions when handling the memory cards.

Supported formats

It supports the following formats:

- Micro Secure Digital (Micro SD™ Card)
- Micro SDHC
- Micro SDXC

Inserting the memory card




- ▶ Open the slot cover (1).
- ▶ Carefully slide the memory card into the slot (2). The label must be facing upward. Do not apply any force, otherwise the delicate contact surfaces could be damaged.
- ▶ Close the slot cover.

Removing the memory card



To avoid any loss of data, always follow the correct procedure for removing the card (see the documentation for your operating system).

- Open the slot cover.



- Press the edge of the memory card so that the memory card jumps (1) slightly out of the slot (a).
- Pull the memory card out of the slot (a) in the direction of the arrow (2).
- Close the slot cover (3).

SIM card

A SIM card (Subscriber Identity Module) is a chip card which is inserted in a mobile telephone or Tablet PC and, together with an integrated UMTS/LTE module, enables access to a mobile network.




Please follow the instructions supplied by the provider when handling the SIM card. If you do not feel the SIM card engage as you insert it, use a pointed object to insert the SIM card.



Please note that the SIM card format must be micro-SIM (3FF). Other SIM card formats, such as full-size (1FF), mini-SIM (2FF) or nano-SIM (4FF) do not fit in the SIM card slot of your tablet PC.

Please do not insert any other format of SIM card as they could twist or even damage the system.


Inserting the SIM card



- ▶ Open the slot cover (1).
- ▶ Carefully push the SIM card into the slot (a) in the direction of the arrow (2) until it clicks into place. The label area must be facing upward. Do not apply any force, otherwise the delicate contact surfaces could be damaged.
- ▶ Close the slot cover.

Removing a SIM card

- ▶ Open the slot cover.



- ▶ Push the SIM card inwards slightly to eject it from the slot (1).
- ▶ Pull the SIM card out of the slot (a) in the direction of the arrow (2).
- ▶ Close the slot cover (3).

Wireless LAN / Bluetooth / UMTS / LTE / NFC radio components



The installation of radio components not approved by Fujitsu will invalidate the certifications issued for this device.

Switching the wireless components on and off

The radio components are switched on and off via the corresponding functions of the operating system.

- ▶ To switch radio components on and off individually, select *Settings – Change PC settings – Network – Airplane mode*.

Setting up WLAN access

- Requirement: A WLAN must be available and you must have the corresponding access information.



Information on configuring the WLAN access can be found in the documentation for your operating system.

NFC (Near Field Communication, optional)

Your Tablet PC is optionally equipped with an integrated NFC chip. Near Field Communication is used for contact-free data exchange by radio over short distances (a few centimetres).

Access via UMTS / LTE

If you ordered an integrated UMTS / LTE module with your system, you can enjoy optimum reception and maximum energy efficiency without awkward cables or antennas. The optional UMTS / LTE module is ready for use straight away.

If you did not order a UMTS / LTE module, you can purchase the accessories for UMTS / LTE reception from your retailer or your Fujitsu Technology Solutions dealer.


You will find information on establishing the connection with the UMTS / LTE network in the documentation for the hardware used.

Your device can connect to the Internet via UMTS / LTE. To do this, use one of the following types of connection:

- Integrated UMTS / LTE module (availability dependent on your model variant)
- a USB dongle (a USB stick with your mobile phone provider's SIM card)
- a mobile end-device (e.g. mobile phone with Bluetooth or cable connection)

Ethernet and LAN (multifunctional cradle or keyboard dock only)

The internal network module of your Tablet PC supports Ethernet LAN. You can use it to establish a connection to a local network (LAN = Local Area Network).



- ▶ Connect the network cable to the LAN port of the cradle (1).

or

- ▶ Connect the network cable to the LAN port of the keyboard dock (1).
- ▶ Connect the network cable to your network connection (2).



Your network administrator can help you to configure and use the LAN connections.

The network cable is not included in the delivery scope. This type of cable can be obtained from a specialist dealer.

GPS



Whether or not your device has this function depends on the selected device expansion stage.

Accessories for your Tablet PC (optional)

The following accessories are available for your Tablet PC:


- Multifunctional cradle for charging the Tablet PC and with additional ports
- Keyboard dock (with or without battery)
- VESA mount
- Hand strap
- Shoulder strap
- Cover

The following sections provide more information on handling the accessories.

Your multifunctional cradle (optional)

As well as providing rapid charging, your multifunctional cradle is a device which helps you to quickly connect your Tablet PC to your peripheral devices, such as a monitor, keyboard, mouse, etc. You only need to dock the Tablet PC in order to work with your peripheral devices.

Setting up the cradle



Select a suitable location for the cradle before setting it up. Follow the instructions below when doing so:

- Place the cradle on a flat, stable, nonslippery surface.
- Never place the cradle and the mains adapter on a heat-sensitive surface.
- Do not expose the cradle to extreme environmental conditions.
Protect the cradle from dust, humidity and heat.

