 - 2. Splitter can bypass 4K HDR data content, but can NOT process it and make HDR content 100% fit into 1080p
 - The length depends on the characteristics and quality of the cables. Higher resolutions and longer transmission distances require low skew cables (<25ns/100m) for best performance. Unshielded CAT6 with metal RJ45 connectors is recommended.

- 1. Power LED:
- **2. Micro-USB:** For technical support only [firmware update]
- **3. HDMI Signal LED:** Input signal LED indicator (From the left side to the right is Loopout #1signal LED indicator and Loopout #2 signal LED indicator)
- 4. Link Receiver LED: Link LED indicator 1-4
- 5. HDMI Signal LED: Output signal LED indicator 1-4


Rear Panel



- 6. Power jack: Connect to the DC 12V/7.5A power supply unit
- 7. EDID Management Rotary control:
- **8. RS-232(terminal block format):** The order of RS-232 pin are TX, RX, GND (from the left side to the right)
- 9. IR Blaster: Plugging in the extension cable of IR blaster
- 10. IR Receiver: Plugging in the extension cable of IR receiver
- 11. HDMI IN: Connect to a HDMI input source
- **12. HDMI LOOPOUT #1:** Connect to a HDMI display
- 13. HDMI LOOPOUT #2: Connect to a HDMI display
- **14. HDMI Signal OUT1-4:** Link to each HDMI display via a Cat-5/5e/6 cable with a HDMI over Cat.X receiver.
- 15. RJ-45: Ethernet

- **1. Micro-USB:** For technical support only [firmware update]
- 2. HDMI Signal LED: Output #1 signal LED indicator
- **3. HDMI Signal LED:** Output #2 signal LED indicator
- 4. Power LED:

- **6. Signal LED:** When receive the HDMI signal, LED light will shine
- **7. RJ45:** Plug in a Cat5e/6 cable that needs to be linked to the TX
- **8. IR Receiver:** Plugging in the extension cable of IR receiver
- **9. IR Blaster:** Plugging in the extension cable of IR blaster
- **10. RS-232(terminal block format):** The order of RS-232 pin are TX, RX, GND (from the left side to the right)
- **11. Dip Switch:** [ON] F/W update Mode; [OFF] Normal Mode
- **12. HDMI OUT #1:** Connects to a HDMI display
- 13. HDMI OUT #2: Connects to a HDMI display

NOTICE:

While connecting a new monitor to the splitter, experiencing a short period of time without display might be expected. The splitter will do Automatic EDID learning which analyzes the newly connected monitor to see if the EDID for the HDMI input is necessary to update!









Firmware update

Main Board

- 1. Power on the device
- 2. Connect the Micro-USB cable between PC and device
- 3. Open firmware update software
- 4. Set the correct **COM** port and "**DO NOT**" click **OPEN** button
- 5. Click the **Open Dialog** button to open the Update window
- 6. Click the **File** button to select the main board firmware file
- 7. Click the **Start** button and the firmware will start to update
- 8. After updating, please power cycle the device







Input

- 1. Power on the device
- 2. Connect the Micro-USB cable between PC and device
- 3. Open firmware update software
- 4. Set the correct **COM** port and click **OPEN** button to connect software
- 5. Click the **Open Dialog** button to open the software folder
- 6. Save the firmware file in this software folder and reconnect the Micro-USB cable
- 7. Open firmware update software and then device will start to update firmware automatically
- 8. After update process is done, software will show "Success" message and then be closed automatically
- 9. After updating, please power cycle the device

Output

- 1. Power on the device
- 2. Connect the Micro-USB cable between PC and device
- 3. Open firmware update software
- 4. Set the correct **COM** port and click **OPEN** button to connect software
- 5. Click the **Open Dialog** button to open the FW Update window
- 6. Click the **File** button to select the output firmware file
