Precautions


Installing the Projector

When you select a position for the projector, consider the size and shape of your screen, the location of your power outlets, and the distance between the projector and the rest of your equipment. Follow these general guidelines:


- Position the projector on a flat surface at a right angle to the screen. The projector (with the standard lens) must be at least 4.3 feet (1.3 m) from the projection screen.
- Position the projector to the desired distance from the screen. The distance from the lens of the projector to the screen, the zoom setting, and the video format determine the size of the projected image.

The startup screen will display and the Power indicator will turn blue and the Light indicator will turn or blink green.

3. The first time you use the projector, you will be asked to select the preferred language. Turn on your source (computer, notebook, video player, etc.) The projector will detect your source automatically.

Make sure that the "Auto Source" has been set to "On".



CAUTION:

- Do not look into the lens while the light source is on. The strong light from the lens may cause damage to your eyesight.
- Do not block the air intake or exhaust. Doing so could cause a fire due to internal overheating.

Power off the projector

How to operate the OSD

- 1. To open the OSD, press "Menu" on the Control Panel or Remote Control.