Connecting the Tablet PC to the cradle




It is possible to connect the Tablet PC to the cradle during operation. To prevent problems, we recommend that you switch the Tablet PC off first.

Disconnect the mains adapter from the Tablet PC before connecting the Tablet PC to the cradle.



If the Tablet PC is connected to the cradle, you must connect the mains adapter to the cradle.

- ▶ Switch off the Tablet PC.
- ▶ Remove the power plug of the mains adapter from the mains socket.
- ▶ Pull the mains adapter cable out of the DC jack (DC IN) of the Tablet PC.



- ▶ Position the Tablet PC so that it lies on the surface of the tray on the cradle.
- ▶ Push the tablet PC onto the cradle in the direction of the arrow (1) until you feel it engage in the connector and until the release button has returned to its original position.


- ▶ Plug the DC output connector on the mains adapter into the DC input connector (DC IN) on the cradle (2).
- ▶ Connect the power cable to the mains adapter (3).
- ▶ Plug the power cable into the mains socket (4).

Disconnecting the Tablet PC from the cradle



It is possible to separate the Tablet PC from the cradle during operation. To prevent problems, we recommend that you switch the Tablet PC off first or that you execute the appropriate undocking function provided by the operating system.

- ▶ Switch off the Tablet PC.



- ▶ Push the release button in the direction of the arrow (1) until it remains in the pressed position (red marking becomes visible).
- ▶ Lift the Tablet PC from the cradle in the direction of the arrow (2), while supporting the underneath of the cradle.


Keyboard dock (optional)

The keyboard dock is a device which has been optimised for convenient input of texts and allows external devices to be connected. You only need to dock the Tablet PC.



The keyboard dock is available in 2 variants, with or without additional built-in battery.



If the Tablet PC is connected to the keyboard dock, you can connect the mains adapter to either the keyboard dock or the Tablet PC.

- Position the keyboard dock as shown.




- Press the tablet PC onto the keyboard dock in the direction of the arrow (1), until you feel it engage on the connector.
- Plug the mains adapter cable into the DC input connector (DC IN) on the keyboard dock (2).
- Connect the power cable to the mains adapter (3).
- Plug the power cable into the mains socket (4).

Disconnecting the Tablet PC from the keyboard dock



It is possible to separate the tablet PC from the keyboard dock during operation. To prevent problems, we recommend that you switch the tablet PC off first or that you execute the appropriate undocking function provided by the operating system.



- ▶ Press and hold the release button (1) until it remains in the pressed position (red marking becomes visible).
- ▶ Lift the tablet PC away from the keyboard dock in the direction of the arrow (2).

Removable battery of the keyboard dock (optional)

Removing and installing the battery



Only use batteries approved by Fujitsu for your tablet PC.

Never use force when fitting or removing a battery.

Make sure that no foreign bodies get into the battery connections.

Never store a battery for longer periods in the discharged state. This can make it impossible to recharge.

Removing the battery


Remove the power plug from the mains outlet!

- ▶ Switch off the tablet PC.




The device must not be in energy-saving mode.

- ▶ Disconnect the tablet PC from the keyboard dock.
- ▶ Disconnect all cables from the keyboard dock.
- ▶ Turn the keyboard dock over and place it on a stable, flat and clean surface. If necessary, lay an anti-slip cloth on this surface to prevent the keyboard dock from being scratched.



- ▶ Undo the catches of the battery cover and open the battery cover (1).
- ▶ Lift the battery towards the recess in the centre of the battery compartment and remove the battery from the battery compartment (2).

Installing the battery



- ▶ Position the battery at the edge of the battery compartment and insert the battery in the battery compartment (1).
- ▶ Insert the catches of the battery cover into the openings on the device (2).
- ▶ Close the battery compartment cover (3).

VESA mount (optional)


Use the VESA mount to secure the tablet PC, e.g. to a monitor with corresponding screw holes.



The VESA mount kit includes the following components: VESA mount, two M2x8 screws and two spacers.



- Use a suitable tool of the correct size when fitting the screws.
- Keep the screws out of the reach of children.



- ▶ Remove the covers from the screw holes on the rear of the tablet PC (1).
- ▶ Position the spacers between the tablet PC and the VESA mount (2).
- ▶ Position the VESA mount on the tablet PC (3). Make sure that the screw holes of the VESA mount and of the tablet PC line up exactly above one another.
- ▶ Secure the VESA mount with the screws (4).


Hand strap (optional)



The hand strap kit includes the following components: Hand strap, two M2x6 screws, two M2x8 screws and two spacers.



- Use a suitable tool of the correct size when fitting the screws.
- Keep the screws out of the reach of children.
- Do not shake the device too much when you hold it by the hand strap, otherwise it could fall down.



- ▶ Remove the covers from the screw holes on the rear of the tablet PC (1).
- ▶ Position the spacers between the tablet PC and the hand strap (2).
- ▶ Put the hand strap in position on the tablet PC (3). Make sure that the screw holes of the hand strap and the tablet PC line up exactly above one another.



Only use the M2x8 screws to secure the hand strap.

- Secure the hand strap with the screws (4).


Shoulder strap (optional)



The shoulder strap kit includes the following components: Shoulder strap, two mountings, two M2x6 screws, two M2x8 screws and two spacers.



- Use a suitable tool of the correct size when fitting the screws.
- Keep screws and mountings out of the reach of children.
- To avoid damaging the screws, do not use an electric screwdriver.



- Remove the covers from the screw holes on the rear of the tablet PC (1).




Only use the M2x8 screws to secure the mountings.

- Position spacers under the mountings, position the mountings on the rear of the tablet PC and secure the mountings with the screws (2).


Cover (optional)

Security functions

Your Tablet PC has several security features that you can use to secure your system from unauthorised access.

This chapter explains how to use each function, and what the benefits are.




Please remember that in some cases, for example, forgetting your password, you may be locked out and unable to access your data. Therefore, please note the following information:

- Back up your data on external data carriers at regular intervals.
- Some security functions need you to choose passwords. Make a note of the passwords and keep them in a safe place.

If you forget your passwords you will need to contact the our Service Desk. Deletion or resetting of passwords is not covered by your warranty and a charge will be made for assistance.

Configuring the fingerprint sensor


The fingerprint sensor can record an image of a fingerprint. With additional fingerprint software, this image can be processed and used instead of a password.



- You must install the fingerprint software in order to be able to use the fingerprint sensor (1).

Using the Security Lock

Your device comes with a Security Lock mechanism for the Kensington Lock Cable. With the Kensington Lock Cable, a sturdy steel cable, you can protect your device and your Port Replicator from theft. The Kensington Lock Cable is available as an accessory.



- Fit the Kensington Lock Cable to the corresponding device on your equipment.



Attach another Kensington Lock Cable to your cradle or keyboard dock to protect these devices from theft as well.

Configuring password protection in BIOS Setup Utility



Before using the various options for password protection in the *BIOS Setup utility* to increase data security, please observe the following:

Make a note of the passwords and keep them in a safe place. If you forget your supervisor password you will not be able to access your Tablet PC. Deletion of the password is not covered by your warranty and a charge will be made for assistance.



Your password can be up to eight characters long and contain letters and numbers. No distinction is made between uppercase and lowercase.

Protecting BIOS Setup Utility (supervisor and user password)



If you have opened these operating instructions on the screen, we recommend that you print them out. You cannot call the instructions onto the screen while you are setting up the password.

The supervisor password and the user password both prevent unauthorised use of the *BIOS Setup Utility*. With the aid of the supervisor password you can access all of the functions of the *BIOS Setup Utility*, while the user password will only give you access to some of the functions. You can only set up a user password if a supervisor password has already been assigned.



Please refer to section ["Settings in BIOS Setup Utility", Page 75](#) for a description of how to call up and operate the *BIOS-Setup-Utility*.

Setting supervisor and user password

- ▶ Start the *BIOS Setup Utility* and go to the *Security* menu.
- ▶ Select the *Set Supervisor Password* field and press the Enter key.
 - ↳ With *Enter new Password*: you are asked to enter a password.
- ▶ Enter the password and press the Enter key.
 - ↳ *Confirm new Password* requires you to confirm the password.
- ▶ Enter the password again and press the Enter key.
 - ↳ *Changes have been saved* is a confirmation that the new password has been saved.
- ▶ To set the user password, select *Set User Password* and proceed exactly as when configuring the supervisor password.
 - ↳ If you do not want to change any other settings, you can exit *BIOS Setup Utility*.
- ▶ In the *Exit* menu, select the option *Save Changes & Exit*.
- ▶ Select *Yes* and press the Enter key.
 - ↳ The Tablet PC is rebooted and the new password is effective. It will now be necessary to first enter your supervisor or user password in order to open the *BIOS Setup Utility*. Please note that the user password only provides access to a few of the BIOS settings.

Changing the supervisor or user password

You can only change the supervisor password when you have logged into the *BIOS Setup Utility* with the supervisor password.

- ▶ Call the *BIOS Setup Utility* and go to the *Security* menu.
- ▶ When changing the password, proceed exactly as for password assignment.

Removing passwords

To remove a password (without setting a new password) perform the following steps:

- ▶ Start the *BIOS Setup Utility* and go to the *Security* menu.
 - ▶ Highlight the *Set Supervisor Password* or *Set User Password* field and press the Enter key.
 - ↳ You will be requested to enter the current password by the *Enter Current Password* prompt.
You will be requested to enter a new password by the *Enter New Password* prompt.
 - ▶ Press the Enter key twice.
 - ▶ In the *Exit* menu, select the option *Save Changes & Exit*.
 - ▶ Select *Yes* and press the Enter key.
 - ↳ The Tablet PC is rebooted and the password is cancelled.
- Removing the supervisor password simultaneously deactivates the user password.

Password protection for booting of the operating system



With the supervisor password you have set in the *BIOS Setup Utility* (see section ["Setting supervisor and user password", Page 64](#)), you can also prevent starting of the operating system.

Activating system protection

- ▶ Start the *BIOS Setup Utility* and go to the *Security* menu.
- ▶ Select the *Password on Boot* option and press the Enter key.
- ▶ Select the desired option (*First Boot* or *Every Boot*) and press Enter
- ▶ Select the *Save Changes & Exit* option under *Exit*.
- ↳ The Tablet PC reboots. You will be prompted to enter your password (the supervisor password).

Deactivating system protection

- ▶ Start the *BIOS Setup Utility* and go to the *Security* menu.
- ▶ Select the *Password on Boot* option and press the Enter key.
- ▶ Select the *Disabled* option and press the Enter key.
- ↳ If you do not want to change any other settings, you can exit *BIOS Setup Utility*.
- ▶ Select the *Save Changes & Exit* option under *Exit*.
- ↳ The Tablet PC reboots. The system is no longer password-protected.

Password protection for the hard disk



The hard disk password prevents unauthorised access to the hard disk drives and is checked internally each time the system is booted. The prerequisite for this is that you have assigned at least the supervisor password.

Activating hard disk protection

- ▶ Call up the *BIOS Setup* and select the *Security* menu.
- ↳ If you have not assigned BIOS passwords yet, define the supervisor and the user password now, if desired (see ["Security functions", Page 61](#)).
- ▶ Mark the *Hard Disk Security* field and press the Enter key.
- ▶ In the *Drive0* area mark the *Set Master Password* field and press the Enter key.
- ↳ *Enter new Password* then appears and you are asked to enter a password.
- ▶ Enter the password and press the Enter key.
- ↳ *Confirm new Password* requires you to confirm the password.
- ▶ Enter the password again and press the Enter key.
- ↳ *Setup Notice: Changes have been saved* is displayed to confirm that the new password has been saved.

The field *Password Entry on Boot* is set to *Enabled* by default. You can exit the *BIOS Setup* once you have finished changing the settings.
- ▶ From the *Exit* menu, choose the option *Exit Saving Changes*.
- ▶ Press the Enter key and select *Yes*.
- ↳ The Tablet PC reboots and your hard disk is now protected with a password. The password prompt is enabled as soon as the Tablet PC has rebooted.

Deactivating hard disk protection

To cancel a password without setting a new one, proceed as follows:

- ▶ Call up the *BIOS Setup* and select the *Security* menu.
- ▶ Mark the *Hard Disk Security* field and press the Enter key.
- ▶ In the *Drive0* area mark the *Set Master Password* field and press the Enter key.
- ↳ You will be initially requested to enter the old password by the *Enter current Password* prompt. You will then be requested to enter a new password by the *Enter new Password* prompt.
- ▶ After entering the password, press the Enter key three times.
- ▶ From the *Exit* menu, choose the option *Exit Saving Changes*.
- ▶ Press the Enter key and select *Yes*.
- ↳ The Tablet PC reboots and there is no longer any password protection for this hard disk.

SmartCard reader (optional)

SmartCards are not supplied as standard equipment. You can use all SmartCards that comply with the ISO standard 7816-1, -2 or -3. These SmartCards are available from various manufacturers.

With the appropriate software you can use your SmartCard as an alternative to password protection, but also as a digital signature, for encrypting your e-mails or for home banking.

We recommend that you always use two SmartCards. Always keep one of the SmartCards in a safe place if you are carrying the other SmartCard with you.

In order to be able to take advantage of all the security features of your Tablet PC, you will need a CardOS SmartCard from Fujitsu.



The SmartCard can only be used with a PIN, offering maximum protection even if you lose the SmartCard. In order to maximise your security, the CardOS SmartCard is disabled if three incorrect attempts are made to enter the PIN.


When you use the CardOS SmartCard for the first time, you will either need to enter the preset PIN "12345678" or the PIN given to you by your systems administrator.

Inserting the SmartCard



Do not use force when inserting and removing the SmartCard.

Make sure that foreign objects do not fall into the SmartCard reader.



- Push the SmartCard into the SmartCard reader with the chip facing the rear of the Tablet PC.

Trusted Platform Module (TPM) (device-dependent)

To use the TPM, you **must** activate the TPM in the *BIOS Setup* before the software is installed. The condition for this is that you have assigned at least the supervisor password (see ["Security functions", Page 61](#)).

Enabling TPM

- Requirement: You have set a supervisor password, see ["Security functions", Page 61](#).
- ▶ Call up the BIOS Setup and select the *Security* menu.
- ▶ Mark the *TPM Security Chip Setting* field and press the Enter key.
- ▶ Select *Enabled* to activate the TPM.
- ↳ Once you have activated the TPM the *Clear Security Chip* option appears.
Select *Clear Security Chip* to delete the holder in the TPM. By clicking on *Enabled*, all secret keys (e.g. SRK - Storage Root Keys, AIK - Attestation Identity Keys etc.) generated by applications are deleted.

Please note that you will then no longer be able to access the data you have encrypted with the keys based on that holder.
- ▶ In the *Exit* menu, choose the option *Exit Saving Changes*.
- ▶ Press the enter key and select *Yes*.
- ↳ The tablet PC restarts and the TPM is switched on after the reboot.


Disabling TPM

- Requirement: You have set a supervisor password, see ["Security functions", Page 61](#).
- ▶ Call up the BIOS Setup and select the *Security* menu.
- ▶ Mark the *TPM Security Chip Setting* field and press the Enter key.
- ▶ Select *Disabled* to deactivate the TPM.
- ▶ In the *Exit* menu, choose the option *Exit Saving Changes*.
- ▶ Press the Enter key and select *Yes*.
- ↳ The tablet PC is rebooted and the TPM is disabled.

Enable password entry using the on-screen keyboard (on-screen keyboard for BitLocker password)

If TPM is enabled, you can enable an OnScreen keyboard for the internal touchscreen in the BIOS Setup.

- ▶ Call BIOS Setup and select the *Advanced* menu.
 - ▶ Mark *Boot Configurations* and press the enter key.
 - ▶ From the *UEFI Boot On-Screen Keyboard Location* selection, choose the option *Lower Right* or *Upper Right*.
 - ▶ From the *Exit* menu, choose the option *Exit Saving Changes*.
 - ▶ Press the enter key and select *Yes*.
- ↳ The tablet PC is rebooted and the password dialogue is displayed.
- Tap on the password field to enable the on-screen keyboard.



Connecting external devices



Under all circumstances, please observe the safety notes provided in the ["Important notes"](#), [Page 12](#) chapter before connecting or disconnecting any devices to or from your Tablet PC.

Always read the documentation supplied with the device you wish to connect.

Never connect or disconnect cables during a thunderstorm.

Never pull at a cable when disconnecting it. Always grasp the plug.




With some devices, such as USB devices, it is not necessary to switch off the Tablet PC and the device before connecting/disconnecting. For more information about whether or not devices need to be switched off, please refer to the documentation supplied with the external device.

Some of the external devices require special drivers (see the operating system and external device documentation).

Connecting an external monitor

Micro HDMI port

The micro HDMI port of your device can be used to connect an external amplifier, LCD TV or a plasma TV with an HDMI connection.



- ▶ Connect the data cable to the external device.
- ▶ Connect the data cable to the micro HDMI port.




Some LCD televisions have only two loudspeaker ports and therefore cannot reproduce Dolby Digital or DTS. To play back HDMI sound, you must change the HDMI sound settings accordingly.

You can find the settings under *Control Panel - Hardware and Sound*. Deactivate the settings for DTS Audio and Dolby Digital to enable playback of HDMI sound.

HDMI port (keyboard dock only)

The HDMI port can be used to connect an external amplifier, LCD TV or a plasma TV with an HDMI connection.



- ▶ Connect the data cable to the external device.
- ▶ Connect the data cable to the HDMI port.




Some LCD televisions have only two loudspeaker ports and therefore cannot reproduce Dolby Digital or DTS. To play back HDMI sound, you must change the HDMI sound settings accordingly.

You can find the settings under *Control Panel - Hardware and Sound*. Deactivate the settings for DTS Audio and Dolby Digital to enable playback of HDMI sound.

DisplayPort (multifunctional cradle only)

The DisplayPort of the multifunctional cradle can be used to connect a monitor, LCD TV or a plasma TV with an corresponding port.



- ▶ Connect the data cable to the external device.
- ▶ Connect the data cable to the DisplayPort of the cradle.




Some LCD televisions have only two loudspeaker connections and therefore cannot reproduce Dolby Digital or DTS. In order to reproduce the sound, you must go into *Windows* and adjust the sound settings.

- ▶ To do this, deactivate the *DTS Audio* and *Dolby Digital* settings in the control panel for the *Realtek HDMI Output*.

VGA monitor port (multifunctional cradle and keyboard dock only)

An analogue monitor is connected to the analogue VGA monitor port. The display output is limited to a maximum of two screens at the same time.



- ▶ Switch off the Tablet PC and the external monitor.
- ▶ Plug the data cable of the external monitor into the monitor port.
- ▶ First switch on external monitor and then the Tablet PC.



You can also switch back and forth between the external monitor and the LCD screen of the Tablet PC, see ["Touchscreen", Page 24](#).

You can display the same picture on the external monitor and the LCD screen of the Tablet PC simultaneously.

Connecting USB devices

On the USB ports, you can connect external devices that also have a USB port (e.g. a DVD drive, a printer, a scanner or a modem).




USB devices are hot-pluggable. This means you can connect and disconnect devices while your operating system is running.

USB 1.x has a maximum data transfer rate of 12 Mbit/s.

USB 2.0 has a data transfer rate of up to 480 Mbit/s.

USB 3.0 has a data transfer rate of up to 5 Gbit/s.

Additional information can be found in the documentation for the USB devices.



- ▶ Connect the data cable to the external device.
- ▶ Connect the data cable to the USB port on the Tablet PC.

or

- ▶ Connect the data cable to a USB port of the cradle.

or

- ▶ Connect the data cable to a USB port of the keyboard dock.



Device drivers

USB devices will be automatically recognised and installed by your operating system.

How to remove USB devices correctly



Always correctly remove the device according to the rules described below, to ensure that none of your data is lost.


- ▶ Tap the symbol for safe removal of the hardware.
- ▶ Select the device which you want to shut down and remove.
- ▶ Tap *OK*.
- ↳ Wait for the dialogue box which tells you that it is now safe to remove the device.

Connecting external audio devices

Your tablet PC has a combined headphone and microphone port, your (optional) multifunctional cradle has separate ports for headphones and a microphone.

Connecting headphones or other audio output devices

The combined headphone and microphone port of the Tablet PC or the headphone port of the multifunctional cable (optional) allows you to connect output devices such as headphones, external speakers, etc., to your tablet PC.



- ▶ Connect the audio cable to the external device.
- ▶ Connect the audio cable to the combined headphone and microphone port of the tablet PC or to the headphone port of the multifunctional cradle (optional).
- ↳ The internal loudspeakers are disabled.




If you buy a cable from a retailer, please note the following information:

The combined headphone and microphone port on your tablet PC is a "3.5 mm jack socket".

If you want to connect headphones or a speaker you will need a "3.5 mm jack plug".

Connecting a microphone or other audio input devices

The combined headphone and microphone port of the tablet PC or the microphone port of the multifunctional cradle (optional) allows you to connect an external microphone, MiniDisc player, MP3 player, CD player or a tape deck to your tablet PC.



- ▶ Connect the audio cable to the external device.
- ▶ Connect the audio cable to the combined headphone and microphone port of the tablet PC or to the microphones port of the multifunctional cradle (optional).

Settings in BIOS Setup Utility



To navigate more easily in the *BIOS Setup Utility*, you can use an external USB keyboard.

The *BIOS Setup Utility* allows you to set the system functions and the hardware configuration for the Tablet PC.

When it is delivered, the Tablet PC is set to factory default settings. You can change these settings in *BIOS Setup Utility*. Any changes you make take effect as soon as you save and exit the *BIOS Setup Utility*.

The *BIOS Setup Utility* program contains the following menus:

<i>About</i>	Displays information relating to the BIOS, processor and Tablet PC
<i>System</i>	Advanced system settings
<i>Advanced</i>	Configuration of various hardware components, such as mouse, keyboard, processor
<i>Security</i>	Password settings and security functions
<i>Boot</i>	Configuration of the start-up sequence
<i>Exit</i>	Exits the <i>BIOS Setup Utility</i>

Starting the BIOS Setup Utility

- ▶ Press and hold the Decrease volume button and switch on the tablet PC.
- ▶ If a password has been assigned, enter the password and press the Enter key.



If you have forgotten the password, contact your system administrator or contact our customer service centre.

The *BIOS Setup Utility* starts.

Operating BIOS Setup Utility



Press the **F1** key to display help on the operation of the *BIOS Setup Utility*. The description of the individual settings is shown in the right-hand window of the *BIOS Setup Utility*.

With the **F9** key you can load the default settings of the *BIOS Setup Utility*.

- ▶ Use the cursor keys **←** or **→** to select the menu you wish to access to make changes.
↳ The menu is displayed on the screen.
- ▶ Select the option you want to change with the cursor keys **↑** or **↓**.
- ▶ Press the Enter key.
- ▶ Press the **ESC** key to exit the selected menu.
- ▶ For future reference, make a note of the changes you have made (for example, in this manual).

Exiting BIOS Setup Utility

You need to select the desired option in the *Exit* menu and activate it by pressing the Enter key:

Exit Saving Changes - save changes and exit BIOS Setup Utility

- ▶ To save the current menu settings and exit the *BIOS Setup Utility*, select *Exit Saving Changes* and *Yes*.
- ↳ The Tablet PC is rebooted and the new settings come into effect.

Exit Discarding Changes – Discard changes and exit BIOS Setup Utility

- ▶ To discard the changes, select *Exit Discarding Changes* and *Yes*.
- ↳ The settings in place when *BIOS Setup Utility* was called remain effective. The *BIOS Setup Utility* is terminated and the Tablet PC is rebooted.

Load Setup Defaults – Copy Standard Entries

- ▶ To copy the standard entries for all menus of the *BIOS Setup Utility*, choose *Load Setup Defaults* and *Yes*.

Discard Changes – Discard changes without exiting the BIOS Setup Utility

- ▶ To discard the changes you have made, select *Discard Changes* and *Yes*.
- ↳ The settings in place when *BIOS Setup Utility* was called remain effective. You can now make additional settings in the *BIOS Setup Utility*.
- ▶ If you want to exit *BIOS Setup Utility* with these settings, select *Exit Saving Changes* and *Yes*.

Save Changes - save changes without exiting the BIOS Setup Utility

- ▶ To save the changes, select *Save Changes* and *Yes*.
- ↳ The changes are saved. You can now make additional settings in the BIOS Setup Utility.
- ▶ If you want to exit BIOS Setup Utility with these settings, choose *Exit Saving Changes* and *Yes*.

Save Changes and Power Off

- ▶ To save the changes and switch off your device, select *Save Changes and Power Off* and *Yes*.
- ↳ The changes are saved. Your device is shut down.

Troubleshooting and tips



Follow the safety notes in the "Safety/Regulations" manual when connecting or disconnecting cables.

If a fault occurs, try to correct it as described. If you fail to correct the problem, proceed as follows:

- ▶ Make a note of the steps and the circumstances that led to the fault. Also make a note of any error messages displayed.
- ▶ Switch the Tablet PC off.
- ▶ Please contact the Hotline/Service Desk.



You can find the telephone numbers in the service desk list. Please have the following information ready when you call:

- The model name and serial number of the Tablet PC. The serial number is located on a sticker on the underside of the Tablet PC.
- Notes of any messages that appear on the screen and information on acoustic signals.
- Any changes you have made to the hardware or software after receiving the Tablet PC.
- Any changes you have made to the *BIOS Setup* settings after receiving the Tablet PC.
- Your system configuration and all peripheral devices connected to your system.
- Your sales contract.



Our Tablet PCs have been designed primarily with mobile applications in mind. This means that considerable effort has been made to optimise components and equipment in terms of weight, space and energy requirements. Depending on the particular configuration you have purchased, it is possible that functionality may be slightly reduced compared to a desktop PC if you are running processor-intensive gaming software, e.g. games with intensive 3D graphics. Updating your hardware with drivers which have not been approved by Fujitsu Technology Solutions may result in performance losses, data losses or malfunction of the equipment. Executing a reset

If the device no longer responds to your inputs, select one of the following options:

Forced shut down

- ▶ Press and hold the ON/OFF switch for at least 4 seconds.
- ↳ The device will shut down. You can then restart it.

Carry out a battery reset

- ▶ Shut down the device.



If the device does not respond, you may have to force the shutdown, as described in the previous section.

- ▶ Disconnect the mains adapter from the device.
- ▶ Press the increase volume button and the shortcut button at the same time.
- ↳ The device performs a reset, comparable to removing the battery. You can then restart it.

Help if problems occur

Should you encounter a problem with your computer that you cannot resolve yourself:

- ▶ Note the ID number of your device. The ID number is found on the type rating plate on the back or underside of the casing.
- ▶ For further clarification of the problem, contact the Service Desk for your country (see the Service Desk list or visit the Internet at ["http://support.ts.fujitsu.com/contact/servicedesk/ServiceDeskNumber_Int.asp"](http://support.ts.fujitsu.com/contact/servicedesk/ServiceDeskNumber_Int.asp)). When you do this, please have ready the ID number and serial number of your system.

The Tablet PC's date or time is incorrect

Cause	Troubleshooting
Time and date are incorrect.	▶ With the <i>BIOS-Setup-Utility</i> , you can set the date and time in the <i>main</i> menu.
Date and time are still set incorrectly after switching on the Tablet PC.	▶ Please contact your sales outlet or our Hotline/Service Desk.

Battery indicator does not illuminate

Cause	Fault elimination
The battery is fully discharged.	<p>► Charge the battery.</p> <p>or</p> <p>► Connect the Tablet PC to a mains outlet using the mains adapter.</p>

The Tablet PC's touchscreen remains dark

Cause	Troubleshooting
Touchscreen is switched off.	► Press a key (external keyboard) or tap on the touchscreen.
External monitor or television set connected.	► Check whether the graphics driver settings are correct or whether an external monitor has been detected in "Intel Graphics Media Accelerator Driver for mobile".

The display on the Tablet PC's touchscreen is difficult to read.

Cause	Troubleshooting
Reflected glare	<p>► Move the Tablet PC into a different position.</p> <p>► Increase the brightness of the screen.</p>

The external monitor remains blank

Cause	Troubleshooting
Monitor is switched off.	▶ Switch the external monitor on.
Power saving has been activated (monitor is blank).	▶ Press a key (external keyboard) or tap on the touchscreen.
Brightness is set to dark.	▶ Adjust the brightness of the monitor.
Screen output is set on the Tablet PC's touchscreen.	▶ Check whether the graphics driver settings are correct or whether an external monitor has been detected in "Intel Graphics Media Accelerator Driver for mobile".
The external monitor's power cable or data cable is not connected properly.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ Switch off the Tablet PC and the external monitor. ▶ Check whether the power cable is plugged properly into the external monitor and into the power socket. ▶ Check whether the data cable is properly connected to the Tablet PC and the external monitor (if it is plugged in with a connector). ▶ Switch on the Tablet PC and the external monitor.

The external monitor is blank or the image is unstable

Cause	Troubleshooting
The wrong external monitor has been selected or the wrong screen resolution has been set for the application program.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ Terminate the application program in Windows. If the error persists after terminating the program, use the key combination for switching the screen output in order to switch to the touchscreen of the tablet PC. Change the following setting: ▶ Set the screen resolution: Set the screen resolution as described in the documentation for your operating system. ▶ Select monitor: Select monitor 1 or 2 as described in the documentation for your operating system.

The cursor does not correctly follow the pen movements

Cause	Fault elimination
Pen incorrectly calibrated	▶ Calibrate the pen as described in chapters "Setting the pen", Page 32 and "Calibrating the pen", Page 33 .

Pen input not working

Cause	Troubleshooting
Incorrect driver installed.	<p>▶ If your device is one which can only be operated using the pen, install the driver for the standard model.</p> <p>or</p> <p>▶ If your device is one which can be operated using the pen and by finger, install the driver for the "Dual Digitizer" model.</p>

The Tablet PC does not start after switch on

Cause	Troubleshooting
The battery is dead.	<p>▶ Charge the battery.</p> <p>or</p> <p>▶ Connect the mains adapter to the Tablet PC.</p>
The power adapter is not connected correctly.	<p>▶ Check whether the mains adapter is connected correctly to the Tablet PC.</p> <p>▶ Switch on the Tablet PC.</p>

The Tablet PC stops working

Cause	Troubleshooting
The Tablet PC is in energy saving mode.	▶ Leave energy saving mode.
An application programme has caused the malfunction.	▶ Close the application program or restart the Tablet PC (by restarting the operating system or switching the device off and back on again).
The battery is dead.	<p>▶ Charge the battery.</p> <p>or</p> <p>▶ Connect the mains adapter to the Tablet PC.</p>

The printer does not print

Cause	Troubleshooting
The printer is not switched on.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ Make sure that the printer is switched on and ready for operation (refer to the documentation supplied with the printer).
The printer is not connected correctly.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ Check that the data cable connecting the Table PC to the printer is properly connected.
The printer driver is faulty or not correctly installed, or it is the wrong printer driver.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ Check that the data cable connecting the Tablet PC to the printer is properly connected. ▶ Check whether the correct printer driver is loaded (refer to the printer documentation).

The radio connection to a network does not work

Cause	Troubleshooting
The wireless component is disabled.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ Switch the radio component on (see "Switching the wireless components on and off", Page 40).
The wireless component is enabled. Despite this, the wireless connection to a network does not work.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ Check whether the radio connection is switched on via the software. ▶ Further information on using the radio component can be found in the help files.

The battery discharges too quickly

Cause	Troubleshooting
The battery is either too hot or too cold. In this case the battery indicator flashes.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ Bring the Tablet PC up/down to a normal temperature again. ▶ If the operating time of the battery life is extremely short, the battery is probably too old. Replace battery if necessary.
You may have an application running that consumes a great deal of power due to frequent accessing of the hard disk or optical drive.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ Use the mains adapter as frequently as possible.
The maximum brightness may have been set for the screen.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ Reduce the brightness of the screen to lower energy consumption: You will find the setting under <i>Control Panel – Hardware and Sounds – Windows Mobility Center</i>.

SmartCard reader is not recognised.

Cause	Troubleshooting
Chip card inserted incorrectly.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ Make sure you have inserted your SmartCard into the SmartCard reader with the chip facing upwards/downwards (device-dependent). ▶ Check whether the SmartCard you are using is supported. Your SmartCard must comply with the ISO standard 7816-1, -2, -3 and -4.

SmartCard PIN forgotten

Cause	Troubleshooting
PIN forgotten	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ If you work in a network, contact your system administrator, who can unlock your Tablet PC with a supervisor PIN.

User and/or supervisor SmartCard lost

Cause	Troubleshooting
User and/or supervisor SmartCard lost	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ If you have lost your User SmartCard, you can continue working with the Supervisor SmartCard and initialise a new User SmartCard or deactivate the SystemLock function. ▶ If you have lost the Supervisor SmartCard, you can continue working, but you no longer have all your rights and can no longer initialise a Supervisor SmartCard. ▶ If you have lost both SmartCards, you can no longer boot your system. Please contact our Service Desk. You must provide proof of ownership for the device. Then the Service Desk will refer you to our service partner, who will unlock your device (for a charge).

SmartCard lost	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ If you work in a network, contact your system administrator, who can boot your Tablet PC with a Supervisor SmartCard.

Restoring the contents of the hard disk under Windows

- ▶ Select *Change PC Settings*.
- ▶ Select *Update/Recovery*.
- ▶ Select *Recovery*.
- ▶ Choose between the following options according to your requirements: *Refresh your PC without affecting your files* or *Remove everything and reinstall Windows*.

Restore factory settings and reinstall the operating system with the Hard Disk Based Recovery (HDBR) under Windows 7

- ▶ Switch the device on.
- ▶ While the Fujitsu start screen is being shown, hold the **[F8]** button pressed until the *Advanced Boot Options* menu is displayed.
- ▶ Select *Repair your computer*.
- ▶ Select the desired keyboard input method via *Keyboard input method*, e.g. English.
- ▶ Select the correct user, enter the current user password and confirm with *OK*.
- ▶ Select *Fujitsu Recovery*.
- ▶ Follow the instructions to reset the system to the factory settings.
